### BEWARE OF SCAMMERS IMPERSONATING THE CANADA REVENUE AGENCY

#### Submitted by Alberta RCMP

Ottawa, Ontario -The RCMP and the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) are warning Canadians about an ongoing scam in which taxpayers across the country receive phone calls or emails from individuals impersonating CRA employees. These people are scammers.

The scammers tell taxpayers

that they either owe money to the CRA or have a tax refund. Taxpayers are threatened with arrest or jail time if they do not take immediate action and provide money or personal or financial information.

"The CRA takes these matters very seriously and provides substantial information to Canadians about how to protect themselves from scams undertaken using the CRA's name. Informing yourself is particularly important during the tax filing season, when such scams peak," said the Honourable Diane Lebouthillier, Minister of National Revenue. This information, including examples of real scam telephone calls and e-mails, can be easily found on the CRA web site.

Over the past few years residents in the Onoway area have seen a dramatic increase in crime. Many years ago there were Neighborhood Watch & the Police Radio Network in Onoway. These were citizen groups who looked out for each other & their neighborhood, reporting suspicious activity and incidents of crime to the RCMP. Over time these groups became inactive. But did vou know Lac Ste. Anne North East Rural Crime Watch (LSANE Rural Crime Watch) has existed for many years? LSANE Rural Crime Watch membership is open to residents within the Town of Onoway.

The group covers the area from the eastern border of Lac Ste Anne County (east of Onoway), south of Onoway to the Parkland County border, north of Onoway covering the areas of Rich Valley, Stettin, & Nakamun to as far west as Darwell. Darwell is our western cut off, west & north of Darwell is another group Lac Ste Anne West, who fall under the Mayerthorpe RCMP detachment.

LASNE Rural Crime Watch is registered with the Alberta Provincial Crime Watch Association and has been since its inception in the 1990's. We fall under the umbrella of the Stony Plain & District Crime Preven-

tion Association. Our RCMP detachment is Stony Plain. Our Liaison Officer is Cpl. Kim Mueller. Being part of Rural Crime Watch means posting your yellow membership sign, getting to know your neighbors, looking out for your neighbors & their property, reporting suspicious vehicles, suspicious activity & incidents of crime to the RCMP & asking for it to be put on the rural crime watch fan out message system. Members, receive the automated fan out messages via email or phone. Rural Crime Watch is NOT is a vigilante group looking to catch criminals on their own.

### Beware Of Scammers Impersonating The Canada Revenue Agency

"Scammers are always looking for new ways to get your money or your personal information," warns Assistant Commissioner Todd Shean, who leads the RC-MP's Federal Policing Special Services. "The RCMP works every day to track down fraudsters and bring them to justice, but raising awareness about fraud is also important as it is one of the most effective ways of protecting Canadians from scammers. The more you know about a specific fraud, the less likely you'll be a victim of that fraud.'

The RCMP plays a crucial role in educating the public about scams, and has a number of programs in place to track fraud, including one run by the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC). The CAFC monitors all types of scams, and warns Canadians to be on the lookout for scammers during the upcoming tax season. The RCMP also works closely with the CRA to raise awareness about tax-related scams.

When CRA employees call taxpayers, they follow established procedures to ensure personal information is protected. To confirm the authenticity of a call, contact the CRA by using its official telephone number for individual tax enquiries: 1-800-959-8281. You can also verify your individual tax account through a secure CRA portal: My Account.

If you believe you may be the victim of fraud or have given personal or financial information in error, contact your local police service and your financial institution.

EDSON: I am pleased to see that the United States appears ready to repeal the problematic provisions related to Country of Origin Labelling (COOL). These are protectionist provisions that have cost Canadian producers hundreds of millions of dollars. I expect the government to retaliate if the legislation is delayed, does not pass a vote in Congress, or is vetoed by the President of the United States.

Recently, Congressional leaders in the United States have drafted legislation that responds to demands from Canada and Mexico that COOL be repealed in the United States. This legislation is also in response to demands from the World Trade Organization (WTO) which has ruled against the U.S. four times stating that COOL discriminates against Canadian imports such as cattle and hogs. Repealing the COOL in the United States was very actively pursued by the Conservative Government. December 18th was the earliest date that the legislation may be voted on in the Senate and the House of Representatives. The legislation is part of a massive 2,000 page omnibus spending bill. Following votes in the Senate and in Congress the bill must then be signed by the President of the United States to become enacted.

OTTAWA: The Liberal government announced the creation of a five-member advisory panel to recommend Senate appointments for the Prime Minister to make. This will be an unelected, appointed body to suggest unelected, appointed Senators. In my view, this new process isn't democratic, it isn't transparent, and it isn't real Senate reform. It will simply create an unelected, appointed body to recommend unelected, appointed Senators.

The one and only democratic element of our current system is that Senators from Alberta are nominated by means of a province-wide election under the 'Senatorial Selection Act'. Yet the Liberals seem intent on ruling out this possibility in Alberta and elsewhere. Already, the British Columbia government has made clear it will not take part in this process because it does nothing to address that province's actual concerns.

The process adds another level of secrecy to an already unclear process. The shortlist this panel will generate is secret by design. The public won't even learn who has been nominated by the panel, other than the candidate selected by the Prime Minister. In fact, the prime minister and most of the panel members won't represent the province for which an appointment is being made.

One of the first five new senators nominated through this will be appointed the new Government Leader in the Senate, a specifically partisan role tied to the government of the day. Town Council has directed Administration to work with the Whitecourt & District Chamber of Commerce to contact fuel suppliers to explore options to address the high fuel prices in Whitecourt. Recent price comparisons reported that, on average, prices in Whitecourt were higher than surrounding communities.

The Town of Whitecourt has provided its support to Woodlands County's application to the Alberta Community Partnership Grant. The County is making application for funding for installation of internet towers and certification of the Whitecourt Airport. The Town of Whitecourt has made its own

applications to the program for Athabasca Flats East Servicing, and Water Upgrades - Second River Crossing.

Morinville, Alberta - On January 27, 2016 at approximately 10:30 a.m., Morinville RCMP and emergency services responded to a serious motor vehicle collision on Township 570 approximately 1 kilometer West of Range Road 231, Sturgeon County. A commercial vehicle, towing a loaded flat deck trailer, entered Township 570 from a commercial yard located on the North side of the road. A west bound passenger vehicle with 4 occupants attempted to brake for the commercial vehicle. The vehicle then struck the side of the trailer causing severe damage to the front.

One passenger of the car

succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced deceased at the scene. All other occupants of the passenger vehicle were transported by ambulance with non-life threatening injuries. The driver of the semi was not injured.

Alcohol is not considered to be a factor in the incident. Road conditions at the time were slippery with icy sections. The identity of the deceased is not being released at this time at the request of the family. Sturgeon County Victim Services is providing assistance to family and friends.

Morinville RCMP along with an RCMP Collision Analyst continue to investigate.

An update will be provided when new information becomes available.
