LIQUOR BAG PROGRAM **INVITES STUDENTS TO DESIGN MESSAGES ON IMPAIRED DRIVING**

This holiday season, Alberta's youth are creating impactful and creative messages to remind Albertans on the dangers of drinking and driving. Since 2012, Students Against Drinking and Driving (SADD) Alberta, in partnership with the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC), has coordinated their liquor bag campaign, whereby Alberta students from grade 1 to grade 12 can personalize a message to raise awareness on the impact of impaired driving on a paper liquor bag.

Alberta teachers and community supporters are encouraged to order their free liquor paper bags, which will serve as a blank canvas for students' designs, from now until December 15. The completed bags are then dropped off at local liquor stores by school staff as a visual reminder to customers not to drink and drive this holiday season. Last year, more than 65,000 bags were ordered and distributed to 282 schools.

Students can also enter the Liquor Bag Design Contest through their school, with a chance to win 1 of 10 prizes, ranging in value from \$100-500. The overall winner will also have their design printed on one million bags, which will be distributed to Alberta liquor stores for use beginning the May 2018 long weekend. Students are encouraged to share their bag design on Instagram using the hashtag #SADDbag. 

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform constituents of a funding opportunity for small and medium sized businesses in his riding.

On October 31, 2017, Western

Economic Diversification (WED) announced that it is accepting applications under the Western Innovation (WINN) Initiative.

Created by the previous Conservative Government in 2013, WINN is a program that offers repayable contributions to western Canadian businesses with less than 500 employees, to commercialize and bring to market innovative technology-based products, processes or services. To date, WINN has invested over \$97 million in 85 projects.

Under the current Liberal Government, the program is prioritizing clean technology, clean resources, digital technology, advanced manufacturing, value added agriculture, and health biological sciences.

Repayable contributions cover up to 50% of total eligible costs for each project, to a maximum of \$3.5 million per project.

This was a short week in Parliament. We discussed topics including the Firearms Act, the environment, government finances, and the legalization of marijuana.

The House of Commons debated the following:

• Bill S-236 – Recognition of Charlottetown as the Birthplace of Confederation Act (Referred to Committee)

• Bill C-63 – Budget Implementation Act, 2017, No. 2 (Second Reading)

• Bill C-346 – An Act to amend the Firearms Act (licences) (Defeated at Second Reading)

• Bill C-17 – An Act to amend the Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Act and to make a consequential amendment to another Act (Third Reading)

• Bill C-45 – Cannabis Act (Report Stage)

• Motion No. 124 – Automated external defibrillators

In the Standing Committee on Industry, Science and Technology (INDU), we continued to hear witnesses for a study on Canada's anti-spam laws. We also resumed the consideration of a draft report on intellectual property transfer. OTTAWA: In recognition of October as Women's History Month, MP Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is encouraging organizations to apply for funding to support the economic security of women in the riding.

Status of Women Canada has issued two new calls for proposals that will award funding to organizations for projects that address institutional barriers that limit women's economic security. Projects at the national level can receive up to \$500,000 in funding, and projects at the regional level can receive up to \$350,000 in funding.

The first call for proposals is entitled Support for Women's Economic Security. It will fund projects under two themes:

• Building Partnerships to Address Systemic Barriers - encourages collaboration between organizations to address the systemic barriers that prevent women from attaining economic security. These barriers could include issues such as the accessibility of childcare, the wage gap, and pay inequity. The deadline to apply is November 27, 2017.

• Increasing Private Sector Leadership and Investments in Women urges organizations to partner with




