# YOU GOTTA VISIT ONOWAY MUSEUM!

If you're looking for something to do this summer, or if you have relatives or friends visiting, pop in to Onoway Museum. When the new Onoway Elementary School was built, the Old Brick School was salvaged and repurposed as a museum. When you walk into what used to be classrooms, you travel back in time.

Visit Main Street and see some of Onoway's businesses from the last century and the products they sold. In the Farm Room, you are reminded of the days when cows were milked by hand. Then there's the original door from St. Barnabas Hospital – did you know that Onoway once had a hospital? The Country Home showcases basic furniture plus the extras that local residents accumulated as they moved past the "pioneer" era. The School Room is a different world from today's schools. Sit in a double desk (if you are small enough) and pull out a reader – not a single computer or screen in sight!

You must tour the basement

where you'll find amazing typewriters as well as some of the early Mac computers. Look for the telephones and the switchboard as well as the different formats recorded music was played in the home decades ago.

Spend time in the Reading Room and browse local newspapers from 50 years ago as well as magazines of all sorts. (Reminds you of the days when doctors promoted smoking cigarettes and other "healthy" practises.)



## WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

JUNE 25, 2019

The Allan & Jean Millar Centre is converting a squash court into a new boutique fitness studio space. In the short term, the new space will provide a dedicated studio for spin classes, and other high energy, mood dependent classes (including Pound, and STRONG by Zumba) and other small group training. Construction is expected to start this summer, with the studio open for programming in the fall.

The Communities in Bloom Committee recommended that Council pursue the development of a bylaw to ban single use plastic bags in Whitecourt. The recommendation came after months of research, and a public survey to gauge interest. The Communities in Bloom Committee will be promoting the concept to area businesses through the Chamber of Commerce in the coming weeks, and bringing back findings to Council for review.

Administration completed a review of Off-Site Levies, and based on the review rates will be changing as of January 1, 2020. Off-Site Levies are a cost recovery tool that helps municipalities pay for infrastructure projects that allow the community to grow, including roads, and water and sewage treatment, to name a few. Whitecourt received notice from Woodlands County that it is terminating the Tax Revenue Sharing Agreement effective immediately. Whitecourt Administration will be reviewing the impact of the termination of this agreement, and bringing a report back to Council at the July 15, 2019 Regular Council Meeting.

Council has approved an additional street closure from 12:00

p.m. on Friday, July 12 through to 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 14 to accommodate a Show and Shine event as part of the Whitecourt & District Chamber of Commerce's Summerfest Event. The event includes the Wild Rose Amusements Carnival Midway, an outdoor market, food trucks and more.

Councillor Schlosser will serve as Deputy Mayor from July 1 to August 31, 2019.

# GLFER'S GUIDE

## ADJUSTING GOLF SWING GETS EASIER

Golfers rejoice! Those dreaded slices or hooks could become a thing of the distant past thanks to adjustable clubs and drivers. In addition to helping improve accuracy, adjustable clubs also lighten the load in your golf bag.

With a few twists of a wrench or even turning the shaft of the driver itself, golfers can adjust the face angle, loft and lie angle of the driver to hit the ball farther and straighter. Golfers can make small adjustments to create the right loft and improve distance without having to purchase a new club or visit a club fitter.

Many club manufacturers now offer adjustable drivers and other clubs. According to an informal poll on Golf.com, 34 percent of the 2,337 respondents owned an adjustable driver by the end of 2011. The ability to upgrade shafts has also become popular as golfers respond to what the

pros are doing.

Adjustable golf clubs enable golfers to walk out onto the course with one driver and a few different shafts. With a couple of clicks from a wrench, a person can have an entirely new driver. That cuts down on the equipment that needs to be carried and can fine tune a golfer's accuracy. These high-tech clubs are corresponding to changes being made to golf balls. Engineers have reduced the spin on golf balls to help the balls travel farther. To do so, golf experts advise that the ball needs to be hit higher into the air. Adjustable drivers can give players the edge they need to produce the right height and trajectory.


According to data from golf club manufacturer TaylorMade, 70 percent of consumers who use the company's adjustable drivers adjust their club at least once to get the desired shot. Afterward, 10 to 15 percent of adjustable driver users report further adjustments as they become comfortable with the features.

Although golfers can now put adjustments into their own hands, it is still advisable to get a professional fitting regardless of which clubs are chosen. A certified club fitter can help a person sort through the myriad options available and make recommendations based on various factors, including the golf ball used.

Those who are not fans of adjustable drivers say that the adjustment mechanisms add weight to the drivers, which can compromise efficiency. However, that isn't stopping larger numbers of golf fans from taking adjustable drivers for a trial run in an effort to improve their game.




