ACCIDENTAL BEARSPRAY CONTAMINATION RESULTS IN TERMINAL EVACUATION

Leduc, Alberta - An apparent accident led to the four people being exposed to bearspray and an area of Edmonton International Airport being evacuated on July 8, 2017

At approximately 8:30 pm, Edmonton Airport RCMP were called to a waiting area in the airport for reports of a contaminant in the air. Investigators responded and located a

man coming out of a washroom who was suffering the effects of having been exposed to bearspray. After interviewing the man and reviewing security footage, the investigators have determined that the man found a can of bearspray in a liquids disposal receptacle at the check in area. The man, unaware of what the can was, sat in a waiting area and inadvertently released some of the spray onto himself and into the air. The man then went to a washroom

to decontaminate himself and was quickly found by officers.

One child and 3 adults were treated for exposure to the bearspray in addition to the individual that had sprayed himself. Due to the bearspray contaminating the air, a portion of the airport was evacuated, causing some disruption to airport operations.

At this time, investigators do not believe this was a criminal act and charges are not anticipated.

DEVON DRUG SEIZURE

On July 11th, 2017 Devon RCMP and the Leduc RCMP Drug Unit concluded a joint investigation into street level drug trafficking in the town of Devon. As a result of this joint investigation police arrested 28 year old Dallas HALLADAY, of Devon, Alberta. Upon his arrest police found HALLADAY in possession of approximately \$3000 worth of illicit drugs including cocaine, methamphetamine, MDMA (Ecsta-

sy), Oxycodone, and marihuana. He was also in possession of two prohibited knives, bear mace, and a 12 gauge shotgun with ammunition.

He now faces a staggering total of 23 charges under the Criminal Code and the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. The charges are for trafficking methamphetamine, possession of various controlled substances for the purpose of trafficking, multiple firearms and weapons offences, as well as several charges relating to the violation of previous bail conditions.

HALLADAY has been remanded into custody with his first court appearance set for July 14th, 2017.

This investigation is a significant achievement in the RCMP's ongoing commitment to provide safer communities in the Province of Alberta, and specifically in the Devon and Leduc areas.

POVERTY REDUCTION STRATEGY CONSULTATION

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is encouraging residents to participate in a nation-wide consultation process to support the development of Canada's Poverty Reduction Strategy, which will be aimed at reducing poverty and improving the economic well-being

WHAT DOES THE 2017 FEDERAL LIBERAL BUDGET SAY TO SENIORS?

For the first time, the number of seniors in Canada exceeds the number of youth. Right now, one in six Canadians is a senior. In 12 short years that number will be one in four. You would think there would be something in the 2017 Budget for our seniors. Disappointingly, there is not!

Instead, Budget 2017 is hiking taxes and making life more expensive for Canadians; it should have intro-

duced tax measures that would have helped make life more affordable for those living on a fixed income.

There are several features in the Budget that will hurt Canadian seniors:

- Scrapping the Public Transit Tax Credit
- Eliminating the Family Caregiver Tax Credit
- The Prime Minister's refusal to appoint a Minister for Seniors.

I have presented in the House petitions calling for national strategies

for seniors and palliative care. I have also presented a petition calling on the Prime Minister to appoint a Minister of Seniors.

Budget 2017 contained little more than buzzwords and re-packaged ideas. Catch-all policies with the word "senior" stamped on them are not enough to address the very real needs of our aging population. This budget begs the question - why are Canadian seniors being ignored by the Prime Minister?

GOOD TO BE HOME

I am pleased to be home with my constituents where I will be spending my time in communities across this beautiful riding of Yellowhead. Returning home allows me the opportunity to meet faceto-face with you, attend events, catch up on phone calls, and answer correspondence. Meetings, events, phone calls and responding to your letters will help me represent you better when Parliament resumes in September.

The spring parliamentary ses-

sion concluded on June 21, 2017. Below is a summary of hot topics:

Interesting how the federal government can quickly produce \$10.5 million to pay Omar Khadr, who fought against Canada, but can't seem to provide enough funding in the Veterans Affairs budget to make sure our elderly veterans are properly cared for. Mr. Trudeau was wrong to compensate Omar Khadr, and wrong to do it in a secret deal.

2. Métis commissioner, Marilyn Poitras stepped down from the five-member commission, citing issues with the "current structure" of the inquiry into Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls.

Prime Minister Trudeau promised to borrow only \$10 billion, and balance the budget by 2019. The Finance Department's report shows a different story. It says the deficit won't be eliminated for at least 35 years! His borrowing and spending is out of control. So much for a 'modest deficit'.

Thanks to this Liberal government, we won't have a softwood lumber deal anytime soon. This is one of the main industries in our riding of which I have repeatedly brought to the Government's attention.

The Liberal government must immediately act on the Mountain Pine Beetle infestation before it is too late. This is another issue I have repeatedly brought to the Government's attention.

The Trudeau Liberals have scrapped important tax credits for kids' sports and arts programs; slashed the Tax-Free Savings Account; put tax hikes on public transit, beer and wine; and applied GST to ridesharing services like Uber.

Their proposed national carbon tax will increase the price of gasoline by 11 cents by 2022, costing the average family \$1,250 to \$2,500 per year.

Their payroll tax hikes will make it harder for companies to hire young people. So much for our farmers and our youth! This must be stopped!

The taxpayer-funded Infrastructure Bank has been widely criticized by industry professionals for putting tax dollars on the line to cover risky investments made by private companies. This bank will only help a lot of well-connected insiders and lobbyists. What about building the roads and bridges communities need?

10. What about the status of the Kinder Morgan Pipeline? After all, Canadians can have jobs and a clean environment.

Trudeau's "Sunny Ways" is leading us to "Gloomy Days" as his government becomes even less transparent, less accountable, and less cooperative.

As we look ahead to the fall session of Parliament, our new Conservative leader. Andrew Scheer. and our team will continue to stand up for everyday Canadians. ENVIRONMENTAL DAMAGES FUND

OTTAWA - Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents of a call for applications to the new Environmental Damages Fund through Environment and Climate Change Canada. The program is making \$130,741 available in Alberta to support projects that help to restore or enhance the environment, conduct environmental research, and provide public education on environmental issues.

In Alberta, there are two types of funding available. The federal government has made \$20,000 available for projects aimed at preventing pollution and/or protecting the environment.

Additionally, \$110,741 is available for projects which promote the proper management and control of fisheries or fish habitat, and/or the conservation and protection of fish or fish habitat in Alberta. Preference for this funding will be given to projects in the Athabasca

watershed or adjacent watersheds in Alberta, and in the North Saskatchewan River Watershed.

"I am pleased to see the federal government investing in areas of our riding where environmental damage may have occurred along the North Saskatchewan River Watershed," stated MP Eglinski.

Eligible applicants include: non-governmental organizations; academic institutions; indigenous organizations; and provincial, territorial and municipal governments. The deadline for projects in Alberta is July 28, 2017. Priority funding will be given to projects that restore the natural environment and conserve wildlife.

"I encourage all those interested in this program, especially those along the North Saskatchewan River, to apply. Let's ensure that our riding of Yellowhead continues to represent the best of Alberta's beauty," concluded MP Eglinski.

NEW REGIONAL ON-RESERVE WATER LINE

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents of an investment for a new regional on-reserve water line and water infrastructure.

The investment, which is made in partnership with all three levels of government, will connect the Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation to the West Inter Lake District regional water supply system, as well as construct a potable water supply line, pumphouse, and treated water reservoir. The federal government plans to invest approximately \$10 million to support the completion of the project, which is part of a com-

mitment of \$1.8 billion over five years for water and wastewater.

The Alberta government is investing \$7.15 million to complete the Alexis Nakota Sioux water tie-in project connecting the regional water system to the reserve. This project is part of Alberta's \$100 million commitment over four years to ensure Alberta First Nations have access to clean and safe drinking water.

"Everyone should have access to safe running water. I am proud to see investments being made to support one of our local Indigenous communities, promoting the health and wellbeing of the community," concluded MP Eglinski.

INVESTMENTS IN LOCAL WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

in local water infrastructure.

A new project in Parkland County has been approved under the Government of Canada's Clean Water and Wastewater Fund (CWWF). The federal government is providing over \$6.3 million, while the Capital Region Parkland Water Services Commission will fund the remainder of the nearly \$24 million project.

The water commission will now be able to begin work on a multiphase system twinning project. The first phase will involve the construction of approximately four kilometers of new waterline from the EPCOR Utilities supply point to Acheson Industrial Park. This project will help meet the increased water demands of the Capital Region Parkland Water Services Commission as well as the West Inter-Lake District Water Commission and the Paul First Nation and Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation.

In addition to this project, federal funding through CWWF has been announced for the following communities in Yellowhead:

- Brazeau County Project name: New Sewage Trunk Line - Federal funding: \$165,000 - Municipal funding: \$165,000
- Clearwater County - Project name: Lift Station Rehabilitation - Federal funding: \$290,000 - Municipal funding: \$290,000
- Mayerthorpe Project name: Water Treatment Plant Improvement Project - Federal funding: \$634,000 - Municipal funding: \$634,000

"I am proud to see investments in Yellowhead's infrastructure so that local residents and their families have access to modern, reliable water and wastewater services that meet their needs," concluded MP Eglinski.

BLUE-GREEN ALGAE BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR WIZARD LAKE

EDMONTON – A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Wizard Lake, located southwest of Leduc. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

• Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacte-

ria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

- Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) is visible
- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.
- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this

lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Wizard Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae (cyanobacteria). An alternate source of drinking water

should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is naturally occurring, and often become visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae (cyanobacteria), or who ingest water containing blue-green algae (cyanobacteria), may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Wizard Lake, until further notice.

Please note that areas of Wizard Lake in which the blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Blue-green Algae (Cyanobacteria) Advisory is in place.

If you suspect a problem related to blue-green algae (cyanobacteria), or if you require further information on health concerns and blue-green algae (cyanobacteria), please call Health Link at 811. Additional information is also available online, at www.ahs.ca/bga.



- · protecting roads and workplaces
- economic implications and opportunities

The government will also be conducting stakeholder roundtable meetings, sector-specific meetings and surveys at public events across Alberta.

Once the public and stakeholder engagement is complete, the input will be used to help form a Cannabis Framework, which will outline proposed next steps for Alberta. Albertans will have another opportunity to provide their feedback on the framework and the direction government will take.


