YELLOWHEAD COUNTY REINSTATES FIRE PERMITS AFTER PROVINCE WIDE BAN LIFTED

As the Provincial set fire ban has been lifted, Yellowhead County will begin issuing fire permits. Campground fires will also be allowed.

Now that the ban has been lifted County residents are reminded that the appropriate burn permits must still be attained from the proper authority for the jurisdiction in which they reside. Permits are issued within the County's jurisdiction for brush

piles, transfer sites, field, grass or stubble burn, and permits will be issued for contained burns, such as burn barrels.

Permits for burning within the County's jurisdiction, north of Highway 16 and east of Highway 22 (the northeast corner of the County), are obtained from the Yellowhead County offices in Edson or Wildwood. Permits for all other areas within Yellowhead County (Edson Forest Area) are obtained from Alberta Agriculture and Forestry.

"Although there has been ade-

quate precipitation over the last few days, residents must still obtain the correct permits and use caution when burning in any area," reminds Yellowhead County Deputy Chief of Public Safety Cory Chegwyn.

Yellowhead County continues to work with the province, depending on the conditions of the separate areas, to have similarly aligned restrictions across the County.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Millers Lake Delegation – Nathalie Cardinal, a resident at Millers Lake, made a presentation to Council to show support of the proposed noise bylaw that would address potential excessive noise issues in County hamlets and subdivisions and give law enforcement a bylaw that can be used to enforce any noise issues.

Noise Bylaw 12.16 – Having previously discussed the benefits of an updated Noise Bylaw (12.16) that addresses excessive noise in County hamlets and subdivisions, Council passed third reading that brings the updated noise bylaw into effect.

Bylaw 9.16 Public Hearing – A Public Hearing was held for Bylaw 09.16 that would rezone a property in the Hamlet of Niton Junction from Hamlet Residential (HR) District to Hamlet Commercial (HC) District. The landowner wishes to re-district this property to accommodate a future commercial storage facility. No concerns were brought forward during the public hearing. The bylaw will be brought back to Council for second reading.

Elder Abuse Prevention – Charlene Sitar, coordinator for the Yellowhead Elder Abuse Prevention program, provided an update on the progress of the Taking Action against Elder Abuse program. The group now consists of twelve agencies and organizations in the Evansburg, Edson, and Hinton areas who will work together to address elder abuse through education, prevention and intervention.

Alta Gas Road Closure – Council passed a motion to allow for the closure and transfer to the province of 420m of undeveloped road allowance for the development of a proposed \$60 million Alta Gas processing facility west of Edson. Administration will submit the resolution and a letter of request to the provincial government for their consideration and the portion of undeveloped road allowance that would be part of the future processing facility. The road allowance would

be part of the provincial lease only while the plant is in operation.

Nomination Deposit Bylaw – Nomination Deposit Bylaw 10.16 was passed by Council and will require a \$500 fee from any member of the public running for Council in an election. Under the Municipal Government Act, a candidate must receive at least equal to half of the total number of votes cast for the candidate elected to office to get their fee returned.

Robb Campground Use – Yellow-head County Council approved a lot in Robb to be used as a campground area for community activities organized by the Robb Recreation Society. The site will be used for camping during events such as quad rallies or other community events. The site will be monitored by the organization during events and will be gated with a list of the rules posted.

The next Council Meeting is June 28, 2016. The next Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is June 20, 2016. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

FIRST QUARTER PERMIT STATS CONSISTENT WITH ECONOMY

The Town of Stony Plain permit statistics for the first quarter of 2016 are consistent with the slowdown in the regional economy. The Town posted a total of 19 housing starts, with an estimated value of \$6.5 million, and

1 commercial permit valued at \$525,000.

"We are forty per cent of where we were last year," says Paul Hanlan, General Manager of Planning & Infrastructure. "However, these results were expected and seem to be the trend regionally."

While Hanlan expected permit

statistics to reflect the regional slowdown, he did not anticipate housing starts to be as high as they were over the past three to four years.

"Nineteen new housing starts means that nineteen families have committed to the Town of Stony Plain," says Hanlan. "These new housing starts were likely not speculative, but contracted new home construction, which confirms that Stony Plain is still growing as a community."

The Town of Stony Plain is confident that new housing starts will increase as the economy enters its correction phase.

FOUR ARRESTED IN STOLEN VEHICLE DURING TRAFFIC STOP

RANGE ROAD 32 WILDFIRE

THE ROAD TO SUCCESS

Evansburg is one of 19 rural Alberta communities involved in a two year applied research project called

'The Road to Success', funded by Alberta Health Services - Alberta Cancer Prevention Legacy Fund (ACPLF). The Road to Success is a community level comprehensive cancer prevention and screening ini-

tiative that works with communities to create supportive environments for health.

Communities have an important role to play in cancer prevention. How our communities are designed

and how we support individuals within our communities affects the choices people make. Up to 45% of cancer is caused by factors we understand and can influence. Communities can reduce cancer risk by reducing ultraviolet radiation exposure, implementing tobacco and alcohol reduction strategies, increasing availability and access of physical activity, increasing the availability of healthy food, and increasing awareness and access to cancer screening,

Our local Health & Wellness Committee collected community level data measuring different components of the community (nutrition, physical activity, alcohol, UV, and screening). The data showed that there is a gap in locally available food. The Committee is presently brainstorming ways to get local food available throughout the community. Ideas so far:

- · A community garden in Evansburg
- · A community garden in Entwistle
- Planters, with vegetables, herbs or berries, located throughout the community
- · Two vegetable and/or strawberry planters at Tipple Park Museum
- · Vegetable and berry planters in front of Claire's V & S, Evansburg
- · A few berry patches planted throughout the community.

In order to have more planters situated in the community, the Health & Wellness Committee is planning a 'Planter Building day' and barbecue around the middle of August, at the PARS Arena in Evansburg. Would you be interested in lending a hand? More details will follow later.

HOW TO REPOT A PLANT

Gardening time is here, with people enjoying plants both inside and outside of their homes. Container gardening, which is a planting method in which flowers and other plants are grown in pots and other containers, is quite popular because of design versatility. Containers can be moved from location to location if plants are not thriving in a particular spot. They also make gardening possible when there isn't any available land space, which might be the case for apartment-dwellers.

Flower pots enable plant enthusiasts to enjoy foliage inside of the home as well. Houseplants can add beauty to interior spaces and help filter indoor air. In the late 1980s, NASA and the Associated Landscape Contractors of America actually studied houseplants as a way to purify the air in space facilities. They found several plants are particularly good at filtering out com-

mon volatile organic compounds (VOCs). Having plants around can create inviting spaces and improve healthy conditions inside and out.

Part of caring for plants in containers involves knowing when a potted plant might need a little tender loving care. As plants grow larger, they may outgrow their containers and require more roomy quarters. Without ample space, plants may not be able to adequately draw up water and nutrients to support top growth. Repotting may seem like it is easy, but it actually takes a little finesse so not to damage the plants.

Gardening experts like those from Fine Gardening, HGTV and Today's Homeowner suggest these repotting tips.

• Be sure the plant is well watered for a few days prior to the reporting process. Watering also will help loosen the root ball from inside of the smaller pot. • A plant ready for repotting should slide out with most of the soil in one piece. If the soil is free-falling, it may not need to be repotted at this point because there's still room for the roots to expand. Other signs that plants may need repotting include roots poking out of the soil or plants that are straggly and pale.

• Consider reporting outside because the process can be messy. Have all of your materials, which include a trowel, gloves, scissors, and potting soil, handy so that you can tackle the process smoothly.

- Remove your plant from the pot carefully. Place the plant on its side, then support the main stem in one hand and use the other hand to gently pull the pot away. Be careful not to pull on the main stem or break the stem. Tread gently.
- Cut away any rotten or dead roots, and trim really long ends.
 Make three or four vertical cuts

about a third of the way up the remaining root ball. This also will help with water and nutrient absorption once the plant is in its new pot.

- Gently untangle any remaining roots and prepare to place the plant in a new pot.
- Choose a new pot that is slightly larger than the root ball. Fill the pot with soil so that the root ball sits about an inch below the rim of the pot. Add more soil around the roots to fill the pot. Be sure to leave enough room so that with each watering the pot can hold water.
- Thoroughly water the plant after repotting to moisten the soil.

Watch your plant afterwards to be sure that it's taking to its new potted home. It can take around three to four weeks for the plant to recover from repotting. Water regularly, avoid fertilizing and keep the plant out of direct sunlight.


- Conservative Private Member's Bill C-230 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (firearm definition of variant)

- Bill C-2 An Act to amend the Income Tax Act
- Bill C-11 An Act to amend the Copyright Act (access to copyrighted works or other subject-matter for persons with perceptual disabilities). This bill passed third reading and is now in the Senate
- Bill C-14 An Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make related amendments to other Acts (medical assistance in dying) was debated further. Voting is expected to take place next week.
- Bill C-10 An Act to amend the Air Canada Public Participation Act and to provide for certain other measures.
- Bill C-16 An Act to amend the Canadian Human Rights Act and the Criminal Code (the bill to protect transgender rights) was tabled.
- Liberal Motion No. 24 Tamil Heritage Month
- Question of Privilege: 'physical molestation of the Member from Berthier – Maskinongé', when the Prime Minister's aggressive behaviour infringed on the Member's right to vote.
