ALBERTA RCMP OFFICERS THREATENED WITH **COVID-19 CONTAMINATION**

Edmonton - Members of the Alberta RCMP have reported being threatened in the context of the current COVID-19 pandemic. In the past several days, RCMP officers have reported being threatened to be coughed on by members of the public who claim to be COVID-19 positive.

The threat to transmit the COVID-19 virus is a threat to the wellbeing and health of our members which is a criminal offence," said Assistant Commissioner John Ferguson, Alberta RCMP's Officer-in-Charge of Criminal Operations. "To actually carry out these threats would be an Assault on a Peace Officer."

Currently, there is only one recorded incident that has led to charges in Wetaskiwin, Alta. That individual was charged with assault on a police officer and failure to comply with the Public Health Act.

GATINEAU, QC, April 6, 2020 - The Government of Canada continues to take action to support Canadians and their families impacted by the global COVID-19 pandemic.

Today, the Honourable Ahmed Hussen, Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, together with the Honourable Diane Lebouthillier, Minister of National Revenue, the Honourable Carla Qualtrough, Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Disability Inclusion and the Honourable Joyce Murray, Minister of Digital Government, announced that Canadians can now apply for the Canada **Emergency Response Benefit** (CERB) at Canada.ca/coronavirus.

The Government of Canada is working day and night to ensure Canadians have access to the CERB in the simplest and fastest way possible. Canadians who have lost their income due to COVID-19 can expect their payment in 3 to 5 business days from when they apply if they are using direct deposit. That means most Canadians who are eligible will receive \$2,000 before the end of next week.

Canadians looking to get more information about the CERB or, who are unable to apply online, can call the tollfree telephone line at 1-833-966-2099.

To help manage the volume of applications through the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and Service Canada, applicants will be asked to apply over four days depending on their month of birth. In addition, Shared Services Canada has also increased the bandwidth capacity of the network infrastructure supporting the CRA, including the My Account secure online portal.

Canadians who have already applied for EI do not need to reapply. To date, over 1.2 million of the EI applications received since March 15, 2020 have been processed through the new CERB.

The Government of Canada remains fully committed to supporting all Canadians during this global pandemic. The Government will continue to carefully consider any additional steps it can take to do just that.

Each school will need to arrange a schedule to support social distancing and limit the number of people in the school at one time as required. There will be a plan revealed for some sort of staggered entry to collect personal items. If you have important medications (e.g. epi pens, prescription medications, etc.) at the school that require immediate pickup, please feel free to contact the school directly and arrange an appropriate time to pick up these items.

Homework

Many of you are asking if your classroom teacher will be providing 'homework' for your child to be working on while they remain home. As much as possible, Parkland School Division's plans will be to facilitate this support. Exactly how this will be conducted will be school-specific and even classroom-specific. This will take some time to plan and facilitate so parents should not expect work to be coming home until after the scheduled Spring Break March 23 - 27. More information will be shared via email at a later date.

Fees

At this point, no decision has been made on how fees collected for the 2019-2020 year will be addressed. We are working with the Ministry of Education and other school divisions to determine how to deal with potential refunds, etc.

There are still many ques-



tions that remain unanswered and we will endeavour to share with you as much information as possible, as soon as possible. Thank you all for your patience and understanding. Please keep checking our website for more information.

For further reading, families are encouraged to familiarize themselves with Parkland School Division's Administrative Procedures that deal specifically with communicable diseases and pandemic response.

In the past month, daily life in our community has changed in many ways. For many of us, this "new normal" can be extremely challenging due to the uncertainty and stress that it brings to our lives. I want to take this opportunity to thank all of the workers who are supporting our community in this trying time. From the truckers transporting goods to keep our stores well-stocked to the doctors and nurses treating sick patients, to people volunteering their time and resources to help their neighbours, I would like to sincerely thank everyone working so hard to support our communities.

I am very pleased to share that the Keystone XL pipeline will begin construction this month. Through a \$1.5 billion investment, our government is ensuring that the project will be operational by 2023. This agreement is the culmination of six months of negotiations, rigorous vetting by officials to ensure the project's success, and plans to minimize any risk to taxpayers. This announcement is welcome news for Alberta's energy sector, and will create over 7,000 jobs in Alberta during construction. By getting shovels in the ground this month, our government is taking bold action to re-take our economy and plan for economic recovery in the months to come.

This week, our government also met at the Legislature to pass important emergency legislation that will strengthen our province's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. These three bills were passed by the Legislative Assembly to support key measures that were previously announced in the fight against COVID-19: enforcing public health orders during the pandemic; protecting residential tenants from late fees evictions; and expanding the role of Alberta's Orphan Well Association to support job creation. In the fight against COVID-19, our government is continuing to work hard for Albertans and strengthen our

ability to fight the pandemic on all fronts.

Our government is continuing to open child care spaces for the children of essential workers in the fight against COVID-19. In addition to health care and critical infrastructure workers who were already eligible, child care spaces are being expanded for parents working in essential service positions. All re-opened child care centres will have a maximum of 30 people, including staff, and will follow enhanced sanitization to protect the health of children and staff alike.

It is important to recognize the people in our community who have gone out of their way for others and are helping to create a positive impact around them. I have heard incredible stories of neighbours taking time out of their day to deliver groceries to someone unable to leave their home or the many people who have recognized a need for handmade face masks and applied their skills to helping out.

If you have been noticing hearts on people's windows, they

are participating in a fun initiative to show our thanks to our incredible health workers. Check out Hearts from Drayton Valley on Facebook.

IGA has been going out of its way to maintain baking and necessary kitchen essentials, ensuring that everyone has access to what they need. Many stores have initiated a senior hour in the early mornings to make sure our seniors have safe and clean environments to do their shopping in, while Rocky Rapids general store has made it their mission to ensure groceries get to the people who need them.

We have even started witnessing new and creative ways to celebrate birthdays and anniversaries, with people coming out to say hi but from the safety of their vehicles.

Throughout this pandemic, I am reminded of the exceptional community spirit and resilience that is deeply ingrained in Alberta's culture. It is by coming together and supporting one another that we will get through this time.

Quick Facts

• The CERB is available from March 15, 2020, to October 3, 2020. Eligible workers can apply no later than December 2, 2020.

• Direct deposit payments will be delivered into accounts within 3 business days of applicants being eligible to receive it, and cheques within 10 days. To ensure timely delivery of their payments and avoid any potential payment disruptions, Canadians should sign up for direct deposit.

• The CERB will support Canadians who have stopped working because of COVID-19 by providing \$500 a week for up to 16 weeks. Some examples of support to workers provided by the CERB include:

- workers, including those who are self-employed, who must stop working due to COVID-19 and do not have access to paid leave or other income support;

- workers who have lost their employment, as well as workers who are sick, quarantined or taking care of someone who is sick with COVID-19;

- working parents who must stay home without pay to care for children who are sick or need additional care because of school and daycare closures; and

- workers who are still employed, but are not being paid because there is currently not sufficient work and their employer has asked them not to come to work.

PROVINCE OFFERS FUNDING THROUGH FCSS FOR PANDEMIC-AID GROUPS

Organizations supporting those affected by Coronavirus can apply for additional funding by contacting Yellowhead County's Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) department.

In times like these, we want to help those who are most vulnerable, isolated, and alone. That can include seniors, young moms, people with compromised health, or those facing financial hardships.

To that end, service groups, non-profits, and civil-society organizations who are providing support services to vulnerable people impacted by Coronavirus/COVID-19 can now apply for funding aid from the provincial government through their local FCSS department.

The Alberta government has allocated 30 million dollars for these groups' use. The funding will be distributed between Edmonton and Calgary, and the Family and Community Support Services Association of Alberta (FCSSAA) for the rest of the province.

If you are an organization-faith-based or secular-working to support and strengthen our communities specifically during this pandemic, this funding is meant for you. If you are working with an existing group of vulnerable individuals, or you have volunteers concerned about seniors and their ability to access necessities while self-isolating, this funding is meant for you.

In general, if you have solutions in this challenging time but need fiscal resources, this funding is meant for you. Funds can be accessed through a simple application process that includes connecting directly with the local FCSS program to discuss the application and provide recommendation to the FCSSAA.

HOME REPAIRS THAT CAN SINK BUDGETS FAST

A home is the most substantial investment many people will ever make. Once down payments have been made and closing costs have been paid, homeowners may still be staring down sizable expenses as they begin to tackle any repairs that need to be made.

Home maintenance and renovations involve a certain measure of trepidation. Studies published by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Consumer Product Safety Commission found that certain tools are more likely to cause injuries than others. Power nailers, for example, are among the most

dangerous tools DIYers can use. Chain saws, table saws, circular saws, and riding mowers are some additional tools that have very high injury rates.

The following are some safety guidelines all DIYers should heed when using power tools.

• Use tools that are the right size and right type for the job. If you are uncertain about which tools to use, watch online tutorials. contact tool manufacturers or seek advice at home supply stores.

· Always wear eye protection and the right safety equipment when manufacturers recommend doing so. Gloves, sturdy work boots,

hearing protection, and hard hats can protect DIYers from injury.

· Keep cutting tools sharp and in good condition to reduce kick back and potential injuries.

• Regularly inspect tools to make sure they are in working order.

• Never carry tools up a ladder by hand; use a bucket or bag to hoist tools.

 Never leave tools lying out in any area where they can present a hazard. Unplug power tools when not in use.

• Secure work with a clamp or vice grip when appropriate to keep things from slipping. · Ensure that the handles of

tools like hammers and axes

fit tightly into the head of the tool.

 Keep work environments tidy to avoid clutter, as cluttered workspaces can contribute to accidents.

· Read the manual and operate the power tool as instructed.

· Do not force open a safety on a power tool or modify a tool to override safety features.

· Cut away from yourself when using chisels and other edged tools.

Let common sense prevail when using tools. If it doesn't seem like a good idea, it probably isn't. Safety is important to avoid injuries and help prevent delays on the job.



Community**VOICE** Page 11 **ALBERTA RCMP WARN CITIZENS OF SPIKE IN COVID-19 SCAMS**

Edmonton, Alta. - Since the beginning of the month, there has been a spike in COVID-19 related scams in Canada. The most common reports are fraudulent merchandise sales and phishing emails.

The fraudulent merchandise sales frequently involve the sale and/or giveaway of health-related products such as facemasks and COVID-19 tests. There are also "free" products being advertised where the victim must pay a fake shipping fee.

The phishing emails impersonate agencies such as the Red Cross, the World Health Organization, the Ministry of Health, Public Health Canada, the Canada Revenue Agency, and more. Typically, individuals are contacted through email or SMS and provided a link which prompts them to fill out personal and banking information. In some cases, the link contains suspected malware.

Other scams that occur involve individuals being advised of fake positive test results, donation campaigns, door-to-door decontamination services, and self-assessment surveys.

Here are some tips to remember if you are contacted:

• Never give out personal or financial details if you



didn't initiate the call.

• If you didn't initiate the contact, you don't know who you're talking to.

• Don't click on suspicious links or attachments.

· Install anti-virus software.

· Be skeptical of emails even if they look legitimate. Check the "from" address

by hovering over the name.

· Check the Canadian Anti-Fraud website for a list of reported scams.

Fun By The Numbers

Here's How It Works: Sudoku puzzles are formatted as a 9x9 grid, broken down into nine 3x3 boxes. To solve a sudoku, the numbers 1 through 9 must fill each row, column and box.
