# **ELM PRUNING BAN LIFTED**

Sangudo, Alberta, Wednesday, November 09, 2016 – The only time it is legal to prune elms in Alberta is between October 1 and March 31. The elm bark beetles that carry the deadly Dutch Elm Disease (DED) are not active at this time of year. With the annual elm pruning ban lifted until March 31, 2017, there is time now to do some pruning before the cold weather sets in.

Regular pruning to remove dead wood helps eliminate elm bark beetle habitat. However, improper pruning including topping or removing an excessive amount of live wood is not recommended, as this weakens the tree's structure and shortens its lifespan. Janet Feddes-Calpas, executive director, Society to Prevent Dutch Elm Disease (STOPDED) reminds gardeners "It's essential that all pruned elm wood be properly disposed of by burning, burying, or chipping by March 31. And, it's illegal to store elm firewood since it could



be harbouring elm bark beetles." While Alberta is still free of DED, its borders are being pressed from two sides.





Both Saskatchewan and Montana are battling the disease. Once an elm is infected with DED there is no cure and it must be removed and destroyed immediately.

Elm trees can be recognized by their vase-shaped outline and simple leaves with coarsely toothed edges. Alberta has the largest DED-free American elm stands in the world. Since its introduction from Europe in

1930, this fungal disease has killed millions of American elm trees across North America. Feddes-Calpas says "We must stay vigilant to keep our elms healthy. DED can be prevented."

Screen Test is improving access to cancer screening for hundreds of women in northern Alberta communities where mammography is not readily available.

That's why the theme for this year's Senior's Fall Prevention month is Finding Balance – Stay Independent. Prevent Falls.

"Falls Prevention Month is a great time to remind everyone at every age about injury prevention. We're asking all Albertans to not only promote falls awareness for seniors, but for people at every age," says Teresa Curtis, health promotion facilitator, Provincial Injury Prevention Program. 

# NO BY-ELECTION TO BE HELD FOR DIVISION 4

On Thursday, October 27th, 2016, Lac Ste. Anne County Council resolved to forego a by-election for Division 4 as a result of the vacancy left by Councillor Dwight Davidson's passing. As such, there will be five Councillors in total for the remainder of term. On October 16, 2017, a general municipal election will be held.

Per the Municipal Government Act, if there is a vacancy with less than 12 months remaining in a term, the decision to hold a by-election shall be made by Council. As less than 12 months remain before a general election, Council has determined that a by-election would be an unnecessary expense and disruption to County business. With its remaining five members, Council will still maintain quorum – or the minimum number of Councillors required. Council remains confident that it can continue to adequately represent all County taxpayers until the next election.

Please note that taxpayers have access to each and every Councillor, regardless of the division in which they reside. Councillors represent the entire County; not merely their home division. As such, representation of Division 4 remains unabated by Councillor Davidson's passing.

Any Lac Ste. Anne County resident with questions, comments or concerns is free to contact Mayor Bill Hegy as well as any sitting Council Member. Additionally, residents are encouraged to contact the County Manager and Assistant County Manager as needed.



On October 26, 2016 Lac Ste. Anne County and Parkland County jointly hosted an open house to update agricultural producers on the Alternative Land Use Services (ALUS) program within the Lake Isle Watershed. ALUS has been operating in Parkland County for 5 years and through the inter-municipal Lake Isle Subwatershed project has collaborated with Lac Ste. Anne County to establish and develop its own ALUS program. The ALUS model is to undertake management changes or install projects on agricultural land that is marginal, inefficient, or environmentally significant to enhance the production of ecosystem goods and services.

The open house provided agricultural producers within the Lake Isle watershed a chance to see how the project has developed in its second year as well as to get involved with their own projects. Additionally, the Alberta Conservation Association showed drone footage of the shoreline health of Lake Isle and an update on the management research into the invasive flowering rush issue. Lac Ste. Anne and Parkland County ALUS Coordinators look forward to engaging more agricultural producers in the Lake Isle Watershed and to see improvements in the health of the ecosystem. 
