COUNTY RESPONDS TO RISING WATER LEVELS

Submitted by Lac Ste. Anne County

Sangudo, Alberta, Saturday, May 23, 2020 – Lac Ste. Anne County continues to closely monitor water levels and weigh options to mitigate flooding events wherever practical. Primary areas of concern include

farmland, lakefront properties and County infrastructure. All rural tributaries to Lac Ste. Anne are full – if not overflowing. Where feasible for the County and its ratepayers, the County is working to retain flow until other water levels subside.

“Factors such as a heavy winter snowpack, steady

spring precipitation and saturated feeder tributaries have resulted in higher-than-average water table levels and overland flooding events,” stated Joe Blakeman, Reeve of Lac Ste. Anne County.

WHITECOURT RCMP MAKE ARRESTS IN TWO SEPARATE FIREARMS OFFENCES

Whitecourt, Alta. - On May 15, 2020 at 2:30 p.m. Whitecourt RCMP responded to a report of shots fired in the Woodlands County area. The report was false but a male was located on the roof of the house with a loaded rifle. The male was cooperative and was arrested without incident.

Jesse Caithness-McGregor (27) of Woodlands

County, Alta. was arrested for an outstanding warrant and charged with:

- Unauthorized possession of a firearm

- Careless use of a firearm

Jesse Caithness-McGregor was held for a judicial hearing. He was released and will be appearing in Whitecourt Provincial Court at 10:00 a.m. on July 28th, 2020.

While Whitecourt RCMP were in attendance at the first call, a second high pri-

ority call came in involving shots fired in the area of Woodlands County. Investigation revealed that a shot had been fired into the air. No one was injured. The 58-year-old male suspect was arrested without incident. He was released with conditions and is scheduled to appear in Whitecourt Provincial Court at 10:00 a.m. on July 28th, 2020. His name will not be released as his documents are waiting for judicial authorization.

County Responds to Rising Water Levels

"This is the fourth consecutive year that the County has experienced an unprecedented amount of rainfall resulting in extensive flooding – including in areas where flooding has not historically been an issue."

At this time it has been determined that the weir managed by Alberta Environment (at the mouth of Sturgeon River on the east end of Lac Ste. Anne) is not a primary cause of high-water levels in the County.

It has also been determined that beaver dams and vegetation blockages are not core contributors to high-water levels. The County has an inventory of beaver dams for which it has obtained clearance from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans to remove at its discretion. Due to the present level of Lac Ste. Anne, the County is reluctant to displace natural mechanisms such as beaver dams.

However, the County will employ the measures required to protect residences, agricultural land and County infrastructure while remaining mindful of any secondary impacts these measures may have on adjacent communities downstream including Parkland County, Sturgeon County, and the City of St. Albert.

The County will continue to work with Alberta Environment and affected landowners to determine appropriate actions. In all cases, the County shall be considerate of all stakeholders involved when making these types of critical decisions.

Working in Collaboration with Adjacent Municipalities

When making decisions to lower the lake level to a reasonable degree, the County must consider neighbouring municipalities. St. Albert, Sturgeon County and Parkland County are dealing with similar issues regarding the safety of their citizens and the secondary impacts of their water

mitigation activities. Lakes, conveyance ditches, destination areas and other systems in neighbouring regions are at or near capacity due to water levels not seen in decades.

Adjacent municipalities have reached out to the County to offer assistance by way of tiger dams, sump pumps and other mitigation tools for those with critical infrastructure at risk, with the understanding that its systems are also at or near capacity. Similarly, the County will continue to work with its neighbours, and with Alberta Environment, to manage water levels and mitigate further damage to infrastructure and private property. The collective goal is to find practical, equitable solutions that protect the safety, infrastructure and assets of all involved to the greatest extent possible.

Affected landowners are thanked for their patience and understanding as the County continues to work to find solutions that are equitable for all parties involved.

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

The Town of Whitecourt continues to monitor the COVID-19 health emergency across Alberta. Here are some reminders surrounding closures, gatherings and travel for the community.

Whitecourt's Reopening Strategy

With the guidance and recommendation from the Government of Alberta, Whitecourt will be following a phased in approach to reopen public facilities and amenities. Community members are asked to follow the Whitecourt Facebook page and website as updates on the reopening of facilities will be posted when available.

The following outdoor areas and amenities remain open for public use in Whitecourt:

- Parks and Open Spaces (including baseball diamonds, soccer fields) for spontaneous use and unorganized sports only;
- Off Leash Dog Park;
- Trails;
- Riverboat Park Boat Launch;
- Neighbourhood courts (basketball, tennis) for spontaneous, non-contact, unorganized sport only.

Per the current public health guidelines, the following recreational amenities remain closed for public use:

- Playground structures in Town-owned parks;
- Skate Park;

• Whitecourt River Slides and Splash Park: Per the Province's guidelines, the Whitecourt River Slides and Splashpark will remain closed. Both water features are considered pools and are required to remain closed as any potential reopening is included in stage 3 of Alberta's Relaunch Strategy.

The Town anticipates a reopening decision for playground structures may be

made within the next two weeks, once the Province releases operating guidelines that allow the Town to establish appropriate safe use measures that are consistent with their recommendations.

Campfires

There is currently no fire ban within the Town of Whitecourt. Fires are allowed in permitted fire pits. If you are travelling outside of Whitecourt, please visit

www.albertafirebans.ca for information on fire restrictions and bans in other jurisdictions.

Garage/Yard Sales

GOLFER'S GUIDE

POPULAR GOLF COURSES AROUND THE WORLD

The Masters Tournament is the first of golf's four major championships in the calendar year. Competitors tee off at the Augusta National Golf Club in Augusta, GA, in April 2020. Americans Tiger Woods and Patrick Reed are the two most recent Masters champions, and fans are already eager to see who earns the fabled green jacket this year.

Televised golf competitions often inspire people to hit the links. People with a passion for golf may want to check out some of the top courses in the world, as ranked by leading golf resources and experts.

• Ballybunion: This Irish course was touted as "nothing less than the finest seaside course" by famed golf writer Herbert Warren Wind. The course hosted the 2000 Irish Open, but lack of other tournaments can be attributed to its remote, albeit beautiful, location

• Cypress Point: This club sits at the foothills of the Santa Lucia Mountains at the tip of the Monterey Peninsula in California. Located in coastal dunes and on rocky coastlines, Cypress Point is often noted for its dramatic holes along the Pacific Ocean.

• Pine Valley: Located in Pine Valley, NJ, this course, which is more than 100 years old, boasts some formidable hazards with sophisticated green expanses.

• St. Andrew's: This historic course in Scotland has hosted the Open Championship (once known as The British Open) a record 29 times. Historians believe golf originated in Scotland,

and people have been playing on this course since the 15th century. Massive greens, cavernous bunkers and a brilliant layout contribute to its distinguished history.

• Shinnecock Hills: This course in Southampton, NY, is a very old club built in the tradition of Scottish courses. This was likely the inaugural American golf course design, and the Shinnecock Hills Golf Club was one of the five founding members of the United States Golf Association.

• Augusta National: Home to the Masters, Augusta is considered a golf paradise by many. The sheer beauty of Augusta has made it a staple on many golfers' bucket lists, even if only a few may get to walk its fairways with club in hand.

Golf has a storied history, and that history is on display at various jaw-dropping courses across the globe.

MESSAGE TO MY CONSTITUENTS

Provinces are slowly easing health restrictions after being shut down for weeks. While we

are not out of the woods yet, there is reason for cautious optimism here in Yellowhead and across the country.

However, the Trudeau government has been slow to react from the very beginning of this

crisis, and their failures have cost Canadians.

They spent the cupboards bare in the good times and were unprepared when the pandemic hit. Their failure to close our borders allowed the virus to spread. Their inability to maintain Canada's national stockpile of personal protective equipment meant there weren't enough medical supplies when our doctors and nurses needed them most. Their failure to get federal COVID aid programs right the first time has allowed businesses and workers to fall through the cracks.

We cannot afford to have Liberal failures derail provincial efforts to get our country back on track. But that is precisely what federal programs are threatening to do.

For example, for those Canadians who want to work but who lost their jobs due to the pandemic, the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) and the Canada Emergency Student Benefit (CESB) both prevent you from earning more than \$1,000 per month. As businesses open and have shifts to fill, their employees will be penalized for returning to work under the Liberals' program. That's wrong.

Conservatives are calling on the Trudeau government to make programs like the CERB more generous and more flexible so that no one is worse off going back to work or picking up a shift.

Liberal failures must be fixed before it's too late.

County provides details on the May 20 bridge collapse

On Tuesday, May 12, 2020, a bridge (BF09350) located on Range Road 81 roughly 600 metres north of Township Road 574 collapsed, resulting in a hazardous materials release into the Little Paddle River.

Upon notification of the collapse, the County's Fire Services and Enforcement Services teams responded and controlled the scene.

First and foremost, the County is thankful that no injuries resulted from this incident.

Following the incident, and over subsequent days, clean-up and investigative services have been deployed from the following provincial and mu-

nicipal departments:

- Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services
- Lac Ste. Anne County CPO services
- Alberta Environment
- Alberta Transportation
- Lac Ste. Anne County Public Works and Infrastructure

Cleanup of the site continues, and Alberta Transportation has launched an investigation into the BF09350 incident.

The bridge under investigation had warning signs in place that warned traffic of the maximum allowable weight restrictions. The site signage showed varying allowable axle configurations of 12t, 14t and 22t.

Investigators are reviewing the above weight restrictions and comparing them against the incident vehicles gross weight and width dimensions. These are being considered major possible contributing factors to the failure of the bridge.

About the bridge

Built in 1910, BF09350 is part of the ongoing Alberta Transportation Inspection Program. The bridge has undergone numerous inspections, upgrades, parts replacements and service work dating from the beginning of the County record until present day. In September of 2000, BF09350 underwent refurbishment work. As a result, it was taken out of Alberta Transportation's 3-year inspection rotation program and placed in a longer cycle (meaning the refurbished bridge qualified for a longer time period between Alberta Transportation inspections).

Alberta Transportation inspected BF09350 as in 2005, 2012, 2015 and 2019. Upon recommendation from a 2014 report, the County installed posted loading signs.

About the County's bridge management program

The County is home to more than two hundred bridges of various size and structure. Maintenance of these structures falls under the purview




