NEW VETERAN'S SERVICE CARD

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform local residents that the Department of National Defence has announced that new Veteran's Service Cards will be distributed to former and releasing Canadian Armed Forces members who completed basic training and have been honourably released.

The new cards will provide a tangible symbol of recognition for former members, encourage an enduring affiliation with the Canadian Armed Forces and ensure linkages to Veterans Affairs Canada support programs as military members transition to post-service life.

The cards are a response to a call for action by Canadian Armed Forces members, Veterans, and the Vet-

erans Ombudsman's 2012 report.

The 2015 Conservative election platform promised to issue a similar card to reduce red tape for those seeking Veteran services and make it easier for them to receive benefits. However, the Conservatives would have gone a step further to make the card official government identification.

"We thank the government for implementing our 2015 campaign commitment, but Vets wanted this to be official government ID - it is not. Let's make that happen!" tweeted MP Phil McColeman, the Conservative Shadow Minister for Veterans Affairs.

The new Veteran's Service Card will be distributed in stages beginning in September 2018. The first stage includes all newly releasing Canadian Armed Forces members.

Interested Veterans who released

from the Canadian Armed Forces between February 2016 and September, 2018 can apply for the card during stage two beginning in December 2018.

The third stage will begin Summer 2019, and will see cards produced and issued upon request, to all eligible Veterans released prior to February 2016.

"Canada and its Veterans share a social covenant and the federal government should be committed to providing them the best possible services and benefits. I am pleased to see this development and look forward to working towards official government I.D. for our Veterans," concluded MP Eglinski.

WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Vitalization Grants, totaling \$40,000, have been allocated to four local projects. The Program was established to assist property owners in the downtown core and along the Highway 43 corridor to upgrade the façade of buildings to meet the stone and wood theme of the Whitecourt Vitalization Plan. To date, the Vitalization Grant Program has provided over \$110,000 to 18 business in our community. The improvements made by these businesses have been valued at close to \$850,000, and have made a significant impact on the aesthetics and appeal of our community. Each of the following grant recipients received \$10,000 as part of the 2018 program:

- 1272809 Alberta Ltd. (Starbucks);
- TimCourt Enterprises Ltd. (Tim Hortons);
- 5 Star Restaurant Group (Mr. Mike's);
- Friends of Whitecourt Society (Repeat Boutique).

Council has provided final reading to Road Closure Bylaw 1538. The closure is part of a lot consolidation requested by the Friends of Whitecourt Society.

The Town of Whitecourt will be revamping the Spring Clean Up Campaign for 2019. The municipality has been offering the service for over 18 years, and participation in the campaign has grown along with our community. In 2018, 928 staff hours and 556.5 equipment hours were required to collect, transport and sort 152.6 tonnes (174 truck-loads) of waste, including:

- 101.75 tonnes of garbage,
- 45.19 tonnes of metal,
- 5.67 tonnes of wood.

While the campaign's main objective is to assist with keeping our community and properties tidy, enhancements to the program are required to ensure it remains efficient and cost-effective. Council has directed Administration to prepare options for review during 2019 budget deliberations that will allow the program to continue while addressing capacity concerns.

Council has approved new rental rates for the Scott Safety Centre and sportfields. A review of fees is conducted every two years, and

the Community Services Advisory Board recommended that a 4% increase be approved to ensure rates are equitable. New rates for local facilities, which came into effect September 10, are still below the average fee of comparable communities.

September 22 to 30 is National Coaches Week and Whitecourt will be honouring local coaches throughout the week. Community members are asked to nominate their favourite coach and let us know why they are so great by messaging Whitecourt through the official @TownofWhitecourt Facebook page. The deadline for submissions is Friday,

September 21, and those nominated will be entered into a prize draw.

2018 Small Business Week, which is scheduled from October 14 to 20, pays tribute to the contributions that small and medium-sized businesses make to the Canadian economy. The Small Business Awards Gala is scheduled for October 12, and a number of other events and activities are planned in Whitecourt October 16 to 18. For more information, visit www.whitecourt.ca.

The movie, in which she played a country singer who leaves home in search of a big break in Nashville, proved to be prophetic. Shortly after filming wrapped, and on the strength of her very first Nashville showcase, Lisa was

signed to Capitol Records.

Lisa has had a string of hits including "Give Me a Ring Sometime", "Take That", "How Do I Let Go", "Better off Broken". "Let it Burn", and "Love Me If You Can". She has earned multiple CCMA Awards, including two for Independent Song of the Year, and three for Independent Female Artist of the Year. To date she has released nine albums and her songs have been recorded by Reba McEntire, Terri Clark, and Pam Tillis.

Lisa's first tribute show, *The Patsy Cline Project*, sold out two performances and was a huge hit at Horizon Stage in 2016 and staff and fans are happy to welcome her back! 

CARING FOR KITCHEN COUNTERTOPS

Kitchen remodels are a popular home improvement project that help homeowners recoup large percentages of their initial investments at resale. A kitchen remodel can invigorate a home and make the most popular room in the house more functional.

According to HomeAdvisor, a home-improvement informational guide, homeowners spend an average of \$22,000 on kitchen remodels. However, lavish projects can cost more than \$50,000. Protecting such investments is important and requires that homeowners understand how to properly maintain kitchen features so they have the longest life possible. This includes the new countertops that make the kitchen look complete.

Countertops come in various materials, not all of which should be treated the same way. Quartz, granite, marble, laminate, and tile countertops require different types of maintenance.

Quartz - Engineered quartz countertops are popular. Quartz countertops are nearly maintenance-free and resistant to stains, scratches and even heat. Quartz will not need to be sealed like natural stone and can be cleaned using just a damp cloth with a mild, nonabrasive soap.

Granite - Polished or honed granite countertops offer a high-end look that adds instant value to a kitchen. Natural variations in granite give each kitchen a custom look. To keep granite countertops clean, avoid abrasive cleansers that can scratch, and opt for warm, soapy water instead. Stains are possible, but can be remedied with a baking soda paste left to sit for a couple of hours, advises Angie's List. Wipe up oils, acids and soda promptly to avoid stains, and follow advised sealing routines.

Marble - Marble is a natural stone that is porous and will need to be resealed periodically. Because marble has high levels of the mineral calcite, it can be reactive when acids come in contact with it, and etch marks may appear. Promptly wipe away tomato juice, lemon juice,

perfume, or toothpaste. Marble is softer than granite and will wear at a faster rate. Avoid scratching and exercise caution when using knives or sharp objects around marble.

Laminate - One of the more budget-friendly materials, laminate countertops can be fabricated to mimic the look of natural stone, wood or even quartz. Laminate is less resistant to damage than other

materials and will need a gentle touch. Formica® says to never use abrasive cleansers, scouring pads or steel wool when cleaning laminate countertops. For tough stains, an all-purpose cleaner should suffice when applied with a nylon-bristled brush. Test any cleanser in a discreet area first.

Tile - Cleaning tile countertops requires getting into crevices along

the grout lines. A toothbrush and a mildew-fighting cleaner or bleach diluted with water is advised. Also, unglazed tiles need to be sealed yearly. Some soap may leave residue, which can be removed with a solution of vinegar and water.

Check with the manufacturer or installer of the countertops to learn more about the ways to clean and maintain new counters.

amount of time. That's fine if working on a part of the home that won't affect daily life, but can prove stressful or problematic if the project is in a room, such as a kitchen or bathroom, that residents of the home use each day. 

PROTECTING PRIVATE DRINKING WATER SOURCES

Many people do not give much thought to their drinking water or where it comes from, only paying mind if the color, taste or pressure is unusual or if warnings are issued in the event of a water main break or flood.

Water for homes and businesses

is often sourced from municipal water sources, but private wells also provide water. According to the U.S. Census Housing Survey 2015, 13 million households in the United States rely on private wells to supply their water. Many of these homes are located in hard-to-reach

or rural areas where municipal water pipes do not travel.

Public water supplies are typically overseen by a governing body, such as the United States Environmental Protection Agency. However, these organizations may not regulate private wells, nor will

they provide recommended criteria or standards for individual wells. As a result, it is up to individuals to make sure their well water is safe for consumption. Private well owners may be surprised to learn that, according to the U.S. Geological Survey, at least 20 percent of private wells contain contaminants, of which 23 percent have levels high enough to be a potential health concern.

Well water is groundwater found in subterranean aquifers. This groundwater comes from rainfall that is absorbed in the soil and slowly seeps downward through the dirt, rock and various underground spaces. Along this path it can pick up contaminants. Common sources of contaminants include farm waste, fertilizers and pesticides, chemical spills, poorly maintained septic systems, and seepage from landfills. Arsenic is also naturally occurring in groundwater, and in some areas the levels are above the EPA threshold for safety.

Unfortunately, many contaminants are undetectable to the eyes, nose and mouth. And unlike public drinking water systems, people with wells typically do not test their water as often as they should. The EPA says that well water should be tested annually for bacteria and nitrates. The environmental medicine experts at Robert Wood Johnson Medical School in New Jersey suggest testing for lead, arsenic, radon, uranium, and other heavy metals every three to five years.

The National Groundwater Association says county health departments can conduct water tests for bacteria and nitrates. Those who want to test for other substances can get a list of state-certified drinking water testing labs. The Well Wise program is administered by the Ontario Ground Water Association and can provide water testing for consumers. This is a good place to start for Canadian residents. FIVE WAYS TO INCREASE HOME FIRE SAFETY

An average of seven Americans die each week as a result of house fires. Most fires occur in residential buildings between the hours of 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when occupants are most likely to be asleep. Your first line of defense is fire preparedness.

Here's five things you can do to increase your chance of survival in a fire:

Install smoke alarms on every story of your home and outside sleeping areas. Be sure to test them monthly, clean them every six months and replace batteries in spring and fall. Having working fire alarms can cut your chance of dying in a fire in half!

Have a fire escape plan for your family and practice it. A small fire can spread rapidly - you may only have minutes or seconds

to escape. When going over the details of your escape plan, check windows and doors to ensure all open easily. Know your local emergency number (911). Never stop to gather belongings or reenter a home after safely outside.

When renovating, consider using fire-rated, noncombustible products. Your choice of insulation, for example, can be vital. Stone wool insulation, like that produced by Roxul, resists temperatures up to approximately 2,150 F. When directly exposed to fire, it will not off-gas, contribute to toxic smoke or promote flames. Fire-resistant building materials can give you extra time to escape when seconds count.

Purchase a multi-use fire ladder for each bedroom in your

home and practice using it. A fire ladder may be your only escape option if flames block critical exits.

Place fire extinguishers on every level of your home, especially in high-risk areas like the kitchen, near fireplaces and in the garage. Use only for small, contained fires that are not spreading rapidly. Know how to operate your extinguisher before an emergency occurs using the PASS method: Pull pin, Aim low, Squeeze lever and Sweep from side to side. The safest option is always to evacuate your home and call for help.




