EDMONTON: "It was a pleasure to introduce Private Members Motion 501 in the house on Monday March 2, 2020. The motion read as follows:

"Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to establish corridors for transportation and utility infrastructure including railways, roads, pipelines and transmission lines, in order to improve access to global markets for Alberta products and resources via deep sea ports

in locations including but not limited to Hudson Bay, Kitimat, and the state of Alaska."

Transportation Utility Corridors (TUCs) are better for the environment when dealing with the need to transport energy goods across Canada, and they provide investor certainty in where to place their projects. Once the corridor is setup and established, red tape and applications are significantly reduced in approving energy projects within them.

Such corridors will add to investor confidence, and bring investment and jobs back to our economy. Our energy is the most responsibly produced, and cleanest in the world.

Canada continues to import foreign oil unnecessarily. Recent international issues such as uncertainty Middle East, and COVID-19 have impacted, and will further impact Canada's import supply of oil. We can solve this easily by transporting Western Canadian oil out east.

It is also important to note that it is not just energy that can be transported in a TUC. Agriculture, manufacturing, and technology shipping can also be enhanced. Pursuing these has the potential to increase shipping speeds between Asia and Central/Eastern Canada by 4-10 days each way going through Alaska.

In addition, Bill 201 – The Strategic Aviation Advisory Council Act will assist in tying in air transport to Alberta's ability to ship products more effectively. More established TUCs and air transport together will move Alberta towards becoming a major economic hub for transportation of not only its products, but the products destined for other locations.

I was very pleased to see Motion 501 pass in the Legislative Assembly on Monday, and look forward to working with Government as they pursue the establishment of these corridors."

BUDGET 2020: STAYING ON TRACK TO BALANCE

Our government's fiscal plan is working. This week, our government announced that the yearly deficit will be \$1.2 billion less than projected in Budget 2019. This will save taxpayers \$35 million in debt servicing costs and put this province on track to balance the budget by 2022-23. Balancing the budget
