BACKGROUND: RCMP Investigate Threats At Local School

Stony Plain, Alta. – On the afternoon of December 1, 2016 at 1:00 PM, Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP were notified of a potential threat directed toward a student at the Memorial

Composite High School.

The RCMP responded immediately to investigate these concerns. At approximately 3:15 PM the Memorial Composite High School was set into lock down as a precaution while policed combed the area/and cleared the school looking for the suspect. The lock down has since been lifted and most of the students/staff have left the build-

ing.

Administration at the Memorial Composite High School and the Parkland School Division were advised immediately of this concern and prepared/distributed communication to Parents. At no time was any member of the public, school personnel or affected students at risk.



HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 24, 2016

County and Town of Mayerthorpe Team Up on Economic Development

Lac Ste. Anne County Council has approved a partnership with the Town of Mayerthorpe to access grant funding from the

Community and Regional Economic Support (CARES) program. If successful, the County and the Town will partner to develop training series for local businesses and people considering starting a local business, as well as conduct studies into Workforce Capacity and Recruitment and Agricultural Sector.

The CARES program funds Alberta municipalities', communities' and regions' initiatives that enhance local economic conditions, leverage regional economic development resources, and build local and regional capacity for sustainable economic development delivery. As part of the Alberta Jobs Plan, the Alberta Government has allocated \$30 million over 2 years to promote long-term economic growth and prosperity in Alberta's communities and regions through this new program.

Council Makes Improvements to the Solid Waste Utility

County Council passed second and third reading for Solid Waste Utility Amendment Bylaw #44-2016, which made several amendments to the utility.

The amendments approved in the Solid Waste Utility Amendment Bylaw #44-2016 include:

- The utility fees billed this fall, an amount of \$107.50, is valid for the twenty-four month period of January 2016 to December 2017, for each property required to participate in the Solid Waste Utility.
- Properties located in the Hamlet of Sangudo are exempted from mandatory participation in the Solid Waste Utility. As properties in the Hamlet pay for curb side solid waste under a second utility, participation in the Transfer Station utility is voluntary.
- Properties that contract a third party waste disposal service, are exempted from mandatory participation in the Solid Waste Utility. As these properties can verify that they have solid waste services from another provider their participation in the Transfer Station utility is now voluntary.
- Lac Ste. Anne County residential property owner(s) or occupant(s) excluded or exempted from the Solid Waste Utility may elect to voluntarily participate in the utility.

Exempted properties who do not wish to voluntarily participate in order to gain access to County Transfer Stations are urged to contact Lac Ste. Anne County Administration at 1.866.880.5722 to ensure that utility accounts are properly closed prior to December 31, 2016.

Council Supports "Crop in Field" Signs for Farmers

County Council has initiated a "Crop in Field Signs" program for local agricultural producers at risk of losing their livelihood due to weather conditions during the harvest. These are the same conditions that led Lac Ste. Anne County to become the second municipality in Rural Alberta to declare a State of Agriculture Disaster this fall. While current and more accurate harvest numbers will be available soon from Alberta Financial Services Corporation, there is still ample visual evidence throughout the municipality that a large amount of crop remains in the field.

The program presented by Lac Ste. Anne Agricultural Services will produce and distribute "Crop in Field" signs to agricultural producers with crops remaining in the field at no cost to the producer. The proposed signs provide a quick, effective visual indication to off-highway vehicle users that there is a crop remaining on the lands they intend to access and that it is the producers request that they do not enter. Although yields would be reduced, many crops — if undisturbed over the winter - can be salvaged and harvested in the spring.

County Tax Penalty Structure is Changing in 2017

County Council has passed a bylaw to reduce the number of tax penalties each year from seven to three. County Administration recommended the improvement to the County's tax penalty structure to achieve greater efficiencies, including the ability to send the tax statements to each account on which a penalty is applied. The changes will be implemented following the mailing of the 2017 tax notice in May. This delay in implementation is to allow additional time to notify the public as some print material have been mailed that reference the January, February and March 2017 penalties. Effective 2017, tax penalties will be applied in July for 6%, October for 9% and one in January for 9%.

## CHECK STOP SEASON

2016-1561626 / 2016-1562051 St. Albert, Alberta - The Christmas Season is upon us and so are Holiday Check Stops. St. Albert RCMP are wanting to remind the community to be responsible when attending Holiday functions, planning ahead for safe transportation to and from the event. This past weekend St. Albert Traffic Services were actively out conducting Check Stops and roving patrols

in which two arrests were made.

In one case a vehicle was travelling north bound on Inglewood Drive with no headlights on thus St. Albert Traffic Services conducted a vehicle stop, which led to an Edmonton resident being arrested and later charged with Impaired Driving - Section 253(1)(a) Criminal Code and Driving over 0.08% alcohol in blood - Section 253(1)(b) Criminal Code.

Later in the evening another roving patrol by St. Albert Traffic Services led to the arrest of two males for Possession of a Controlled Substance - Section 4(1) Control Drug and Substances Act. Although the individuals were not driving at the time of the arrest they were by their vehicle

"Impaired driving means operating a vehicle (including cars, trucks, boats, snowmobiles and off-road vehicles) while under the influence of alcohol or drugs and it is a crime under the Criminal Code of Canada," states Cst. M-J Burroughs. The consequences are serious and you

may:

- lose your licence
- · have your vehicle impounded
- need to pay an administrative monetary penalty
- need to attend an education or treatment program
- be fined upon conviction
- be required to install an ignition interlock device in your
- spend time in jail
- end up with a criminal record

The instruction is provided on an actual rig by industry professionals who focus on working safely.

Students complete safety courses in advance of going to the rig as well as two additional days of safety training on the rig. Students are taught potential hazards and how to avoid them. After the two days of safety training students begin training on the rig where they learn how to work as a team by accomplishing the tasks necessary to operate a working service rig.

Industry partners are very excited and look forward to having available trained rig technicians as the program progresses.

Likewise, NGPS students will be trained and prepared for immediate employment in the Service Rig Industry.

Industry HR staff shared that the need for such trained workers is greater than the current supply with some rigs being unable to work because of a shortage of trained staff. They estimate a need for an additional 68,000 trained employees in the next year at a starting wage of \$28 per hour.



"The opportunity for NGPS students to attend a week-long certification program as a part of the Rig Technician skilled trade training at a partner school division provides our students with the necessary skills to go directly into the oil and gas industry and work towards becoming a journeyperson.

Even in the downturn there is significant need Alberta-wide for certified Rig Technicians. One employer shared that if students completed this weeklong training they would be hired as soon as they turned 18 and could begin their first year apprenticeship training."

### Dual credit:

Dual credits are earned when a high school student is taking either a high school or a post-secondary course that results in both high school credits and post-secondary credits. Students are enrolled and/or registered in the articulated secondary/ post-secondary course in both institutions.

### Preferred placement:

Post-secondary institutions exempt students from courses (often at the first-year level) in recognition of coursework completed in high school (e.g. first-period apprenticeship, Child Development Assistant).

### Workplace certification:

Provincial high school curricula, particularly Career and Technology Studies, provide students with opportunities to achieve workplace certification through pathways (e.g. Medical First Responder, Adobe Certified Expert).

## TOXIC OPIOID CARFENTANIL **LINKED TO 15 DEATHS**

#### Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Karen Grimsrud, and Acting Chief Medical Examiner Dr. Elizabeth Brooks-Lim are notifying the public that the toxic opioid carfentanil is still circulating in our province and has been linked to 15 drug overdose deaths.

Fourteen of those 15 deaths occurred between September and the end of No-

"I am deeply concerned about the increasing number of deaths associated with carfentanil. It's possible these individuals were not aware they were taking it. Albertans need to know that carfentanil is here - in Alberta cities and towns - and that it's an extremely dangerous and deadly opioid. Even the smallest trace can be lethal." - Dr. Karen Grimsrud, Chief Medical Officer of Health

"The increasing number of deaths due to this dangerous drug is concerning to us, and we will continue to work closely with our health partners, as part of sharing information and raising awareness of opioids misuse. The Alberta Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is one of only a very small number of toxicology laboratories in Canada that is able to

Alberta remains focused on harm reduction as it moves forward with a co-ordinated and collaborative provincial response to the opioid crisis.

When combined with prevention, treatment and enforcement, a broad spectrum of harm reduction approaches will help decrease harmful consequences of drug use to keep people alive.


- If you are using these types of drugs:
- Don't use them alone and make sure you are near someone who can call for
- Don't mix them with other drugs or

- It you suspect someone is overdosing, don't wait. Dial 911 right away.
- · Carry a naloxone kit. Know how to use it to save someone's life. Make sure your buddy knows how to use it to save yours. Naloxone is a temporary fix you still need to call 911.
- · Most importantly, know there are resources available to help you whether you are using drugs for the first time or have used them frequently.
- · If you're concerned about your own or someone else's use of illicit drugs. call the Addiction Helpline (24 hours a day, seven days a week) at 1-866-332-2322, or Health Link at 811.

Provincial response to opioid crisis

- · Working closely with other Alberta government ministries, health experts, community groups, parent advocates, law enforcement and the medical community, the Chief Medical Officer of Health is leading a collaborative and co-ordinated provincial response, focused on four key areas:
- 1. Improving the collection and publishing of data to better target interven-
- 2. Expanding access to opioid replacement therapy.
- 3. Funding community agencies to assess the need for supervised consumption services.
- 4. Promoting appropriate opioid prescribing and implementing new tools to prevent prescription drug misuse, in partnership with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta.
- · Publicly funded take-home naloxone kits are available at more than 900 registered sites, including community
- · A new public awareness social-media campaign has been rolled out. It explains how to use naloxone to prevent overdose deaths and on where people can get naloxone free of charge.
- Grant funding is being provided to Access to Medically Supervised Injection Services Edmonton to support community engagement and the development of an application for a federal exemption to offer supervised consumption services in Edmonton's inner city.
- The province has invested \$3 million over the next three years for an opioid dependency treatment (ODT) expansion project. Work is under way to increase access to opioid replacement therapy in Alberta Health Services ODT
- · The province has provided "Proceeds of Crime" grants totalling \$240,000 to police and their community partners to raise awareness of the dangers of fentanyl and other illicit drugs.
- · Legislation will come into effect in January 2017 to regulate pill presses to enhance enforcement for illicit fentanyl manufacturing.
