

### LEDUC CITY COUNCIL SAYS NO TO A **TAX REVENUE INCREASE FOR 2020**

#### Submitted by City of Leduc

The City of Leduc will not be implementing a municipal tax revenue increase for property owners in 2020. Leduc City Council passed the 2020 Property Tax Bylaw this evening, sending a strong message to taxpayers letting them know they have heard residents' concerns regarding the financial impacts of COVID-19 and are responding with a zero increase.

The overall impact will see an annual tax decrease of an average of \$260 per household (based on an assessment of \$325,000), and \$1,050 for non-residential ratepayers (for every \$1 million in assessed value). This was achieved through no tax revenue increase and up to a 2.75 per cent reduction relating to the Provincial Education Tax for 2020. In 2019, the city made an estimate relating to the education tax in anticipation of the provincial budget, which was released after the city's fiscal budget year. As a result, there is a small

savings in 2020 due to the city's conservative estimate.

Property tax notices are slated for release in mid-July and citizens need to be aware of other key dates:

- Aug. 31, 2020 is the payment due date for property taxes
- Dec. 31, 2020 is the payment due date for non-residential property owners who opted to defer payment. To participate, email propertytaxes@leduc.ca before Aug. 31, 2020 deadline
  - Late payment pen-

alties will be waived for the remainder of 2020

# LEDUC TRANSIT FARE COLLECTION WILL RESUME JULY 1, 2020

Starting Wednesday, July 1, 2020, Leduc Transit and LATS will reinstate fares on all transit services. Since late March, Leduc Transit and LATS have been waiving all fares in an effort to reduce financial strain, but as the economy begins to relaunch fare collection will resume on all transit services.

All March passes for Leduc Transit and LATS will be accepted as valid payment for the month of July. Leduc Transit monthly passes and ticket books are available at the Leduc Civic Centre (beginning June 22), Leduc County Centre (began June 9) and online (beginning June 22) at leductransit.ca/ fares/buy-passes-online. LATS monthly passes and ticket books are available at the Leduc Civic Centre (beginning June 22) and can also be purchased directly with drivers. Ticket books are now also a new option available for casual riders on local routes, with 10 tickets to a pack for the price of \$18 to eliminate the need to carry cash fare for each trip.

Edmonton Transit Service (ETS) July monthly passes are also available for purchase at the Leduc Civic Centre (beginning June 22) and the Leduc County Centre (began June 9).

The following health and safety procedures are in effect for Leduc Transit and LATS:

• Enhanced cleaning procedures on all buses in our

fleet on a daily basis, including the use of a disinfectant fogger

• All drivers will be wearing the appropriate personal protection equipment (PPE)

For all transit riders:

- We highly recommend that all passengers wear non-medical masks onboard the buses, for your safety, the safety of your fellow passengers and the safety of our drivers
- Use passes or tickets to eliminate the use of cash
- Follow standard Alberta Health Services (AHS) guidance and regulations, including frequent hand washing or sanitizing, covering your cough or sneeze, staying home if you are feeling unwell, and physical distancing at least two me-

tres (six feet)




your support!

As always, it is my honour to serve as your MLA.













# DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP WARN RESIDENTS OF PARTS SHOP CREDIT CARD SCAM

Drayton Valley, Alta. – Between June 12-17, 2020, Drayton Valley RCMP have received a number of complaints of fraudulent credit card purchases being made by active cards that have not been reported stolen.

Further investigation has shown that in these cases, the suspect, identified as a male, telephones the business and orders parts for vehicles. Most notably, the parts are for Dodge trucks, Ford F150, F350 and Dodge Caravans. The suspect provides payment in the form of a credit card over the phone. The suspect then picks up the merchandise from the business.

After the transaction has

already taken place, the businesses and cardholders have become aware that their cards have been compromised.

Drayton Valley RCMP are recommending businesses take precautions to avoid fraudulent transactions:

- Request Photo ID
- Document the name and ID on the purchase order.


