Brazeau County, Alberta, June 5, 2017 — Brazeau County is mourning the loss of a well-known political leader, community advocate and volunteer, with the passing of former Reeve Wes Tweedle.

"Wes loved being on Council and he loved this County," says Reeve Bart Guyon. "He was the longest-serving member of Council and that is a significant contribution for anyone to make."

Tweedle served as a Councillor from 1989 to 1994, and as Reeve from 1994 to 1996, and again

from 2004 to 2013. In 2012, he was recognized for his contributions to Lindale, Brazeau County, and the wider community with a Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal.

Parking at events will be limited and we encourage you to


help prevent unnecessary traffic and roadway congestion so everyone can enjoy the day. Take advantage of Park & Ride locations that will be made available throughout the City.



I had the best trip with him and his wife Julia to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Conference – we laughed so much. He was very well respected, and did his best for the whole community."

"I knew Wes to be a man of integrity and kindness and one I truly honour for the respect he showed others," says Division 2 Councillor Rita Moir. "He will be deeply missed in our community."

"Wes was a politician who was a statesman, a farmer who was an integral member of a rural community, and most importantly a caring family man," says Division 3 Councillor Marc Gressler.

Division 4 Councillor Kara Westerlund says, "Wes was a man of integrity. His dedication and volunteerism will be felt in this community for years to come. I had the honour and privilege to work alongside a great man. Our community has lost a great leader."



The NHSP call for proposals, open

until June 23, 2017, is seeking proposals for projects led or inspired by seniors. Organizations are invited to apply for funding for projects that promote positive aging and empower seniors to initiate and participate in activities that benefit the community. Eligible organizations can receive up to \$25,000 in project funding.


