MAYERTHORPE RCMP RESPOND TO COLLISIONS AT HIGHWAY 43 AND 22 INTERSECTION

Mayerthorpe, Alberta – Mayerthorpe RCMP are urging drivers to use caution and follow the rules of the road when travelling through the intersection of Highway 43 and Highway 22 after emergency crews responded to two separate collisions in two days involving 6 vehicles. The collisions are still under investigation and fortunately only minor injuries to one passenger was reported.

The intersection of Highway 43 and Highway 22 is to be treated the same as any other intersection, with a meridian separating the travel lanes. RCMP are advising motorists

not to stop in the middle of the intersection. Many motorists have been using the intersection incorrectly by travelling partly through the intersection and then yielding for vehicles on the other side who have a stop sign. This is incorrect.

Straw will be flying on Saturday September 23th at the Adam farm when Onoway and District Historical Guild hosts the 11th annual threshing bee. The threshing machine is primed up and ready to go, and the Guild is looking for hardy souls to head out to the fields to pitch bundles on to the hayracks.

Young and old are invited to pitch bundles, ride the hayrack then pitch the bundles on to the threshing machine feeder. Those who grew up in the threshing machine (rather than combine) era will no doubt have many tales to tell.

Teams of horses (plus their drivers) have been recruited to provide wagon rides. Demonstrations of old-time skills such as blacksmithing, spinning, ropemaking, and sawing firewood will be held throughout the day; antique tractors and equipment, cars and trucks will be on site as well. Special activities are planned for children.

One of the traditions of the threshing bee is having lunch out in the field so both workers and visitors will be able to try out some home-made pie as well as hot dogs and hamburgers as they listen to Connie and Norm Lefebvre's music.

Watching the strawpile grow, leaving behind the world of cell phones and texting, eating the old-fashioned version of junk food – there's fun for the whole family out in the field when harvesting as it was done in the first half of the 1900s once again happens in Onoway. But everyone will need to keep their eyes on the sky as well. Divers from Eden North Parachute School will be dropping down for a visit.

The threshing bee will be held in the field on the corner of Highways 43 and 633.Look for directional signs to access the field. Mark your calendar now!

FARMERS FACING WEATHER CHALLENGES AGAIN

Weather has been variable throughout Alberta this spring and summer with continuing wet conditions in the north central region, and drier than normal conditions in the south. There are concerns about the yield and quality of all crops, including hay and pasture.

Agriculture Financial Services Corporation (AFSC), the provincial Crown corporation that delivers Business Risk Management programs for producers, reminds clients to carefully assess their options to get the most out of their insurance coverage.

"AFSC has two types of insurance programs in place to protect insured clients who are experiencing either dry conditions or excess moisture,' said Nancy Smith, Coordinator of Insurance Products at AFSC.

"Production-based programs for crops and hay provide protection from an individual production shortfall or reduction in quality. Area-based programs protect clients' crops and pasture based on events that happen in a geographical area near the client's farm."

Production-based insurance programs

Crop Insurance provides coverage for losses in both production and quality on insured crops. When the losses are due to an insurable risk, claims are calculated and paid based on the client's actual production. The list of risks covered includes drought on dryland crops, as well as excessive moisture.

Two separate hay insurance programs provide production coverage for hay crops that are intended for both feed and export. Hay Insurance provides production coverage for hay crops that are intended to be harvested for feed; it does not compensate clients for quality loss. Export Timothy Hay Insurance provides coverage for insured pure timothy hay stands intended for export and adjustments to yields are made when the grade falls below Choice.

Smith says it is extremely important for clients with production-based insurance to contact AFSC prior to putting their insured crops to another use such as silaging, pasturing or plowing down, to ensure insurance coverage is not negatively impacted.

Area-based insurance programs

Smith says AFSC also offers area-based programs where indemnities are calculated based on events that occur in a geographical area near the client's farm.

The area-based programs for annual crops are Silage Greenfeed Lack of Moisture Insurance and Silage Greenfeed Barley Proxy Insur-

ance, and for pasture the programs are Moisture Deficiency Insurance and Satellite Yield Insurance. Details of the insurance coverage under these programs can be found at www.AFSC.ca

Clients can choose in advance to defer a potential payment prior to it being calculated by contacting either their Branch or Central Office. AgriStability

Clients who are enrolled in AgriStability have protection for their whole operation against large

margin declines. The program is funded by both federal and provincial governments and provides assistance when participants experience margin declines greater than 30 per cent.



7. View short "how-to" videos that explain the services on My Business Account


8. Experience telephone service improvements from CRA

This means that people using walkers or wheelchairs, parents pushing strollers and those who have mobility issues will find it much easier to enter the building.

Shauna Paisley Cooper, representing the Rick Hansen Foundation, presented the cheque and reminded Guild members of Rick Hansen's two-year long Man in Motion tour when he wheelchaired his way through 34 countries. Motorists who are travelling through the intersection have the right of way after stopping and proceeding when it's safe to do so. If you are making a left hand turn at the intersection and another motorist is waiting at the other side at the stop sign you are advised to complete your turn and not to stop in the middle of the intersection. By doing this you are incorrectly yielding to another motorist who is at a stop sign and causing unnecessary congestion in the middle of the intersection.

Extra caution is urged with a reminder to motorists to come to a complete stop at the stop signs and proceed when safe to do so only when the intersection is clear.

All Albertans have a role to play in keeping our roads safe. Don't rely solely on right of way travel and always be cognizant of other vehicles on our roadways.









DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

(NC) A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch

1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.

2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.

3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a

stretch in the side of your back. 4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.

2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds.

3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.

4. Hold for 15 seconds.

5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.



OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents of an investment for a new regional on-reserve water line and water infrastructure.

The investment, which is made in partnership with all three levels of government, will connect the Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation to the West Inter Lake District regional water supply system, as well as construct a potable water supply line, pumphouse, and treated water reservoir. The federal government plans to invest approximately \$10 million to support the completion of the project, which is part of a commitment of \$1.8 billion over five years for water and wastewater.

The Alberta government is investing \$7.15 million to complete the Alexis Nakota Sioux water tie-in project connecting the regional water system to the reserve. This project is part of Alberta's \$100 million commitment over four years to ensure Alberta First Nations have access to clean and safe drinking water.

"Everyone should have access to safe running water. I am proud to see investments being made to support one of our local Indigenous communities, promoting the health and wellbeing of the community," concluded MP Eglinski.

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform local farmers that the final list of designated regions for 2016 under the Livestock Tax Deferral Provision has been released from Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada.

"Our area – Parkland County in 2015, for example – has experienced local agricultural disasters in recent years. I have seen the results of drought brought on by weather conditions and the financial toll it can take on our farmers," stated MP Eglinski.

The livestock tax deferral provision allows producers in the designated drought regions who are facing feed shortages, to defer a portion of their sale proceeds of breeding livestock to the next year. The cost of replacing the animals in the next year offsets the deferred income, thereby reducing the tax burden associated with the original sale.

Eligible producers can request the tax deferral when filing their 2016 income tax returns, or if they have already filed, submit an adjustment request directly to the Canada Revenue Agency.

"Both past and present members of our Conservative Caucus are farmers and agricultural producers from all parts of Canada. We understand the importance of farmers and the necessity of tax relief programs, such as this, to protect them when droughts hit," concluded MP Eglinski.

· Because air quality is expected to be variable, this advisory will remain in effect until further notice.

· Residents of, and visitors to, these areas are advised to be aware of air conditions and to take precautions against potential health concerns that can be associated with smoky air.


