### MLA ONEIL CARLIER ADDRESSES TRANS MOUNTAIN PIPELINE ISSUE

This past week, the Legislature has been on a break and I have spent my time in the constituency talking to constituents. I've been hearing from you about things that matter to you most such as Health Care, Education, Infrastructure and essential services.

The one issue I am hearing the most about, however, is pipelines. So, I would like to give you an update on that issue.

Premier Rachel Notley has been relentlessly fighting for Alberta, both in public and at the negotiating table, because Albertans deserve the best—and fairest-return on our resources.

With the B.C. government threatening endless delays to Trans-Mountain's construction, I and our entire caucus proudly passed Bill 12 in the Legislature, which gives us the power we need to restrict the export of natural gas, crude oil and refined fuels. The Premier is now fully prepared to turn off the taps of resources flowing to B.C., if the path to building that pipe is not cleared immediately.

It is critical to get the Kinder Morgan pipeline built. Our province and our communities need the revenue that will be generated by the pipeline to support such things as hospitals, seniors facilities, low income housing projects, repaving of highways including Highways 22, 37 and 43 as well as Community Facility Enhancement Program and Community Initiative Program grants to name a few.

That's why the only outcome we'll accept is that the Trans-Mountain Pipeline expansion gets built. End of story.

Meanwhile, UCP leader Jason Kenney is not helping. He's talking Alberta's chances down instead of backing our efforts. He can't keep his story straight, first agreeing we could invest in the pipeline, then saying funding it is wrong.

## FIRE BAN FOR LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY

The Fire Hazard Rating for Lac Ste. Anne County is EX-TREME. As a result, the Fire Advisory has been upgraded to a COMPLETE FIRE BAN, effective as of May 24, 2018, until further notice.

No new Fire Permits will be issued, and all existing Fire Permits are hereby cancelled.

This Fire Ban affects all burning, including cooking / warm-

ing fires (backyard fire pits and campground fire pits), brush pile fires, slash pile fires AND the use of burn barrels. This Fire Ban also includes backwoods or random camping areas, charcoal briquettes, deep fryers (e.g. turkey fryers), tiki torches and wood fires in outdoor recreation facilities such as group campsites, gazebos, tee pees, and wood burning stoves inside tent-like structures. Additionally, Fireworks discharge permits will not be issued at this time.

### MAJOR CRIMES NORTH LAY CHARGES IN FATAL PEDESTRIAN HIT & RUN

Thorsby, Alberta – The RCMP Major Crimes Unit have made an arrest and laid charges against 27-year-old Mitchell Robert Sydlowski of Spruce Grove in the death of Ki Yun Jo.

On October 6, 2017 a hit and run occurred at the Fas Gas service station resulting in the death of 54-year-old Ki Yun Jo. A stolen white cube van was seen to flee the Fas Gas after not paying for gas. The owner of the service station, Ki Yun Jo, made efforts to stop the van and was fatally injured when he was struck by the van.

The RCMP Major Crimes Unit

(North) took carriage of this investigation and have been diligently investigating, including following up on all possible leads. This incident was witnessed by several people and impacted the community. On May 25, Sydlowski was arrested by the RCMP at the Edmonton Remand Centre. He has been charged with: Second degree murder, fail to remain at the scene of an accident causing death, possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000 and theft under \$5,000. A bail hearing was held on May 26 and the matter has been set over to Tuesday, May 29 at the Provincial court in Wetaskiwin.

"An investigation into a homicide remains active until it's solved" says Sergeant Bryce Long of the RCMP Major Crimes Unit. "Our team has worked hard on this investigation, and seeing these charges laid brings a great sense of closure not only to the Major Crimes Unit, but to the community at large and particularly the family of Ki Yun Jo."



## PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF MAY 21, 2018

This week, we covered many topics including sustainable development, electoral reform, rural crime, and net neutrality. We will now be sitting until midnight every evening (except Fridays) as the House will only sit for four more weeks before the summer break.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-47 An Act to amend the Export and Import Permits Act and the Criminal Code (amendments permitting the accession to the Arms Trade Treaty and other amendments) (Report Stage)
- Bill C-57 An Act to amend the Federal Sustainable Development Act (Report Stage)
- Bill C-75 An Act to amend the Criminal Code, the Youth Criminal Justice Act and other Acts and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Second Reading)
- Bill C-76 Elections Modernization Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-330 An Act to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (landlord consent) (Second Reading)
- Motion No. 167 Rural Crime in Canada
- Motion No. 168 Net neutrality
- Committee of the Whole Department of Finance Main Estimates, 2018-19
- Committee of the Whole Department of Citizenship and Immigration - Main Estimates, 2018-19
- Government Business No. 22 Extension of sitting hours and conduct of extended proceedings

On Thursday, I participated in debate on Bill C-57, which was originally passed by our previous Conservative Government and aims to make decision-mak-

ing related to sustainable development more transparent, more certain and subject to greater accountability. I stated:

"I will stand in this House all day long and wave the fact that I think Canada—the provinces of B.C., Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba, and even a little has been done in Ontario and Quebec—has the greatest, strongest environmental standards in the world, and we produce the cleanest energy, regardless of what it is, whether it is coal, oil,

or gas."

In the Standing Committee on Canadian Heritage (CHPC), we continued our study on gender parity on the boards and in the senior leadership of Canadian artistic and cultural organizations. We also began our review of the Copyright Act, as well as began consideration of a draft report on

Council has awarded the 2018 Street Improvement Program to Knelsen Rock Products Ltd. The Program includes rehabilitation of roadways and the paved trail network, utility cut restoration work, and the Driveway Replacement Program. Information on the construction schedule and locations will be posted online at www.

whitecourt.ca and on Whitecourt's Facebook page as details are confirmed.

Recent ice jams along the Athabasca River have caused damage to tree revetments that were placed along the river bank downstream of the golf course. The revetments, which consisted of logs with roots anchored to the bank, were required to be constructed by the Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans when the river erosion control spurs were constructed. Whitecourt will be working with the Disaster Relief Program to replace the damaged revetments.

The Town of Whitecourt has provided written support to Living Waters

Catholic Schools Division No. 42 on its plan to build a new elementary school in Whitecourt. The project, which is the Division's number one priority, is currently identified on the Alberta government's Unfunded Capital Plan.

The Town of Whitecourt has joined municipalities from across the province in support of the Trans Mountain Pipeline Expansion Project. The Alberta Urban Municipalities Association, which represents urban cities, towns, villages and specialized municipalities across the province, has submitted a letter to Prime Minister Justin Trudeau copying the Premiers of B.C. and Alberta, and the federal minister of Natural Resources Canada. The letter voices support of the pipeline project, and urges government effort to bring the project to fruition.

A number of events will be held in the coming weeks that have been approved for street closures:

- West Coast Amusements Carnival - Tuesday, June 5: A portion of 52 Avenue from 49 Street to 50 Street will be closed all day.
- Run 4 Fun Saturday, June 9: A portion of Sunset Boulevard will be closed from 7:45 to 11:45 a.m.
- Freedom of the City Parade Saturday, June 9: A parade will close portions of 49 Street, 52 Avenue and 51 Street in the downtown area from 11:00 to 11:45 a.m.

Further information will be posted on social media closer to the event dates to remind motorists of the closures. All closures will impact Whitecourt Public Transit service, and information will be provided to riders regarding re-routing on those days.

DD Contracting and Construction Ltd. has completed the concrete crushing contract for 2018. Over 13,100 tonnes of waste concrete and asphalt are now ready to be reused in 2018 Street Improvement Projects including pathway extension, paving base preparation, and future street, trail, and parking lot upgrades.

Dynamic Group has been awarded the contract to provide concession services at Rotary Park for the next two years. Concession services will be operated out of the new building located adjacent to the playground in Rotary Park, and will open for service on June 15.

Whitecourt Town Council encourages the citizens of Whitecourt to recognize June 3 to 9, 2018 as Seniors' Week. Seniors' Week honours and celebrates seniors for their many contributions to our community and province. ## SELECT THE RIGHT FERTILIZER FOR YOUR NEEDS

For plants to truly flourish, the right growing conditions and soil that offers the right nutrients is of paramount importance. Fertilizer enhances soil so that plants and flowers can thrive. However, fertilizer is not a one-size-fits-all mix.

Choosing fertilizer can be a little overwhelming thanks to the variety of formulations available at neighborhood lawn and garden centers. Shelves contain all-purpose products, such as those billed as vegetable fertilizer, and even formulations geared toward specific flower varieties. Others may feature buzz words like "all-natural" or "organic," and consumers may not be sure just what they need to keep

plants healthy. The following guidelines can help any wouldbe gardener or landscaper grow more vibrant plants.

Start with a soil test

It's difficult to determine what plants need without an accurate picture of what's going on in the ground. A soil test can paint a picture of what's going on and indicate if any nutrients are lacking. A common misconception is that gardeners fertilize plants. But fertilizer amends the soil that feeds plants, according to the soil-testing lab professionals at Virginia Tech. Soil types vary by region, and conditions may even vary between spots on a landscape. Testing where the plants will be placed can yield

the most accurate results. Soil tests are available at gardening centers and online. Otherwise, landscaping professionals can conduct tests.

Know the N-P-K ratio

Most fertilizers will come with information concerning the nutrients within. Most notably it will have a breakdown of how much nitrogen (N), phosphorous (P) and potassium (K) is in the mix. Judging by the soil test, gardeners can choose a product that will give them the right ratio to amend the soil for the type of plant they are hoping to grow. Complete fertilizers often have NPK in the formulation. Incomplete fertilizers may have only one or two nutrients. This allows

a person to customize fertilizer even more without overdoing it with a particular nutrient.

Grow plant knowledge

A cursory knowledge of the plants being planted in the garden also can be helpful. Gardeners must recognize that some plants will not tolerate excess amounts of a particular fertilizer component, while some may need more. Checking books out of the library, seeking information online and consulting with landscaping experts will help expand homeowners' knowledge about plant types and the needs of each particular plant they hope to grow.

Solid and liquid fertilizer Fertilizers are generally sold in

### RECOGNIZING AND ADDRESSING LEAF SPOT

Homeowners who take pride in their properties may be alarmed to notice seemingly spotted leaves on their trees. Such spots may be indicative of a condition known as leaf spot.

In spite of its appearance, leaf spot is often harmless. According to the Missouri Botanical Garden, leaf spot is a term used to describe a number of diseases that can affect the foliage of ornamentals and shade trees. Often caused by fungi that can spread thanks to wind and/or spring rains, leaf spot also may be a byproduct of bacteria. As unsightly as leaf spot can be, the Missouri Botanical Garden advises that established plants will only be adversely affected by leaf spot if defoliation occurs three or more years in a row.

While leaf spot is often harmless, homeowners should still learn to recognize it and document its presence to ensure it does not become a long-term problem.

How to recognize leaf spot

Because leaf spot is an umbrella term that refers to various diseases, its symptoms can vary depending on which type of leaf spot is affecting a tree.

- Spots: The spots of leaf spot vary in size and color depending on the plant, the organism that's affecting it and the stage of development. Spots are typically brown, but can be tan or black as well.
- Margins: Another sign of leaf spot is the presence of concentric rings or dark margins on the leaves around the infected areas.
- Black dots: If fungus is the cause of the leaf spot, the fungal bodies may appear as black dots in the spots. These dots may be within the rings or in central clusters
- Yellow leaves: Some leaves that are infected with leaf spot

turn yellow and drop prematurely.

If leaf spots are not noticed immediately, they may gradually combine to form large blotches.

How to address leaf spot

Leaf spot does not necessarily need to be addressed. As the Missouri Botanical Garden notes, many trees tolerate leaf spot and suffer little to no damage. In addition, the University of Minnesota Extension notes that the majority of leaf spot diseases affect only a small percentage of infected trees' overall leaf area and are only minimal stressors on the trees.

But homeowners who want to address leaf spot can take certain steps to do so.

• Remove infected leaves. As infected leaves fall, homeowners can remove them so the spores that caused the initial infection

cannot be blown onto healthy leaves and spread the disease.

- Remove dead twigs. Removing dead twigs also can help get rid of spores that can contribute to infection.
- Change watering techniques. When watering trees, homeowners who want to prevent leaf spot or stop it from spreading can avoid overhead watering, instead using soaker hoses. Watering early in the day also can give foliage ample time to dry off before nightfall.
- Prune plants. Pruning plants promotes healthy air circulation and reduces crowding, which can help keep foliage dry, making trees less vulnerable to leaf spot.

As unsightly as it can appear, leaf spot is often harmless. But homeowners can take steps to prevent it and stop it from spreading to healthy leaves.

## **Select The Right Fertilizer For Your Needs**

pellets, spikes and liquid forms. Pellets or granules are dispersed over large areas and will gradually offer nutrients when the soil is watered. Liquid fertilizer is concentrated and fast-acting. These may be used for container plants or smaller areas. Spikes usually are placed in house-

plants or to feed individual trees or shrubs. Depending on the formulation, fertilizer may need to be reapplied once a month or more. Consult the product packaging for the correct application advice


