PARLIAMENT UPDATE

Week of May 15, 2017

This week in Parliament, we discussed topics including labour unions, illegal substances and overdoses, impaired driving, and seniors.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-7 An Act to amend the Public Service Labour Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations and Employment Board Act and other Acts and to provide for certain other measures (Consideration of Senate Amendments)
- Bill C-37 An Act to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act and to make related amendments to other Acts (Consideration of Senate Amendments)
- Bill C-46 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (offences relating to conveyances) and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Second Reading)
- Bill C-309 Gender Equality Week Act (Report Stage)
- Bill S-226 Justice for Victims of Corrupt Foreign Officials Act (Sergei

Magnitsky Law) (Second Reading)

- Bill S-233 Conveyance Presentation and Reporting Requirements Modernization Act (Second Reading)
- Estimates in Committee of the Whole Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development

On Wednesday, I spoke on an amendment to M-106, calling on the Prime Minister to appoint a Minister of Seniors. You can read my comments on Wednesday's Debate Hansard at the above website.





CITY COUNCIL MOVES FORWARD WITH 1.8% RES/NON-RES TAX INCREASE

Leduc's tax revenue increase is set at 1.8%, however not all citizens and businesses will see a raise on their 2017 tax bill. Leduc City Council passed the 2017 Property Tax Bylaw at their regular meeting, April 24, that also outlines this year's property

assessment impacts and a threeyear tax smoothly strategy.

"Without a doubt times have been tough for every aspect of this community, from local small businesses to our citizens, and this municipality did not go untouched by the economic downtown that began late 2015," says Leduc Mayor Greg Krischke. "In working very closely with administration, we've put togeth-

er a conservative tax smoothing strategy to help balance the challenges we're facing while maintaining a service level citizens have come to rely on."

The city's multi-year tax smoothing strategy provides the ability of preserving current services and programs by taking a proactive approach in forecasting the potential future tax impact over a three-year period:

1.81 per cent in 2017

2.82 per cent in 2018

3.3 per cent in 2019

The 2017 property assessments have also changed during this tax season that will show roughly a third of citizens, respectively, either paying more, less or basically the same as the previous tax year. This shift in assessment is the result of either growth, or overall supply and demand which also coincides with inflation/deflation.

"This is congruent with a slower housing market," says Jennifer Cannon, director of Finance with the City of Leduc. "Although Leduc grew by 4 per cent in 2016, overall development in this city was less than half (\$122.8 million) over the previous year (\$255.5 million in 2015). These are significant factors that affect the city's taxation process."

City administration continues to monitor economic activity, and although the province is seeing some positive movement, current forecasts indicate Alberta will not reach the similar activity levels in 2014 until 2019.

Education Property Tax

This tax is calculated by the province based on property assessment values where every municipality in Alberta is required to collect this tax on the province's behalf (100 per cent flow-through). The 2017 education requisition is just over \$17.7 million, up from \$15.8 million last year (12 per cent increase).


