
tersection of Highway 43 and Highway 22 near the entrance to the Town of Mayerthorpe.




Dear Editor,

FOUR ARRESTED IN STOLEN VEHICLE DURING TRAFFIC STOP

Enoch, Alberta: A woman and three men face multiple charges after Enoch RCMP located them in a stolen vehicle in Enoch, Alberta. On May 26th, 2016 at approximately 1:00 A.M., Enoch RCMP conducted a routine traffic stop in the community of Enoch. Police checks revealed that the vehicle was stolen. RCMP located a firearm, ammunition and drug paraphernalia inside the vehicle. The vehicle had

been reported stolen out of Fort Saskatchewan on May 23rd.

The occupants of the vehicle, 28 yr old Leanna Morin-Pariseau, 30 yr old Darrell Gauthier, 23 yr old Andrew Rachar and 31 yr old Donovan Savidant have all been charged with possession of stolen property

What do these have in common? We'll be looking at all of them on Sunday, June 5th during the George Pegg Botanic Garden Annual Bird Count & Perennial Plant Sale and Swap.

The Bird Count is a great opportunity to learn about the birds in your backyard. Whether they are at the feeder or way up in the sky, our knowledgeable volunteers Peggy and John Folinsbee can put a name to all of the birds you'll see. Finish off the day with a short drive to Old Man Lake to find more water-loving birds.

Wrens, bluebirds, chickadees, robins, and swallows are favourite backyard birds and all of them can be encouraged to nest in your yard with bird houses and nesting platforms. Garden volunteer Charles Lily is making them as a fund raiser for Pegg. Contact the Garden to pre-order your choice of houses.

- Bird watcher or not- plan to stop by Pegg June 5th to pick up some perennials for your garden. It is a Swap and Sale- if you have plants to share bring them along to trade for something new or make a donation to buy some plants. Pegg Garden is partnering with Denise O'Reilly of A'bunadh Seeds on a grow co-op project. This summer's vegetable garden is focused on growing crops to save seed. Denise will be on hand with a selection of her vegetable seeds. Grown on the family farm near Cherhill- all are well adapted to our short season.

Families are always welcome at Pegg Garden events and we have special activities for children. With our binoculars we can see the ducks on the Pegg pond, we'll also take an up-close look at what's living in the pond.

MOUNTAIN PINE BEETLE – WHAT IS THE LIBERAL'S PLAN?

OTTAWA: On May 16th, in the House of Commons, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, asked the Liberal government what their plan was to stop the Mountain Pine Beetle from spreading.

"Mr. Speaker, Jasper National

Park, in my riding of Yellowhead, is in trouble. From the west along Mount Robinson to the east park gates, the park has been overtaken by the mountain pine beetle. Local government and forest companies are counting on Parks Canada to stop this epidemic before it moves into Alberta's west central forest area.

The Liberals say they have a

plan, but, as usual, nothing is being done. What is the Liberal plan to stop these evil weevils?"

Again, on May 17th, MP Eglinski asked the following question in the House:

"Mr. Speaker, yesterday in the House, the member opposite said he was more than happy to have a conversation with me about the mountain pine beetle. Unfortunately, on the ground in Alberta, government employees have been told they cannot talk to the local officials about this issue.

Why are the Liberals muzzling scientists and researchers who are critical to this issue?"

THE FEDERAL LIBERAL GOVERNMENT'S NATURAL RESOURCES FILE

I believe Quebeckers understand that pipelines are the safest option to transport oil, with 99.999% of the oil transported through federally regulated pipelines arriving at destinations safely. A recent poll by the Montreal Economic Institute shows that Quebeckers favour

oil from Western Canada over imports from places like Saudi Arabia or Algeria. Why then did the Quebec Government decide to file an injunction against TransCanada and the Energy East Pipeline?

Prime Minister Trudeau has said that he believes his new process instills "public confidence" in pipelines, but in fact, Quebec's injunction proves that it does the opposite. Must I remind the Liberal Federal Government that it has jurisdiction on inter-provincial pipelines? Has the Prime Minister lost control of this file? As Prime Minister, he has a responsibility to ensure that Canadian energy can move quickly and safely to domestic and international markets.

This Liberal Government is badly failing all Canadians and needs

to work with Quebec to ensure that projects like Energy East can be developed in a timely and environmentally sustainable manner.

Remember, all Canadians benefit from the wealth created by our energy resources, which pay for excellent education and healthcare services across Canada.

Representatives from the Town of Whitecourt and Stantec Consulting will be in attendance. Please take this opportunity to ask questions and provide comments.

The Town of Whitecourt is asking for your assistance to track trends in regards to odours from the wastewater treatment plant in the east valley area. By tracking when residents and other public members are being affected by odour, we will be able to:

- assess if there is a correlation between odour and operations at the plant,
- evaluate the effectiveness of existing mitigation strategies, and
- identify how operations can be changed to address area concerns.

We appreciate you taking the time to assist with our data collection process. Odour tracking diaries, which include instructions, are available at the Town Office and can be downloaded from www.whitecourt.ca. Tracking sheets are available for residents and recreation facility users.

Council has approved an amendment to the Whitecourt Regional Landfill Authority Budget to complete capital and operational changes that will extend the life of the current landfill site. A review of the closure/post closure obligations for the site determined that the life of the landfill could be significantly increased if the

filling method was revised and the height increased. The budget changes will allow improvements to be made starting this year. To fund the improvements, Council has passed first reading of Borrowing Bylaw 1518 which would allow the municipality to borrow \$1,690,000. Advertisements regarding the proposed bylaw will be published to notify the community of the proposed debenture.


Whitecourt's Economic Development Strategic Plan has been approved. The plan, which follows the same format as Council's Strategic Plan, identifies

goals and initiatives for the Economic Development Committee and will assist with scheduling projects and resources specific to this function. Current priorities include implementing a business visitation program both on a local and regional level, researching the potential of business revitalization zones, and creating an ambassador program for handling business inquiries.

Council had the opportunity to review the proposed West Whitecourt Area Structure Plan document which has been drafted by Opus Stewart Weir on behalf of Woodlands County. The area structure plan item will be discussed further at the June Policies and Priorities Committee Meeting, and Council will be providing feedback to our municipal neighbours on the document.

The Whitecourt & District Chamber of Commerce will be hosting West Coast Amusements Carnival on June 6 & 7. 52nd Avenue from 49 Street to 50 Street will be closed to accommodate the event.



TRANSPLANTING TREES NO SMALL TASK

An alluring landscape can make a home that much more enjoyable. Many homeowners devote considerable time to their lawns and gardens, and that devotion can pay both instant and long-term dividends. A well-groomed landscape can make it more enjoyable to relax in the yard, and such a property will be more attractive to prospective buyers when homeowners want to sell their

homes

But even the most well-designed landscapes sometimes need some rearranging, and those changes may involve transplanting trees. Homeowners may transplant trees for various reasons. Some homeowners might be moving to a new home and want to take a favorite tree along with them, while some trees simply outgrow their existing space and need to be

moved elsewhere on the property. Regardless of why trees need to be transplanted, homeowners can take several steps to ensure the process goes as smoothly as possible.

Determine why the tree needs to be moved. Some trees that are not thriving in their existing location may not benefit from a transplant. For example, a tree with a pest infestation might need to be replaced rather than transplanted. Determining the reason behind a transplant can save you the trouble of transplanting that won't benefit from the move. If a tree is not getting adequate sunlight in its present location, then transplanting it to a different location on your property with more exposure to sunlight might reinvigorate the tree. If soil is the problem, than transplanting the tree might prove ineffective unless you also test the soil where you plan to move the tree and adjust it so the tree can thrive.

· Prune the tree roots. Tiny roots that extend beyond the tree absorb water and nutrients, and such roots need to be pruned before transplanting a tree. Landscaping professionals note that root pruning stimulates the growth of new small roots nearer to the tree's trunk, and these newer roots will be dug up when the time comes to transplant the tree. Root pruning must be done well in advance of transplanting the tree. For example, if you hope to transplant the tree in the fall, then do your root pruning in the spring before new buds appear on the tree. Speak with your landscaper or a nearby garden center to determine the best way to prune your tree's roots.

Time your transplant correctly. Avoid transplanting trees when temperatures are colder and the ground is frozen. Transplanting before or after a thaw allows the transplanted roots time to develop. In addition, transplanting the day after you have watered the soil around the tree reduces the stress on the tree's roots, making it easier to keen the root ball intact.

Protect the root ball. When transplanting a tree, make sure the root ball does not dry out. If it does, the tree likely won't thrive in its new location and all your hard work will have been for naught. Cover the root ball with damp burlap or canvas so it can retain more of the moisture it will need to adapt to its new location.

Plant the tree sooner rather than later. While you can store a transplanted tree before you plant it elsewhere on your property, storing it for a long period of time increases the chances that the transplant will be unsuccessful. Ideally, you want to plant the tree in its new location as soon as possible.

If you must store it, make sure you don't suffocate the root ball, as roots must be kept damp or they will die and potentially cost you the tree.

Transplanting a tree can add appeal to a property and help reinvigorate an unhealthy tree.



DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

(NC) A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can

help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch

- 1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.
- 2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.
- 3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a

stretch in the side of your back.
4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

- 1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.
- 2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 sec-

onds

- 3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.
 - 4. Hold for 15 seconds.
- 5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.

Bango – the player whose ball is closest to the pin when all balls are on the green gets a point, Bongo –the player who is first to hole out gets a point. Add up the points and the person with the highest total for the round wins.
