EARLY MORNING CRASHES **RESULT IN DAMAGE TO FIRE** VEHICLE AND CHARGES

Whitecourt, AB - Shortly after 6 a.m. on Sunday, November 27th, 2016, a tractor-trailer unit crashed into the ditch on Highway 43 near Chickadee Creek west of Whitecourt, Alberta. The driver of that unit sustained minor injuries. The unit was transporting fuel but no fuel from the tanks leaked as a result of the crash. There was some diesel fuel leakage from the tractor's tanks.

While Whitecourt Fire and EMS were responding to this first crash, a second tractor-trailer unit left the travel portion of the roadway and crashed into a

RCMP from Whitecourt arrived shortly afterwards and a third tractor-trailer unit struck one of the parked Fire trucks at the base of the hill. The driver of that unit failed to stop after colliding with the Fire truck. Police have identified the driver of that unit and charged an adult male with careless driving and failing to remain at the scene of a collision.

Alberta Environment is completing an assessment of the scene. Roadway restrictions may continue through the early part of this week while this work continues.

Heavy fog and icy road conditions contributed to these crashes. Motorists are reminded to drive according to road condi-

tions, regardless of posted speed limits, and be especially mindful around emergency vehicles on roadways.

Diabetes is a large and growing health problem for Albertans. In 2015, the estimated number of Albertans living with diabetes (type 1 and type 2) is 288,000. November marks diabetes month and an opportunity to raise awareness of this disease and educate Albertans on what they can do to protect their health.

Did you know your lifestyle can raise or lower your risk for type 2 diabetes? Here are some healthy lifestyle habits to help lower your risk.

• Manage your weight: If you carry extra weight, reducing your weight by $5\square 10$ per cent will lower your risk for type 2 diabetes by half. For example, a person who weighs 220 pounds (100 kg) should try to lose 11 \square 22 pounds ($5\square 10$ kg). If you would like help with weight loss, ask your doctor to refer you to a dietition • Be active: Aim to be active for at least 30 minutes, 5–7 days each week. Try activities that make your heart beat faster like brisk walking, swimming, cross country skiing, sports, or running. You should breathe faster but still be able to talk.

HOW TO LOWER YOUR RISK

Follow Canada's Food Guide: Enjoy the suggested servings from each of the four food group for your age and gender. To see the guide, visit www.healthcanada.gc.ca/foodguide. Eat three meals every day. Spreading your food over the day helps control your blood sugar. At each meal, choose three or four food groups and fill half your plate with vegetables and fruit. Include snacks if they help you eat smaller portions at your next meal. Other healthy eating strategies to help reduce risk include:

Eat more fibre: If your blood sugars are higher than normal, fibre helps manage them by slowing the movement of sugar from food into your blood. Read the Nutrition Facts table on food packages to find foods higher in fibre. Whole grain foods, vegetables and fruit, and cooked peas, beans, and lentils have fibre.

Eat small amounts of healthy fats: Things like olive and canola oils, avocado, nuts and fish have healthy fats. Cut down on saturated and trans fats found in animal products like cheese, butter, red meats and poultry skin.

Limit foods with added sugars: If your blood sugar is already higher than normal, sweet foods and added sugar in foods quickly raise blood sugar. Drink water instead of juice or sweet drinks with added sugar. Limit sugar, jam, honey, desserts, candy, syrups, and sweet sauces.

Take action to help prevent diabetes, talk to your doctor about your risk, and make healthy lifestyle changes one at a time



CONSTRUCTION ON THE RIVER EROSION CONTROL PROJECT WRAPS UP FOR THE SEASON

Construction on the River Erosion Control Project has come to a close for this year, and work will resume in the spring of 2017.

The project, which has been in the works since 2013, involves the construction of ten erosion control spurs (rock structures) to control and reduce erosion on the south bank of the Athabasca River from Riverboat Park to the Whitecourt Golf & Country Club. The Athabasca River bank has eroded over 30 metres south in places during the last five years, putting parts of Town and privately owned land at risk. The project will protect further erosion of the south banks in the areas of Riverboat Park, Millar Western Forest Products, Rotary Park and the Whitecourt Golf & Country Club. Kana Oilfield Services started construction in July 2016 and completed the water work up to the end of 47th Street in mid-September.

• All spurs up to the golf course are functional.

• The snowmobile trail north of the Millar Western mill site has been restored.

• All walking trails in the Rotary Park/47th Street area have been re-opened to the public.

The project is valued at \$6 million, and is a partnership project between the Town of Whitecourt, Millar Western Forest Products, the provincial and federal governments.

"This project has been in the works for several years, and over the last few months we have seen tremendous progress," noted Whitecourt Mayor Maryann Chichak. "Thank you to our partners for their commitment to helping safeguard our community."

Applications for next year's work have already been submitted to the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada, and work will resume in the spring of 2017 once approvals have been granted by the federal government.

• Work next year, which has been awarded to Kana Oilfield Services, will include completion of the tenth spur located by the golf course.

• The Town will incorporate the spurs into the existing trail system in the area through the development of observation decks on three of the spurs, and the installation of lighting and other landscape work along portions of Riverside Trail.

• The parking lot at the north end of 47th Street will also be completed.

"The changes will provide new areas of interest to residents," added Peter Yackulic, Project Manager. "This project has given the municipality the opportunity to improve public access to the river while addressing some of the hazards of developing in the river valley."

The Town of Whitecourt will continue to monitor the environmental impacts over the next several years, and habitat enhancements, with logs, woody debris and willow planting, will be completed in 2017.



The victim, a 75 year old male suffered serious injuries. He was taken to the U of A Hospital, in serious condition by Star Air Ambulance and later succumbed to his injuries. The 22 year driver did not suffered any injuries. The collision is still under investigation.

RAIL SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM


Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents of the Rail Safety Improvement Program (RSIP) through Transport Canada. This program provides grant and contribution funding to improve rail safety and reduce injuries and fatalities related to rail transportation.

Provinces, municipalities and other local authorities will be able to request funding for projects, with construction to begin in 2017. Projects eligible for funding include the installation of flashing lights and bells at railway crossings, the construction of full pedestrian overpasses, and public-education campaigns. There are two components:

• The Infrastructure, Technology and Research (ITR) Component funds projects that address the immediate rail safety needs of communities. The deadline for the ITR component is December 23, 2016.

• The Public Education and Awareness (E&A) Component funds public education projects aimed at reducing railway-grade crossing collisions and trespassing incidents on railway property, particularly in high-risk areas. The deadline for the E&A component is January 31, 2017.



CARFENTANIL DETECTED IN TWO DEATHS IN ALBERTA

Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health is alerting the public, as well as health and law-enforcement officials, that the illicit opioid carfentanil has been confirmed by the Chief Medical Examiner in two recent deaths.

"Albertans need to know that the drug carfentanil has made its way into our province and that it is an extremely dangerous and deadly opioid. The smallest trace of carfentanil can be lethal and Albertans should be aware of the life-threatening dangers in using this drug." - Dr. Karen Grimsrud, Chief Medical Officer of Health

Earlier this week, the Chief Medical Examiner notified the Chief Medical Officer of Health that carfentanil was detected in the deaths of two men in their 30s. One of the deaths occurred in the Edmonton area, the other in Calgary. Until very recently, toxicology tests could not confirm the existence of carfentanil in human blood due to the very low level of the drug being deadly.

"To my knowledge, there are very few laboratories in North America that are able to measure carfentanil in human blood. Alberta's Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is believed to be the first toxicology laboratory in Canada to positively identify carfentanil in human blood. The discovery of this dangerous drug is concerning to us, and we will continue to work closely with our health partners, as part of sharing information and raising awareness of opioids." - Dr. Elizabeth Brooks-Lim, Acting Chief Medical Examiner

"We are already in the eye of a deadly storm in fighting the horrific impacts of fentanyl in our communities. We are now even more challenged by the arrival of carfentanil on our streets. The primary role of the Alberta RCMP is to stop the flow of these substances and the criminal activities that support them. We will work together with our partners to weather this storm." - Deputy Commissioner Marianne Ryan, Commanding Officer, RCMP in Alberta

Carfentanil is an opioid drug licensed for use with large animals, but not for humans. Carfentanil is 100 times more toxic than fentanyl. An amount as small as a grain of sand could be lethal.

CANADA 150 COMMEMORATIVE MEDAL

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is disappointed to hear of the Liberal government's decision not to issue a commemorative medal to mark the 150th anniversary of Confederation. "Canada has had a long history of issuing medals to commemorate the Confederation of Canada and recognize deserving Canadians across the country. Commemorative medals are awarded to deserving Canadians who have demonstrated significant contributions to Canada, their community, or to their fellow Canadians," stated MP Eglinski.

An e-petition and paper petition has been launched calling on the Government to reverse their decision and issue a commemorative medal for the 150th anniversary of Confederation.

"I encourage you to sign the petition to show your support for this established Canadian tradition and the importance of recognizing the achievements and contributions of Canadians," concluded MP Eglinski.






