# CHARGES LAID IN FATAL PEDESTRIAN HIT & RUN

Thorsby, Alberta – The RCMP Major Crimes Unit have made an arrest and laid charges against 27-year-old Mitchell Robert Sydlowski of Spruce Grove in the death of Ki Yun Jo.

On October 6, 2017 a hit and


run occurred at the Fas Gas service station resulting in the death of 54-year-old Ki Yun Jo. A stolen white cube van was seen to flee the Fas Gas after not paying for gas. The owner of the service station, Ki Yun Jo, made efforts to stop the van and was fatally injured when he was struck by the van.

The RCMP Major Crimes Unit (North) took carriage of

this investigation and have been diligently investigating, including following up on all possible leads. This incident was witnessed by several people and impacted the community. On May 25, Sydlowski was arrested by the RCMP at the Edmonton Remand Centre. He has been charged with: Second degree murder, fail to remain at the scene of an accident causing death, possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000 and theft under \$5,000. A bail hearing was held on May 26 and the matter has been set over to Tuesday, May 29 at the Provincial court in Wetaskiwin.

"An investigation into a homicide remains active until it's solved" says Sergeant Bryce Long of the RCMP Major Crimes Unit. "Our team has worked hard on this investigation, and seeing these charges laid brings a great sense of closure not only to the Major Crimes Unit, but to the community at large and particularly the family of Ki Yun Jo."

# WANTED MAN ARRESTED

UPDATE #1

Leduc, Alberta – Following a brief foot chase involving Leduc RCMP officers, Justin Allen Robb was arrested in Leduc on June 6. Thorsby RCMP have executed the arrest warrant and are no long seeking public assistance in locating him.

Shortly after 5:45 p.m., while fleeing on foot from the RCMP, Robb ran across 50 Street into traffic. There was a large volume of traffic and Robb narrowly missed being struck by a civilian vehicle driving north on 50th Street. A police vehicle behind the civilian vehicle was unable to avoid the fleeing Robb and collided with him. Robb was arrested, and transported to an Edmonton hospital with non life-threatening injuries.

Robb remains in the hospital in police custody. A judicial inter-

im release hearing is pending.

BACKGROUND: Thorsby RCMP seek public assistance in locating wanting man

Thorsby, Alberta – Thorsby RCMP are seeking assistance in locating 29-year-old Justin Allen Robb of Leduc County. Robb is wanted on an arrest warrant after he escaped lawful custody on May 29.

On May 29 at 10:40 p.m., Thorsby RCMP conducted a traffic stop and arrested Justin Robb who was found to be breaching a condition of a recognizance. Robb was arrested by the RCMP. Shortly after his arrest, Robb fled on foot on 54 Street in Thorsby. The RCMP have not located him.

He is wanted on an arrest warrant in the first instance and is charged with escape lawful custody and fail to comply with conditions of a recognizance (x2).

# NEW HORIZONS FOR SENIORS - DEADLINE EXTENDED!

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is advising that the Call for Proposals for New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP) has been extended until June 22, 2018. The previous deadline was June 15, 2018.

The NHSP call for proposals is seeking proposals for projects led or inspired by seniors. Eligible organizations can receive up to \$25,000 in project funding. Organizations are invited to apply under

the following three national level priorities for projects that empower seniors to initiate and participate in activities that:

- benefit vulnerable seniors populations,
- focus on diversity of Canada's seniors; and

• will promote volunteerism to increase an organization's capacity.


Starting this year, organizations that have not benefitted from NHSP funding during the last five years can receive up to \$5,000 as part of the new small grants pilot project. These organizations can apply for the small grants up to \$5,000 per project or for the Community-based funding of up to \$25,000 (but not for both). In the context of Small grants Initiative, priority will be given to projects for seniors that meet at least one of the three above priorities.

"Over the years, I have seen many projects under this funding program benefit the seniors in our communities. If you are planning to apply, don't forget you can contact my Ottawa office if you require a support letter," concluded MP Eglinski.



# ATVS: BE AS SAFE AS POSSIBLE

It's Child Safety Week and Alberta Health Services (AHS) is reminding all Albertans to make all-terrain vehicle (ATV) safety a priority this week and every week.

ATVs pose significant risk to all users and particularly children less than 16 years of age, who have not yet developed to the point of having the strength, skills or judgment needed to operate an ATV. Over a one-year period ending April 1, 2017, 78 children were seen in Alberta's two pediatric emergency departments due to ATV-related injuries; 31 required hospital admission and one died.

To protect children less than 16 years of age, parents and caregivers are advised to ensure these children do not drive or ride in an ATV. This includes ATVs marketed as 'child-sized'. Albertans 16 years of age and

older are urged to take the following precautions to ensure their ATV excursions are as safe as possible:

- Get trained: Before you hit the trails, get formal handson training from a recognized/ trained ATV instructor. Don't be shy about refreshing your training seasonally.
- Wear the gear: Always wear a helmet. As of May 15, 2017, CSA-compliant helmets must be worn by OHV users when riding on public land, but a helmet worn every ride can save your life. From 2002 to 2013, 41 per cent of quad-rider deaths in Alberta were due to head injuries. In 80 per cent of these head injury deaths, the quad riders were not wearing a helmet. In addition to a helmet, always wear a jacket, long pants, goggles, boots and gloves.
- Look first: Be sure you're aware of the weather forecast, fire outlook/potential, and any hazards (geographical, animal or

human) or risks that the trail(s) could pose. Ensure your ATV is equipped with an appropriate head lamp.

- Buckle up: Be sure you're fastened in properly and that all gear and equipment (including your ATV restraints) are in proper working condition before you hit the trails.
- Drive sober: Don't drink or do drugs before or while operating an ATV: 55 per cent of those who died in ATV crashes between 2002 and 2013 tested positive for alcohol.
- Seek help: Before you head out on the trail, let others know where you're going and when they should expect you back. This helps your loved ones know when to call for help if you've been gone too long. Take a cellphone or working radio with you, as well as a first aid-kit.



Leduc RCMP are warning the public about an ongoing scam in which people all across the county receive phone calls from individuals impersonating Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA) employees. These people are scammers.

The scammers tell taxpayers they have a warrant for their arrest and in order to not get arrested they have

to pay money or get gift cards and provide them to the scammers. The CRA would never request someone to pay money over the phone or get gift cards.

The scammers have been using spoofing mechanisms showing the Leduc RCMP Detachment contact number of 780-980-7267 in order to convince the victim that they are not scammers.

"The RCMP plays a crucial role

in educating the public about scams, and has a number of programs in place to track fraud, including one run by the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC). " says Constable Bridget Morla of Leduc RCMP. "The CAFC monitors all types of scams, and warns Canadians to be on the lookout for scammers."

# LEDUC COUNTY'S RESPONSE TO COAL COMMUNITY TRANSITION FUND ANNOUNCEMENT

The provincial government announced that Leduc County will receive \$250,000 in funding from the Government of Alberta's Coal Community Transition Fund (CCTF).

The funding announced is appreciated, however, it falls significantly short of what is required to help mitigate the impacts of the govern-

ment's coal policy. In November of 2017, Leduc County submitted an application to the CCTF for \$1.9 million, which was intended to serve as support for the county in the short term as the transition from coal takes place.

Leduc County is working diligently with the federal and provincial governments to secure funding to help diminish the impacts of the shift away from coal-based electricity, which will cost the county approximately \$20 million.

"This recent announcement is disappointing. The Government of Alberta had pledged to support community members and municipalities, like Leduc County, who are adversely affected by the transition away from coal. By not receiving the amount of funding requested, the impacts of the coal phase-out will be felt more deeply by our residents and stakeholders. We will continue to work with both levels of

governments to address the consequences of this transition." - Mayor Tanni Doblanko

Leduc County is home to the Genesee Generating Station, which has a projected end-of-life date of 2029. The Genesee Generating Station directly and indirectly employs an estimated 450 people. Phase out of coal-fired electricity generation is expected to impact 75 households in Leduc County through loss of employment.


