ARMED ROBBERY – UPDATE

Leduc, Alta – On April 6, 2019 at approximately 10:30 pm, Leduc RCMP with the assistance of RCMP Police Dog Services and Edmonton Police Air 1 responded to an armed robbery of a taxi in Leduc County, Alberta. The taxi driver picked up two males in the area of Walmart South Common in Edmonton and began to drive them to their destination. The taxi driver stopped his vehicle by the weigh scales in Leduc County and one of the males brandished a knife demanding that the taxi driver take them to their destination. The taxi driver was able to exit the vehicle without injury and called 911.

After an Investigation by Leduc RCMP Craig Oliver STRAWBERRY a 35-year-old man from Red Deer has been charged with Robbery.

With the assistance of the Red Deer RCMP STRAWBERRY

was arrested on May 22, 2019 without incident and is awaiting a bail hearing.

ASC FOCUSES ON EMPOWERING SENIORS IN JUNE Nearly 40 per cent of Albertans age 55+ believe they have been approached with a potentially fraudulent investment.

CALGARY - June 6, 2019 - The Alberta Securities Commission (ASC) has launched a month-long senior outreach campaign across Alberta to recognize Seniors Month (June) and World Elder Abuse Day (June 15, 2019). Nearly 40 per cent of Albertans age 55+ believe they have been approached with a potentially fraudulent investment, as identified in an Investor Index Study commissioned by the ASC. The ASC's campaign is focused on empowering seniors to improve their financial literacy, recognize the signs of investment fraud, empower them to make wise investment decisions and encourage all Albertans to be aware of the signs and symptoms of elder financial abuse. In 2018, the ASC conducted an online quiz targeted towards senior Albertans, the results of which

highlighted that over 50 per cent of Albertans 55 years of age and older didn't realize that if they had been a victim of a financial scam, they could be targeted again. This is an example of a "Recovery Room Scam" wherein the original fraudster often sells the victim's information to another scam, who then offers to recover their investment at a price. This may include paying taxes or a service fee, which is simply a fraudulent demand for more money and the victim loses again. It was also found that 61 per cent of respondents would consider an investment opportunity that 'guarantees' a legacy for their family, despite the fact that the promise of a 'guaranteed' return is an indication of a potential fraudulent investment. "Building relationships with seniors' groups is a critical part of our work to help Albertans advance their financial literacy and protect themselves from investment fraud," said Alison Trollope, Director, Communications and Investor Education. "This year, we are continuing to expand our reach, aiming to ensure all Albertans are empowered and have the knowledge to protect their retirement nest egg."

The ASC's 2019 activities aim to connect directly with seniors and their caregivers through a variety of community events, a financial literacy quiz and seniors resources on Checkfirst.ca/seniors, including the Spot and Stop Seniors Investment Fraud fact sheet. Albertans can test their financial and investment knowledge and check if they are on the right track to protecting their financial future through the ASC's fun and interactive quiz called 'How Safe is Your Nest Egg'. The ASC is also a sponsor of the THIRD ACTion Film Festival in Calgary (June 7-9), which is focused on celebrating aging and the

accomplishments of older adults to promote elder empowerment and an age-positive culture shift.

Albertans 55 years of age and older and members of seniors groups are encouraged to visit the ASC's CheckFirst.ca/Seniors website for unbiased investor education information, tools and resources on recognizing and avoiding fraud and how to 'CHECK-PROTECT-IN-VEST' before investing. Albertans without internet access can call (877) 355-4488 to request printed copies of seniors' materials.

The ASC is the regulatory agency responsible for administering the province's securities laws. It is entrusted with fostering a fair and efficient capital market in Alberta and with protecting investors. As a member of the Canadian Securities Administrators, the ASC works to improve, coordinate and harmonize the regulation of Canada's capital markets.

Projects must be completed by March 31, 2020.





CITY OF LEDUC AND LEDUC COUNT **CO-PURCHASE ROADPATCHER**

Municipalities partner to bring innovative road repair technology to the region

Leduc

The City of Leduc and Leduc County have enhanced resources for regional road maintenance by jointly purchasing a self-propelled roadpatcher. The new roadpatcher is an advancement in asphalt repair technology that both municipalities will use to fix potholes, cracking and other road surface damages.

"We are always looking for opportunities to support the Leduc

Submitted by City of region in a way that benefits both the city and county while being fiscally responsible," says City of Leduc Mayor Bob Young. "Through collaboration we are able to bring new technology like the roadpatcher to the region, which strengthens service levels to the benefit of all rate payers." The city and county have partnered on a number of shared-investment for shared-benefit initiatives in the past; however, the roadpatcher marks the first joint purchase of road maintenance

equipment. Both municipalities will share in the ongoing operation and maintenance costs.

"We need to have accessible, safe roads 365 days a year. Leduc County is pleased to work with our partners at the City of Leduc in creating a well kept roadway system in the region that will benefit our residents," says Leduc County Mayor Tanni Doblanko.

The roadpatcher uses a specialized process called spray patching, which combines hot asphalt and crushed aggregate using forced air. The process is more efficient and safer than typical repair methods as it requires only one operator compared to a crew of two or more individuals physically completing repairs. It has a higher production rate, and repairs last the same or longer than other commonly used methods. The city and the county are responsible for maintaining 232 km and 320 km of paved roadway, respectively. The machine will operate on a 10-day cycle between the city and county.



A MESSAGE FROM MLA MARK SMITH: FILIBUSTER

Good Morning,

It is 9:30 am on Thursday June 6 and the Legislature is in the middle of a filibuster on Bill 2: The Open for Business Act and Youth Minimum Wage. The debate on Bill 2 resumed 2nd reading after the Question Period around 3:00 pm on Wednesday, June 5th and is continuing as I write.

In our Parliamentary system of democracy it is said that the Government decides when the Legislature will sit but the Opposition decides when the debate in Legislature will end.

The same holds true when debating a bill. A filibuster occurs when the Opposition uses the rule of the legislature to draw out debate on any particular bill.

In this case the Opposition is placing amendments before the Legislature extending the debate on Bill 2.

Why filibuster?

There is no way the Opposition, no matter how long they string out the debate has the capacity to outvote the government and defeat Bill 2.

Filibusters are often used to try and draw to the attention of Albertans to an issue of political importance to the Opposition and they hope to average Albertans.

It can be used to send a message to the government that there is another point of view the government needs to consider by

drawing out the debate and to slow down the passage of a piece of legislation.

Filibusters can sometimes get a little goofy as members engage in the long time tradition of heckling each other in the Legislative chamber.

During my first filibuster, as a member of the Opposition, I was addressing the legislature in the early morning hours and heard one of the younger members from the government benches yell out something like: "Your looking a little tired there old fellow. Don't you think it's time to go to bed?" To which I replied, "Do you have your parent's permission to be up this late?"

I have been writing this off and on over the last several hours, it is now 11:00 am and if we are still filibustering around 6:00 pm we might very well break the record for the longest filibuster in Alberta Legislative history.

By the time this is printed in the papers this unique part of the parliamentary process will be completed, Bill 2 will have passed second reading and I will hopefully have caught up on some lost sleep.

P.S. The filibuster finally ended Thursday night and yes a record was made as it was the longest filibuster to date in the Alberta Legislature.

On Sunday, I will be returning to Ottawa as Parliament is scheduled to sit for the next two weeks.


