# SOFTWOOD LUMBER AGREEMENT

**Submitted by Oneil Carlier, MLA Whitecourt-Ste. Anne, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry**

Our government stands shoulder to shoulder with Alberta's forest workers, their families and the communities that rely on a strong forest industry. Our government is working closely with the federal government and our forest industry to defend Alberta jobs and fair market access.

This is the fifth time since 1982 that the U.S. has investigated alleged Canadian lumber subsidies. In each case, international tribunals have ruled in Canada's favour. We are confident we will prevail again.

Together with affected provinces and the federal government, we are developing plans to help support Albertans in addressing the possible impacts of a prolonged trade dispute.

Part of our strategy is to have a strong voice for Alberta in the U.S. That's why our government has appointed Gary Doer, a former Canadian ambassador to the U.S.

His experience, high profile and deep knowledge of bilateral relations will be critical to ensuring our U.S. partners understand the significance of the U.S.-Alberta softwood trade relationship. He will be a key ally in advancing our strong commitment to finding a solution to the lumber dispute.

As your local MLA and the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry, I am heavily involved in a federal-provincial task force on this issue to ensure that Alberta's interests are represented in broader national efforts to overturn this unfair trade action. I have also engaged my American counterparts while at meetings in the U.S. earlier in the year.

We believe that a new and lasting deal is needed and we want to ensure that any deal supports our forest industry and the workers who support their families in this important industry. We want to see a long term solution to this problem and we are working hard to achieve that goal.

Diversifying our economy remains a key priority for our govern-

ment, and a robust forest industry is a key ingredient in a diverse and resilient Alberta economy. Alongside that goal, we are also working hard to diversify our markets so that we are no longer stuck in the trap of selling one product at one price to one customer.

We know that Alberta's forest industry relies significantly on exports. That is why we are actively pursuing new markets outside the U.S. I have taken trade missions in Asia to move this goal forward.

Premier Rachel Notley and Economic Development and Trade Minister Deron Bilous have also recently returned from a very successful Asian trade mission.

As a government we want to ensure our products are sold around the world so we can continue diversifying our economy, creating good jobs and making life better for Alberta's forest communities. Our government's actions on the softwood lumber issue will be centred on those priorities.

# GOLFER'S GUIDE

## TIPS FOR NEWCOMERS TO THE GAME OF GOLF

Few hobbies can be as enjoyable one moment and as frustrating the next as golf. Golfers know a great putt can be quickly followed by a bad tee shot, and maintaining their composure through the highs and lows of the game is a key to success on the links.

Maintaining that composure isn't always easy, even for the professionals. It's even more difficult for beginners, who quickly learn the game of golf involves more than just spending sunny weekend afternoons on pristine golf courses. In fact, golf can be quite demanding, and beginners would be wise to heed a few tips before hitting the course.

\* Don't commit to an expensive set of clubs right off the bat. Golf clubs can be very expensive, so

beginners should buy an affordable secondhand set of clubs so they can get the hang of what they like before spending a lot of money. Visit a pro shop and explain that you are just a beginner. The shop will likely make some valuable suggestions and might even let you try out a pair of clubs. In addition, many driving ranges allow customers to rent clubs, and this can be a great and inexpensive way to find the right clubs for you.

\* Take lessons. Even the very best at self-teaching might find it extremely difficult to become a self-taught golfer. When first trying your hand at golf, take some lessons and don't expect to be playing 18 holes any time soon. Before hitting the course, where you might be discouraged and

you might frustrate those golfing behind you, learn the fundamentals by taking a few lessons at the driving range. Learn from a professional, who won't offer you any hidden secrets to golfing glory (there aren't any) but will offer sound advice on the game's fundamentals.

\* Take the game home with you. Beginners can even take advantage of golf's vast popularity by taking the game home with them. This doesn't mean building a putting green in your backyard. Rather, purchase some instructional DVDs to learn the game during your down time throughout the week. Many golfers don't have time to hit the links during the week, but they do have time to watch some DVDs when they get

home from work. Such instructional DVDs can help you master your grip and stance, which you can then take with you to the course over the weekend.

\* Have fun. Golf is a fun game; it just takes time to hone your skills. But even if you aren't ready for the professional tour after your first few rounds, you can still have fun. Don't let some beginner's frustration, which every golfer experiences, ruin the fun of the game. Take note of your surroundings when you hit the links, and appreciate the time you're spending with your group. If the game becomes more a source of frustration than fun, then take a break and put in some more work away from the course, be it at the driving range or studying at home.

# GOLFER'S GUIDE

## 9 WAYS TO IMPROVE YOUR GOLF GAME

Warmer weather sends scores of golfers to their favorite courses each and every day. Golf is a challenging pastime, but a few pointers can help golfers hone their short games, long games and everything in between.

- Choose the right clubs. There is more to selecting clubs than pulling any old iron out of your golf bag and whacking away. Wind, hazards and obstructions in landing areas should influence your decision of which club to use. Novice golfers may want to rely on their caddies to make club recommendations, and as they become more confident in their abilities they can start to make their own choices.

- Anchor your feet. Anchor your foot behind the ball to drive the ball further. Right-handed players will keep the right foot anchored, and lefties will do the opposite. Do not lift your foot prematurely; otherwise, you can lose power and distance.

- Identify your weaknesses. As with any hobby, identifying those areas that need the most work can help you become a better golfer. Keep track of each shot you take, and then look at the results to see which areas of your game need the

most work.

- Fix your alignment. Align your shots by assessing the target from behind the ball. Then set the clubface behind the golf ball and align it with the target before you enter your stance.

- Use your torso for power. The torso is essential to a solid swing. Practice rotating from your core to control your backswing and then maintain the same spine angle and posture on the downswing.

- Use the wind. Not every golf game will be played in perfect weather. A good player knows how to make adjustments for the wind depending on the shot. Use the wind to your advantage when you can, and adjust your swing when hitting into the wind.

- Become a better chipper. Many players put so much emphasis on their backswings and putt shots that they fail to devote any practice to chips. All shots are important for golfers trying to shed strokes off of their scores.

- Keep fit. Maintain or improving your physical

strength and overall health can help your golf game. Exercise and eat right, and you will have more endurance on the links.



# MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION INVOLVING SCHOOL BUS

East and west lanes on Hwy 37 and Range Road 271 southbound were closed until 10:30 a.m. while Morinville RCMP in conjunction

with an RCMP collision analyst conducted their investigation and crews removed vehicles and debris.

Alcohol and/or drugs are not believed to be a factor.

This collision is still under investigation.

# OJSH Students Earn Credits In Outdoor Ed Camp

Inroads Mountain Sports led by Jerry and Sandy Fochler instructed the students throughout their time at Black Cat.

Carrying 30 to 40 pound packs, students and teachers hiked up Mt. Solomon on an overnight backpacking excursion. Mt. Solomon has an elevation of 1590m. A base level of fitness is required since there are some difficult sections of climbing but every student successfully participated in the overnight hike. The students also spent an entire afternoon rock climbing at Cougar Bluffs. Some of the students were hesitant about the rock climbing adventure but, once again, every one successfully completed the climb.

The Outdoor Ed group were led on day hikes where they were instructed on plant identification; they participated in locating exercises using GPS and compass with topographical maps; and, basic survival knowledge such as fire-lighting was done. Those students who had previous Outdoor Ed experience had to complete a project: they had to sample and measure ten 20m x 20m sections of forest. The novice Outdoor Ed students' project was to map a 20m x 20m land plot.

The students were kept active and engaged every day from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., learning about and experiencing Alberta's wilderness. Outdoor Education trips promote active learning and personal growth through direct experience, and offer excitement and adventure within a framework of safety. All of their efforts gave each student five credits in their high

school education but the true reward was their satisfaction in successfully meeting the physical and mental challenges the trip offered.

There is another Outdoor Education

trip planned for September 22nd to 24th. The goals are the same although the program will differ. Students are encouraged to join in on the adventure!




# Lawn & Garden

## CREATE A BUDGET-FRIENDLY HOME LANDSCAPE

Homeowners understandably envy the award-worthy photo spreads in lawn and garden magazines, wanting to emulate those same looks on their own properties. Scores of designers and landscape architects are involved in the process of creating those amazing lush lawns and perfectly placed plantings. Although not every homeowner has the budget to create lavish landscape designs, it's still possible

for homeowners to create lawns they can be proud of.

- Establish your budget. The first step in any project is to determine how much money you can devote to the job. Once you have established the budget, all other factors can be built around it.

- Buy native plants. Native plants, shrubs, trees, and flowers will fare better than non-native, exotic plants. That means you'll have to spend less time and money nurturing them into health, and less money having to replace plants that cannot withstand your climate.

- Consider perennial plants. Perennials may cost more at the outset, but the savings will be realized in the years to come.

- Hire a professional. It may seem counterintuitive to spend money on a landscaping professional when you've established a strict budget, but that's one way to save money. Landscape artists or garden designers have the experience to guide you in the right direction and help you avoid potentially costly mistakes.

- Use gravel in spots where plants don't thrive. Gravel is an inexpensive landscaping material that can fill in voids where plants or ground cover simply do not flourish. Those working on limited budgets may be happy to learn gravel is typically less expensive than concrete or pavers.

- Ask friends or family for clippings. Don't be shy about admiring the plantings of those you know. Flatter their good taste and ask if you can have some clippings to propagate yourself. These clippings can turn into lush plants in no time - with no additional spending required.

# Lawn & Garden

## HELPFUL AND HARMFUL INSECTS

Although it's virtually impossible to count them, insects are the most diverse group of organisms on the planet. Nine hundred thousand different kinds of insects are known to exist. At any given time, it is estimated that there are around 10 quintillion individual insects living.

Gardeners grow frustrated when seeing their gardens infested with insects. In an effort to restore their gardens, homeowners might be tempted to eradicate any bug that moves in their yards. But gardeners would be wise to first learn which insects are hurting their gardens and which can actually help gardens in the long run.

### Harmful

Certain insects can be dangerous to animals and plants. The following are a handful of insects that can threaten the vitality of gardens.

**Aphids:** These insects suck on the juice needed to sustain plants, particularly when they congregate.

**Bald-faced hornet:** Hornets tend to be an aggressive species that can sting repeatedly. Should you find a nest near an entertaining space or garden, it can cause trouble.

**Carpenter ants:** These ants will burrow into wood causing damage. They may compromise any wooden structure in and around a home.

**Locusts:** Various species of locust can damage plants and crops due to their voracious appetites.

**Treehoppers:** These small, green insects mimic the look of leaves, and their appetites can affect crops and gardens.

**Red pavement ant:** As they feed on all manner of human food, these ants can quickly overtake areas with their staggering numbers

and deliver painful bites.

**Grasshoppers:** Certain grasshoppers, like the red-legged grasshopper, can decimate food crops and transfer parasites to birds when eaten as prey.

**Caterpillars:** Many caterpillars, the precursor to adult moths, will feed constantly on leaves, stems and other parts of plants. The tobacco hornworm moth caterpillar can damage potato and tomato plants.

### Helpful

Plants depend on insects to transfer pollen as they forage, and many insects are quite beneficial to have around. While some pollinate, others are predators of other pests.

**Antlion:** A foe of ants, they'll help eat and control ant populations and pollinate flowers. They pose no threat to humans, either.

**Big dipper firefly:** These colorful

insects feast on earthworms, slugs and snails during the larval stage. Fireflies add drama to evening gardens with their twinkling lights.

**Garden spiders:** Although some spiders can be venomous, many are quite handy to have around the garden. They'll help control pest populations that can damage plants and crops.

**Dragonflies:** These arial artists that zip around the yard are consuming smaller insects that would otherwise pester plants and humans.

**Blue-winged wasp:** This wasp attacks the larvae of Japanese beetles, helping to control beetle populations.

**Bees and butterflies:** Butterflies and bees are some of the best pollinators out there, and each can add whimsy to gardens.

# Lawn & Garden

## PROBLEMS THAT CAN LEAD TO LAWN DAMAGE

A beautiful lawn is a goal for many homeowners. Some homeowners may find that lovely lawns may last momentarily, only to disappear when damage - be it pest-, weather- or child-related - sets in.

While well-established turf can be resilient, even the most well-maintained lawns can be vulnerable. Preventing lawn damage first involves getting to the root of the problem.

- **Lack of sunlight:** All plants need the proper ratio of sunlight to grow. Too much sunlight and plant blades can scorch. Too little sunlight and grass may turn brown and die. Although there are shade-tolerant varieties of grass, homeowners also can explore alternative landscapes. Work in a garden bed or create

a design that utilizes gravel or mulch. Avoid aggressively pruning back trees to give the lawn more sunlight in that area, as this may just damage the trees.

- **Chemical spills:** Gasoline and fertilizer spills and pesticide applications in high concentrations can cause the lawn to yellow or brown in spots. Carefully refill lawn gas tanks and fertilizer spreaders on the sidewalk or driveway to avoid overflow onto the lawn. If spills occur, flood the area promptly with water to dilute.

- **Foot traffic:** Lawns can take a pounding from foot traffic, leading to compaction and spots of dead lawn. Try to redirect the traffic elsewhere to give worn down areas a break. Aeration can relieve soil compaction. If a cer-

tain area has become the de facto pathway, install a paver, gravel or concrete walkway in that spot.

- **Debris:** Leaving a tool, kids' toys, piece of wood, or any debris on the lawn can quickly suffocate the grass beneath and cause the lawn to die quickly. Make sure that no items are left on the lawn for an extended period of time.

- **Mowing patterns:** Running the mower in the same pattern over and over can cause ruts in the grass that lead to damage, so avoid mowing in the same direction on consecutive cuts. Avoid mowing on very hot days or when the lawn is soggy. Both can cause tracks to form in the lawn.

- **Mowers:** Dull lawn mower blades can damage lawns,

as can mowing too fast. Grass blades can be torn, snapped and more, resulting in brown spots.

- **Wildlife:** Animals and insects can destroy turf roots. Animals or insects may feed on the grass from underneath its surface, compromising the lawn's ability to procure nutrients and water. Animals like moles or raccoons may feed on grubs in the lawn, and treating for grubs can alleviate torn-up turf.

Lawns can be hearty, but they're also highly susceptible to damage. Even seemingly harmless things can compromise the integrity of a lawn. Understanding the causes of lawn damage can help homeowners protect their lawns.





# WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

May 11, 2017

A significant sewer blockage has occurred in a trunk sewer main that services the Hilltop area. After inspection, the majority of the 750mm concrete sewer pipe was blocked by a variety of waste products improperly disposed of into the sewer system (i.e. rags, sanitary/baby wipes, sand, gravels, oils). Infrastructure Services crews have been working to clear the blockage, and estimates that there is enough “unflushable” waste to fill two tandem trucks (18 cubic yards of waste). The estimated cost to clear the blocked line is \$60,000. Whitecourt recently produced an information sheet on what can and can’t be disposed of through the sewer system, and will be working to develop an educational campaign that will inform residents on how to properly dispose of “unflushable” items. Follow Whitecourt’s Facebook page and website for information on where wastewater goes and what should not be disposed of in your toilets, sinks or storm water drains.

Whitecourt property owners will receive their combined 2017 property assessment and tax notice this month. Changes have been made to the notice to provide additional information to ratepayers on the annual tax levy and what their tax dollars are utilized for. For more information on 2017 municipal taxes, and payment information, please visit [www.whitecourt.ca](http://www.whitecourt.ca). Property taxes are due Tuesday, July 4.




