Like all of you, I'm thinking a lot this week about the sacrifices of our veterans, and the men and women who continue to serve our country.

It's been said hundreds of

times before, but it bears repeating: we owe the rights and freedoms we enjoy today to the 118,000 Canadians who have been killed in armed conflicts around the world. And there are hundreds of thousands more who have returned from those conflicts bearing the scars of their experiences.

This year, we've marked major anniversaries of several defining moments in our country's military history. We honoured those who fought and died at Vimy Ridge 100 years ago in April.

Mayerthorpe — Local leaders are thanking the Alberta NDP government for increasing safety in the intersection of Highways 22 and 43.

The intersection will see improvements including new traffic

lights, better lighting, improved highway signage and widened turn lanes. These improvements will help to make life better for local residents and travelers on an important Alberta trade corridor. Installation of the new infrastructure is scheduled for the 2018 construction season.

Oneil Carlier, MLA for Whitecourt-Ste. Anne and Minister of Agriculture and Forestry, said the project will certainly improve the safety of motorists who use the intersection.

"I am thrilled to see these safety improvements that have long been sought by motorists who are familiar with this intersection."

on our community, and means so much to the families of the veterans who died and for all the Armed Forces members and veterans living all across this country.



"I'm certain that the new lights and intersection improvements will prevent serious collisions in the future, perhaps saving lives. I'm proud to be part of this government that is working to help all Albertans," he said.

Kate Patrick, Mayor of Mayerthorpe, said the town's current and former councils are to be commended for their advocacy over the past ten years for safety improvements to this intersection.


"On behalf of council I wish to commend the province for acknowledging and investing in this project which enhances the safety of this intersection serving two primary highways. Both of these primary highways intersect at the main entrance to the town, see a large volume of traffic on a daily basis, and will see increased traffic as development occurs over time," said the mayor.

Ross Bohnet, Division 6 Councillor of Lac Ste. Anne County, also welcomes the project.

"As the councillor representing the many rural people who regularly use this intersection I welcome this project and hopefully it will stop the accidents. The intersection at Highway 22/43 has been the scene for many bad accidents over the years and I am glad the province is addressing this issue."

On an average day more than 10,000 vehicles pass through the Highway 22/43 intersection.

Highway 43 forms part of the busy Canamex Trade Corridor linking Alberta to the United States interstate highway system.

They will also reconvene in Ottawa to meet with MPs and present their action

Applications open September 28, 2017 and will close on November 13, 2017.

"I encourage all youth interested in exploring and solving issues pertinent to their own communities to apply to the Canadian Youth Ambassador Program. I think some young people would be surprised how much they can influence change and serve as thoughtful citizens," concluded MP Eglinski.

INDICATORS IT'S TIME TO CHANGE AIR FILTERS

Vehicle maintenance can protect drivers' investments and help their automobiles run efficiently. One area drivers should pay particular attention to is their vehicles' air filters. When operating at optimal capacity, an air filter improves fuel efficiency while ensuring vehicles accelerate

smoothly without taxing the engine. But when air filters are clogged, fuel efficiency is reduced and emissions are increased, a 1-2 punch that costs motorists money and hurts the planet at the same time. Drivers can check their owners' manuals to determine the recommended intervals

to replace air filters, but the following are a handful of indicators that suggest it's time to change them.

• Gas mileage: Unless you just purchased your vehicle, you likely know how many miles you can drive on a full tank of gas. If that gas mileage is suddenly slipping and you find yourself visiting the filling station more frequently, then it might be time to replace your air filter.

• Engine light: Drivers may be alerted to engine issues when the "Check engine" lights up on the vehicle's dashboard. This light may come on to indicate a problem with the air filter, as clogged air filters reduce air flow to the engine, resulting in an imbalanced air-fuel mixture that adversely affects the engine.

• Starting and idling problems: Vehicles sometimes don't start up as smoothly as they once did, and drivers may also notice vehicles are not idling smoothly. These symptoms may indicate misfiring spark plugs that are being polluted (and made less effective) by a dirty air filter that is reducing the flow of air to the engine.

• Acceleration difficulties: Automobiles that are operating at peak capacity accelerate quickly. But dirty, worn out air filters adversely affect acceleration. Drivers who notice that their cars are struggling to accelerate when stoplights turn green or on highways may need to replace their vehicles' air filters.

• Dirty air filter: Perhaps the biggest indicator that an air filter needs to be replaced is the filter itself. If you cannot find the air filter on your own, consult your vehicle owner's manual to determine where it is. Once you find the air filter, examine it in broad daylight. Clean air filters are white, so if the filter has darkened, it may need to be replaced.

STAY SAFE WHEN DRIVING IN WET WEATHER

Drivers must modify their driving habits when weather compromises their visibility and makes road conditions unsafe. Rain can fall any time of year, but tends to be most problematic in spring.

According to the Federal Highway Administration, wet roadways, and rain in particular, are the main cause of weather-related vehicle crashes. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration notes that, between 2004 and 2013, rain caused 573,784 crashes.

To drive safely in the rain and avoid accidents, drivers should follow certain precautions.

- · Maintain windshield wipers. Inspect and, if necessary change windshield wipers regularly to ensure they are working optimally. Always test wipers before driving in rainy weather.
- · Turn on lights with wipers. Reduced visibility is a major contributor to wet-weather accidents. Drivers'

views may be hampered by falling precipitation and glare from wet roadways. Cloudy conditions and fog also compromise visibility. When using windshield wipers, turn on your headlights as well. This makes your vehicle more visible to other motorists and improves your own ability to see the road and pedestrians.

- · Recognize changing road conditions. Roadways accumulate oil and engine fluids that can float in rainwater, creating slippery road surfaces. This is usually a problem during the first few hours of a rainstorm or in areas that receive little precipitation and then are subjected to downpours. These fluids make rain-soaked roads even more slippery. Slow down, leave more room between vehicles and try driving in the tracks left by vehicles ahead.
- Reduce speed. The automotive group AAA says hydroplaning, when the tires rise up on a film of water, can occur with as little as 1/12 inch of wa-

ter on the road. The group goes on to say that tires have to displace a gallon of water per second to keep the rubber meeting the road. Drivers should reduce their speeds to correspond to the amount of water on the roadway. New tires can still lose some contact with the roadway, even at a speed as low as 35 mph. Therefore, reducing speed and avoiding hard braking and turning sharply can help keep the rubber of the tire meeting the road.

· Rely on the defogger. Use the car's windshield defroster/defogger to improve visibility. Turn it on early and keep it on until the rain has stopped and visibility has improved.

Recover from a skid. Skids can be frightening, but when skidding, resist any temptation to slam on the breaks. Instead, continue to look and drive in the direction you want to go and slowly ease up on the accelerator.

· Skip the cruise control. It's important to maintain control over the vehicle in rainy conditions, so avoid

using cruise control.

Maintain tires. Proper inflation and tire tread levels can improve traction. AAA recommends checking tread depth by inserting a quarter upside down into the tire groove. If you can see above Washington's head, start shopping for new tires. Check tire pressure on all tires at least once a month. Get an accurate reading when tires are cold and adjust air pressure accordingly.

Avoid other distractions. Distracted driving can be hazardous during good road conditions and even more dangerous when visibility and other factors are compromised. Switch phones and other devices off so you can fully focus on the road and other drivers.

Rainy weather can contribute to poor driving conditions. Drivers should make changes to speed and other factors to make wet weather driving as safe as possible.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF OCTOBER 23, 2017

This week the House of Commons debated the following:

- Bill C-17 An act to amend the Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Act (Third Reading)
- Bill C-24 An Act to amend the Salaries Act and to make a consequential amendment

to the Financial Administration Act (Report Stage)

- Bill C-46 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (offences relating to conveyances) and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Third Reading)
- Bill C-49 Transportation Modernization Act (Report Stage)

establish the Office of the Federal Ombudsman for Victims of Criminal Acts and to amend certain Acts (Second Reading)

- Bill C-344 An Act to amend the Department of Public Works and Government Services Act (community benefit) (Second Reading)
- Bill S-211 National Sickle Cell Awareness Day Act (Third Reading)
- Bill S-230 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (drug-impaired driving) (Second Reading)
- Motion No. 17 Ways and Means
- NDP Motion Minister of Finance and Conflict of Interest Act

On Tuesday, I participated in debate on Bill C-46, which amends the provisions of the Criminal Code that deal with offences and procedures relating to alcohol and drug-impaired driving.

On Wednesday, I spoke on Bill C-49, which substantially amends 13 different Acts and has consequential impacts on three modes of transportation: air, rail, and water.

On Thursday, I gave a statement to thank local candidates who put their names forward for our municipal elections, as well as congratulate those who were elected to office. Later that day, I participated in debate on Bill C-17, which will make development of natural resources more difficult in the Yukon by slowing down the review process.

Also on Thursday during Adjournment Proceedings, I had the opportunity to raise a question I asked last Friday, calling on the federal government to assist Alberta in our fight against the Mountain Pine Beetle infestation.

You can read my questions and comments in the House on the corresponding day's Hansard on the House Publications page at www.ourcommons.ca/en.

In the Standing Committee on Industry, Science and Technology (INDU), we continued to hear witnesses for a study on Canada's anti-spam laws. For more information on these meetings, visit the INDU Committee website at www.ourcommons.ca/Committees/en/INDU.

This week, I attended 11 meetings and two events, as well as recorded one message. I will be back in the riding for the weekend to attend an event before heading back to Ottawa as the House will continue to sit. Look for my update next Friday on the happenings of Parliament.






