Whitecourt RCMP Seek Assistance Identifying Robbery Suspects

On February 3rd, 2020 in the early morning, Police received multiple calls for service relating to the theft or attempted theft of vehicles and ATMs in the Whitecourt area. Police first responded to a convenience store where suspects attempted to steal an ATM; however, they were unsuccessful due to security measures.

Sometime later, Police responded to a Robbery at the Eagle River Casino where two suspects drove a vehicle through the doors of the casino and then threatened an employee while stealing an ATM. The suspects removed the ATM and departed but due to business practices the ATM did not have any cash inside.

Police believe these and other occurrences are connected. Surveillance images were obtained and White-

court RCMP are seeking the public's assistance to identify these two suspects and locate the two stolen vehicles. The first vehicle sought is a black 2006 GMC Sierra 3500 that was stolen displaying Alberta licence plate BKY0083, it has an 11-inch lift, 38-inch tires, cracked windshield and light bar installed between the fog lights. The second vehicle is a white 2011 Ford F-350 that was stolen displaying Alberta licence

plate CBZ1880.

The former lead singer of The Boom Chucka Boys, Ryan Langlois' solo career has earned him three Alberta Country Music Award



BARRHEAD RCMP REPORT

February 6 through February 13

A 22 year old Barrhead male is facing several charges after he spit on a police officer on February 12. Members were called to an apartment in Barrhead after EMS requested their assistance with a combative patient. The male was subdued and hand cuffed and was being escorted to the police car when he managed to spit in the face of the member escorting him. The suspect then made death threats against the member. The male spent the night in custody and was released the following morning on a number of conditions.

There were five theft complaints received this week. A power cord was stolen from a business in Barrhead on February 6 or 7. On February 9, a security camera was reported stolen from a residence in Barrhead. On February 9, another catalytic converter was reported stolen from a parked vehicle in Barrhead. Two batteries were reported stolen from machinery parked in the County of Barrhead on February 11. Finally, on February 10, a licence plate was reported stolen from a vehicle. The exact date or place of the theft is unknown but police are looking from Alberta licence BKJ 7656.

January 30 through February 5

Barrhead Detachment re-

ceived six theft complaints this week. An attempted Break and Enter was reported at the Barrhead Golf Club. Thieves apparently tried without success to gain entry and nothing was reported stolen. On January 30 another catalytic converter was reported stolen. A motor home parked in the area of 43A Street was targeted. Welding cable was reported stolen from a truck parked on 50 Avenue on January 31. On February

2 a trailer and two snow machines were stolen from a residence in Barrhead. Also on February 2, a stock trailer was stolen. The trailer was recovered the same day after being abandoned by the thieves. Two shoplifters were reported on February 5. Surveillance video is being reviewed and a suspect vehicle has been identified.

On January 30 a lone male entered the Fort Assiniboine Fas Gas armed with a long gun. The male confronted

staff and a customer and demanded cash. During the confrontation one round was discharged from the firearm. Fortunately nobody was injured and the suspect left with cash and other property. The male left with an accomplice in a light colored Dodge truck which was later located on fire. Police were able to identify one male suspect and he was arrested the following day after a brief pursuit and remains in custody.

Maddison Krebs, a singer-songwriter from Southern Alberta, got her first guitar when she was six so she could put her poetry to music. She won ole Media Management's "On The Spot" competition and signed a publishing and record deal in 2016. She has performed at Big Valley Jamboree, Canadian Music Week, Folk Alliance International, Calgary Stampede and The Bluebird Cafe in Nashville. Her single "Real Real Thing" charted in the Top 40 on Radio Disney Country and her EP,

Bulls-Eye, reached Top 6 on iTunes Country music chart.

Mark Times from Stony Plain is a novelist with a Gibson, plucking stories from the windswept prairies and humming to the slow clack of typewriter keys. His work is the product of raw emotion filtered through a thoughtful process, distilling songs that are just the right amount of head and heart. His self-titled 2017 EP earned him nominations for the Singer/Songwriter and Roots/Folk Recording of the Year at the Edmonton Music Awards, while the track "Saskatchewine" received an honourable men-

tion in the Canadian Songwriting Competition.

Edmonton-based singer-songwriter Martin Kerr built his career as a busker. He has been an independent musician for 10 years and has achieved some incredible things during that time, including selling out the Winspear Centre twice and landing an album in the Canadian Top 10. Often compared to James Taylor, Kerr's powerful voice and intricate songwriting has earned him praise from the likes of Sarah McLachlan and Bruce Cockburn. His song 'You're Amazing' has been the soundtrack to summer festivals where

the audience joins in for the line "I'm not bad myself but you're amazing."

CATER WEDDING MENUS TO GUESTS' DIETARY NEEDS

Gone are the days when wedding reception menus were limited to the one-size-fits-all offerings of meat, chicken or fish. Thanks to modern diets, couples hoping to accommodate guests may need to provide a wide array of food choices.

It is impossible to pinpoint an exact number, as there are no definitive surveys classifying all dietary preferences, but there are believed to be around 7.9 million people in the United States who follow a vegetarian-based diet. Of those people, around one million are strictly vegan, according to data in *The Economist*. In addition, NYU Langone Health says one-third of Americans are

trying to avoid gluten. The Gluten Free Agency, which is a consulting group dedicated to helping advertisers, says some nine million people in Canada are going gluten-free now for medical or personal reasons. Toss in the scores of people with peanut or other allergies and even more caution is needed when designing wedding menus.

Savvy couples who have guests' health and comfort in mind recognize the importance of offering a varied meal plan for wedding-related parties and receptions. The following are some ideas to consider when planning wedding menus.

- Consider a buffet-style ser-

vice. Although couples might like the tradition and flair that a seated/plated meal offers, it creates a much more limited selection of meal options. Buffet-style dinner service often provides couples with multiple choices, and it's much more likely they can come up with a combination that caters to any food allergies or dietary restrictions guests may have.

- Opt for food stations. In lieu of one long buffet table, a modern approach is to have staffed food stations. Foods as well as their ingredients can be clearly stated on food table placards so guests can

make appropriate choices.

- Offer alternatives for dessert. Wedding cake can be a challenge to someone with a gluten sensitivity or an egg or a nut allergy. While not every guest indulges in dessert, make it a point to offer an alternative to cake. Perhaps a groom's cake can be revamped into gluten-free cookie bars or a nut-free trifle.

Couples who know in advance which types of dietary restrictions their guests have can work with caterers to devise a menu that suits everyone.

HOW TO PLAN A WEDDING CEREMONY

Months of planning is par for the course for couples about to tie the knot. Much of that planning concerns the reception, and rightfully so. Receptions last longer than ceremonies, and couples are often involved in every reception detail, from picking the appetizers to serve during cocktail hour to choosing the final song before everyone calls it a night. But it's equally important that couples devote considerable attention to their wedding ceremonies.

A wedding ceremony might not last long, but it is the most crucial component of a couple's wedding day and can even set the tone for the rest of the festivities. From choos-

ing readings to honoring loved ones to immersing oneself in his or her faith, these tips can help couples plan their perfect ceremony.

- Give the ceremony equal footing with the reception. Spend time trying to put a personalized spin on the proceedings, whether that entails writing your own vows or choosing moving music that means something to you. When given ample attention, seemingly minor details can make for a special, memorable ceremony.

- Choose a ceremony location that is close to the reception site. If a ceremony will take place in a house of worship, try to choose a reception

venue close to the ceremony site. This keeps guests, some of whom may be out-of-towners who have already traveled extensively, from spending too much time on the road during the day of the wedding.

- Get to know the officiant. The officiant should be someone with whom you both feel comfortable. This person should know you well enough that he or she can preside over the ceremony and add sentiments that come across as authentic and personalized.

- Do your best to avoid especially lengthy ceremonies. Couples will need to meet the religious requirements if they are getting mar-

ried in the faith, and there may be some aspects of the ceremony that you cannot cut short or modify. But if you have wiggle room, try to keep the ceremony to around 30 minutes; otherwise, you run the risk of guests getting antsy, especially if children are in the audience.

- Decorate the ceremony space. While the altar and aisle are key places to draw attention, couples also can dress up the chairs/pews, ceiling (if allowed), and entrance to the space to make it welcoming and romantic.

Even wedding ceremonies that likely won't run long can benefit from some pre-wedding planning.

BAND OR DJ? HOW ABOUT BOTH?

START A SMOKE-FREE AND VAPE-FREE LIFE

You're ready to start a smoke-free and vape-free life. Here are some suggestions for you, as you get ready to make the change.

1. Stock up on supplies

Withdrawal on the first day—and after—can be intense.

Using nicotine replacement therapy or pharma-cotherapy doubles your chance of successfully quitting. Get advice from a pharmacist or your doctor.

And have lots of healthy snacks and gadgets on hand to help with cravings, keep your hands busy and keep you distracted. Common supplies include:

- Gum or mints
- Cinnamon sticks

- Unsalted sunflower seeds
- Crunchy veggies such as carrots and celery
- Herbal or decaffeinated tea
- Stress ball, fidget spinner or Rubik's Cube
- Supplies for current or new hobbies such as knitting or painting.

2. Stay positive

Try not to let negative thoughts overtake you. Quitting is hard, and for the first few days you'll need to take it one hour at a time. But remember, you've got this. Make a list of your reasons for quitting and keep it handy—in your wallet, on your fridge door, even taped to your computer at work.

Try to focus on why you chose to quit in the first place and envision how good you'll feel when you are smoke-free for good!

Think of a positive mantra—perhaps “I will beat this and be smoke-free”—and repeat it over and over if you feel negative thoughts slipping in.

3. Avoid your triggers

Triggers may include places, people or situations that cause you to want to smoke or vape. Everyone has their own triggers, so know yours and avoid them where possible.

Remember the four Ds: delay, deep breathe, drink (water) and do.

Here are more tips for overcoming common triggers:

- Alcohol can reduce your resolve to stay quit. Consider drinking water or herbal tea as alternatives.
- Avoid caffeine, as it's a major trigger and can give you the jitters. Try an alternate beverage like tea, juice or water.

• Stress can trigger an urge to vape or smoke, so try to stay calm and do some deep breathing. Consider yoga or meditation to help you stay relaxed.

• Avoid being around other people who smoke or vape. This might be hard if your family or friends smoke or vape, but ask that they don't smoke or vape around you and organize activities

where people can't smoke, such as going to the movies.

- If sitting around after meals is a trigger, get up and move. Do the dishes, brush your teeth, call a friend, go for a walk or go to the gym.

4. Find help

QuitCore is a free group support program that provides Albertans 18 years and up with the tools and skills they need to quit vaping and using tobacco. The program consists of six 90-minute sessions over a period of up to nine weeks at various locations around the province.

To get help, text: ABQUITS to 123456. Or call 1-866-710-7848.

Or join a group in your community to share your stories, learn new coping strategies and celebrate milestones together. To find a session near you and to get customized email tips about quitting, go to www.albertaquits.ca.

Lastly, remember that setbacks sometimes happen. They don't mean you've failed. Slipping up is a normal part of the process, and we learn new things each time we try. It is possible to successfully stop smoking. Sometimes you have to just keep trying.


