# TWO SUSPECTS ARRESTED ATTEMPTING TO USE STOLEN CREDIT CARDS

Spruce Grove, Alberta – On June 25, 2018 at 1:17 P.M. Spruce Grove RCMP responded to a complaint that a male and female were trying to use stolen credit cards at the local Reddi-Mart. As the RCMP member attempted to detain both suspects, the male pushed the female suspect at the officer. Both suspects fought the officer in an attempt to resist arrest. While the RCMP member was controlling the male suspect, the

female suspect ran to the back of the store attempting to escape. The female suspect climbed a ladder in the back room into the ceiling panels to try and evade police. As other RCMP members arrived on scene, the female suspect fell through the ceiling, landing on some shelving in the store. She was taken into RCMP custody with no further incident.

The business owner provided valuable assistance to the responding RCMP member which was instrumental in helping with the apprehension of both suspects. Fortunately nobody in-

volved received any significant injuries.

The male was identified as 28 year old Richard PARISEAU from Edmonton, Alberta. He was charged with 11 counts including:

- Possession of stolen property Under \$5000
- Using a stolen credit card
- Resist arrest from the police
- Resist arrest from someone aiding the police (store owner)
- Assault Police Officer
- Attempting to disarm a police officer

Proposed Bylaw 2018-13 Parkland County and Brazeau County Intermunicipal Development Plan

An Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) is a statutory document prepared with two (or more) municipalities that share a common border, and where at least one member is not a part of a growth management region. An IDP ensures future development and land use policy are coordinated between municipalities. Parkland County and Brazeau County, under the direction of Section 631 of the Modernized Municipal Government Act, have agreed to jointly engage in an IDP. This plan has been developed to reduce the possibility of any potential conflicts between Counties and to ensure the relationship remains strong, transparent and collaborative in the future.

#### Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. Written submissions or presentations may either be submitted to Planning & Development by 4:00 P.M. on July 3, 2018, or submitted at the commencement of the Public Hearing.

Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation to Council must notify Planning & Development Services by 4:00 P.M., on July 3, 2018. Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of 10 minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaw as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.



# Trans Mountain Expansion Project Notice of Activity around Yellowhead - Alberta July 2018 - March 2019\*

Trans Mountain is preparing for construction activities in the Yellowhead region of Alberta this summer as part of the Trans Mountain Expansion Project (TMEP). Construction will commence in a series of phased activities along the pipeline right-of-way through Spruce Grove, Stony Plain, Parkland County, Wabamun, Yellowhead County, Edson and Hinton from the end of July 2018 to the end of March 2019\* to prepare the right-of-way for pipe installation (see map).

#### Preparing a Right-of-Way

There are a number of steps involved in preparing the right-of-way for the arrival of construction crews and equipment. Crews will be working from 12 km west of Edson towards Hinton during phase 1 (late July to late December 2018) and in areas from Acheson west to 15 km west of Hinton during phase 2 (November 1 to March 2019) to complete the following activities:

- · Alberta First Call, locating and marking of all buried facilities
- Surveying
- Flagging and staking the right-of-way and any temporary workspace required for construction
- · Installation of signage
- Implementation of environmental mitigation measures outlined in environmental protection plans (EPPs). For instance, Environmental Inspectors (EIs) will be on site to monitor and enforce a wide range of mitigation measures and techniques, such as:
  - General and site specific wildlife mitigation measures (e.g. salvages, fencing, sweeps and surveys, where necessary)
  - Mitigation procedures for vegetation, weed, riparian and wetland areas (e.g. relocation of rare plants or weed control measures)
  - Soil, heritage resources and other discoveries may be made by crews in the field and referred to specialists for handling
- Clear trees and vegetation from pre-approved areas essential for construction
- Burn unsalvageable timber, like branches, tree limbs or shrubs left behind from clearing

#### Stockpile Sites and Construction Yards

In late 2017 and early 2018, Trans Mountain began preparing and activating three sites in Alberta to support construction related activity at North Gate Stockpile Site (site 1 - see map), Stony Plain IR No. 135 Stockpile Site (site 2 - see map)

and Edson Stockpile Site (site 4 - see map), Construction Office and Yard. These sites are being used for:

- Delivery and storage of construction materials and equipment, including stockpilling and staging of pipe
- Installation of temporary office buildings or trailers to support construction crews building the pipeline and associated facilities
- · Transportation of materials and equipment to and from the site

In the coming months, crews will also prepare the Acheson Construction Office and Yard in Enoch for use in the near future (site 3 - see map). Site preparation at this location will include laydown of gravel and installation of safety fencing.

#### Hours of Work

Work will be restricted to daylight hours and activities will mainly take place between 5 am and 7 pm Monday to Friday, and from 6 am to 5 pm on Saturday. No work is planned on Sunday and statutory holidays.

#### What You May Notice

During the course of these activities, the public may notice:

- Increased activity and intermittent construction-type noise in proximity to the work site
- · Odours related to clearing activities (burning activity)
- Intermittent, temporary traffic delays in order to move equipment in and out of the work sites
- Signage in locations where Project activities will take place near recreation areas

Measures are in place to minimize impacts of these activities to the public and the environment. We will comply with applicable municipal bylaws and will work as quickly as possible to complete this work with minimal disruption. Trans Mountain has comprehensive safety and emergency response plans to make sure we're protecting the public, the environment and our employees.

The public's patience is appreciated as we work to minimize any disruptions or inconvenience associated with Project activities. ### **GRAIN FARMERS NEED TO BE** PREPARED FOR AUGUST 1 WHEAT RECLASSIFICATION

Saskatoon (June 4, 2018) – The Saskatchewan Wheat Development Commission (Sask Wheat), the Alberta Wheat Commission (AWC) and the Manitoba Wheat and Barley Growers Association (MWBGA) are asking Prairie grain farmers to be prepared for

the upcoming reclassification of 29 wheat varieties.

On August 1, 2018, 25 varieties of wheat currently classified as Canada Western Red Spring (CWRS) and four varieties currently classified as Canada Prairie Spring Red (CPSR) will be reclassified into the Canada Northern Hard Red (CNHR) class.

"We want farmers to have a plan to market any remaining wheat that is transitioning to a new class on August 1," says Sask Wheat Chair Laura Reiter. "It is important farmers know what they have in their bins and that they communicate with their local elevator or buyers soon to make sure they are able to maximize the return on these varieties."

In February 2015, the Canadian Grain Commission (CGC) announced the Canadian wheat class modernization process. The process was undertaken to

maintain the quality, enhance the consistency and support the marketability of Canadian wheat. In December 2015, the CGC announced the creation of the CNHR and Canada Western Special Purpose wheat classes.

Many producers have been preparing over the last two years by transitioning to varieties not designated for reclassification. However, according to the CGC's 2017 Grain Varieties by Acreage Insured Report, 491,108 acres of wheat varieties which are designated for the CNHR class on August 1, including Harvest, Lillian and Unity, were still grown in Western Canada in 2017.

"The CGC is not allowing any grace period for producers after the July 31st deadline," said Kevin Bender, AWC Chair. "We therefore think it's important that farmers negotiate the best possible terms for the varieties being reclassified and be aware that grain companies will have until December 31, 2018 to ship any remaining stocks from the system as CWRS and CPSR."

Producers who have a contracted delivery date after August 1 for a transitioning variety should contact their elevator or grain buyer as soon as possible to ensure their grain will be accepted as CWRS or CPSR. Wheat varieties classified as CNHR are expected to sell at a discount to the CWRS and CPSR classes.

"The MWBGA is happy to partner with our fellow wheat organizations in communicating to Western Canadian producers the importance of making a transition plan," says Fred Greig, MWBGA Chair. "Maintaining the quality of the CWRS class is important to Canada's reputation and will benefit farmers. While the reclassified varieties are still registered and can be grown, we strongly recommend that farmers arrange their marketing options for these varieties prior to future plantings."

Grande Yellowhead Public School Division (GYPSD) is going digital! Registration will now be online only for the 2018-2019 school year. Paper registration forms will not be accepted for the 2018-19 school year. Please contact your local school if you have any questions.

What does this mean for our families?

ALL parents/guardians MUST select from the following options to begin registering your student for a school with Grande Yellow-head Public School Division for the upcoming school year. Parents/guardians can simply click on the Online School Registration button under the FOR PARENTS section of their school's website and follow the instructions.

There are two online forms for the 2018-2019 school year. Parents will complete either a 'New Student Form' or 'Returning Student Form' via the online registration software.

A New Student is one who has not attended a Grande Yellowhead Public School Division school in the previous school year, as well as our new kindergarten students entering school for the first time. Please note that registration for new students is now open.

A Returning Student is one who has attended a Grande Yellowhead Public School Division school in the previous year(e.g. students entering Grades 1-12). Parents/ guardians of returning GYPSD students will receive a verification code via email in early to mid-August with a link to complete their returning student registration form. Return-

ing students must have their parent/guardian verify or amend their child's information that is currently on file at their school. Please note that registration for returning students will be live as of August 2018.

NEW: INELIGIBLE BUSING CHANGES (APPLIES TO ALL ZONES EXCEPT JASPER)

As a reminder to all parents, school bus registration will open on Tuesday, July 3, 2018.

# FUNDING AGREEMENT TARGETS ALBERTA JOBS AND TRAINING

OTTAWA – Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is informing residents that Employment and Social Development Canada has announced funding agreements aimed to give Albertans better access to jobs and training.

The governments of Canada and Alberta have signed agreements

that will see the federal government provide the province with over \$1.7 billion over six years.

It is expected that these agreements will increase the jobs and skills training available to people in Alberta, including apprenticeship training, self-employment training, academic upgrading, English as a second language, and more.

The agreements are the new Workforce Development Agreement (WDA) and the Labour Market Development Agreement (LMDA). In the first two years, Alberta will receive approximately \$490 million—more than \$182 million through the WDA and nearly \$308 million through the LMDA.

The agreements also include a commitment to performance measurement. That means that Canada and Alberta will be able to measure how programs are increasing people's earnings, helping them

get jobs that last, and breaking down barriers for under represented groups like Indigenous people, people with disabilities and women. The Government of Canada will be reporting to Canadians on the impacts of these programs, so that they are transparent and so that they can be continually improved.

The WDA will help Alberta deliver training and services, such as:

- The Canada-Alberta Job Grant, which allows new and existing employees to increase their knowledge and skills through training jointly funded by employers and government.
- Disability related employment supports, including funding for technologies like specialized computer software, tutors, and worksite modifications such as wheelchair ramps.
  - Academic upgrading.
- English as a Second Language training.
- Indigenous skills training programs, including the Aboriginal Training to Employment Program and First Nations Training to Employment Program.

Funding under the LMDA will support measures such as:

- Support for apprentices and jobs in construction.
- Transition to Employment Services, such as the Shuttle Program at Higher Landing, which gives unemployed Albertans individualized services in career management and job search skills to help them return to work as soon as possible.
- Women Building Futures, which provides exposure and training in non-traditional career options in the construction trades to women.

"The people of Alberta have worked hard for generations, and the entire nation has benefitted from Alberta's economic strength. I am pleased to see investments being made into Alberta jobs, but we need the federal government to do more to protect local jobs against the threat of American protectionism and tariffs," concluded MP Eglinski.

# YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

June 26, 2018

Country Residential Redistrict Public Hearing – A public hearing was held regarding a request from a land owner to redistrict Plan 022 4386, Block 1. Lot 2 from Rural District to Country Residential District. The landowner aims to accommodate an additional subdivision. No public opinions were voiced during this hearing.

Mountain Street Road Closure Public Hearing – A public hearing was held for the road closure of part of Mountain Street, Plan 1939RS (within the SE 15 and NE 10 50-27-W5M). The landowner aims to consolidate the closed road with Lot B, Plan 1939RS. No public opinions were voiced during this hearing.

Recreational Use Redistrict Public Hearing – A public hearing was held regarding Lot 1, Plan 972-3697 (NE 23-54-10-W5M) to be changed from Rural District to Recreational Use District. The landowner aims to develop an equestrian/camping facility. A number of the landowner's neighbours presented their views in opposition to the development.

RCMP Presentation – Staff Sergeant Chris Murphy (RCMP Hinton Detachment) gave a presentation to council regarding the RCMP's future priorities, which will include crime reduction, dealing with habitual/prolific offenders on a personal basis, and community relations and visibility. Staff Sergeant Murphy also shared that statistically, property crimes continue to be the greatest issue in the county.

Edson and District Recreation Complex – Council discussed the Edson and District Recreation Complex, noting that a decision to demolish the complex would be premature. Council moved to obtain more details from the town of Edson, or to get an independent assessment of the facility to see the true costs to repurpose the facility for the golf club and other user groups such as the theatre or other service clubs.

Fire Services Underground Water Tank Installation – Council approved the tender from Grayson Excavating to install three water tanks for fire services at a cost of \$216,392.50.

Bylaw 14.18 First Reading – Council gave first reading to Bylaw 14.18, to amend Land Use Bylaw 16.13 from Rural District and Forestry District to Landfill Composting District.

The next Council Meetings is on July 24, 2018. The next Governance & Priorities Committee Meeting is on July 17, 2018. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.






