two-third of home cooking fire start with the ignition of food or other cooking materials.

THORSBY RCMP RESPOND TO PLANE CRASH

At 1:41 p.m. on Sept. 26, 2020, Thorsby RCMP were alerted to a Harmon Rocket plane having crashed onto a field near Township Road 504 and Range Road 21, and then the plane caught fire. Thorsby RCMP

attended and located two deceased occupants in the plane.

Transportation Safety Board will be conducting an investigation into the cause of the crash. RCMP with the assistance of the Leduc County Fire Department held the scene pending the arrival of the Transportation Safety Board.

Further investigation has indicated that the plane was travelling from Rocky Mountain House, Alta., prior to the crash with two occupants, a 59-year old male who was piloting the plane and a 48-year-old female passenger, both from Rocky Mountain House.

Drayton Valley/Brazeau County Fire Services is teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) – the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week for more than 90 years – to promote this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign, “Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!” The campaign works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe.

Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire

injuries in Canada. The majority of reported home fires started in the kitchen. Most home fires start with the ignition of food or other cooking materials.

“We know cooking fires can be prevented,” said Lorraine Carli, vice-president of outreach and advocacy at NFPA. “Staying in the kitchen while cooking, using a timer, and avoiding distractions such as electronics or TV are steps everyone can take to keep families safe in their homes.”

Th Drayton Valley/Brazeau County Fire Services encourages all residents to em-

brace the 2020 Fire Prevention Week theme.

“The most important step you should take before making a meal is to Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!” said Fire Chief Thomson “A cooking fire can grow quickly. I have seen many homes damaged and people injured by fires that could easily have been prevented.”

Drayton Valley/Brazeau County Fire Services wants to share safety tips to keep you from having a cooking fire.

- Never leave cooking food unattended. Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling or broiling food. If you have to leave, even for a short time, turn off the stove.

- If you are simmering, baking, roasting, or boiling food, check it regularly. Remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you're cooking.

- You have to be alert when cooking. You won't be alert if you are sleepy, have taken medicine or drugs, or have consumed alcohol that makes you drowsy.

Which is why City of Leduc Fire Services is taking this week to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around safe.

"A cooking fire can occur just as easily as it can be prevented," says City of Leduc Fire Chief George Clancy. "Simple actions like setting a timer, keeping your cooking areas clear, and staying focused on the food makes a compounding difference to keep you and those around you safe."

Leduc Fire Services wants to share recipes for kitchen safety:

- Never leave cooking food unattended. Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling or

broiling. If you have to leave, even for a short time, turn off the stove.

- If you are simmering, baking, roasting, or boiling food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.

- You have to be alert when cooking. You will not be alert if you are sleepy, have taken medicine or drugs, or consumed alcohol that makes you drowsy.

- Always keep an oven mitt and pan lid nearby when you are cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan to smother the flame. Turn off the burner, and leave the pan covered until it is completely cool.

- Have a "kid-free zone" of at least three feet around the stove and areas where hot food

or drink is prepared or carried.

Due to restrictions from the COVID-19 pandemic, there will be no open house this year. Residents can visit leduc.ca/fpw2020 for more information and resources to help you cook safely.

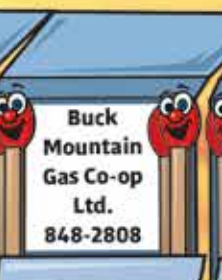

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that the Department of Families, Children and Social Development an-

nounced that the Government of Alberta will receive \$72 million of the \$625 million in federal support for Canada's childcare sector to help ensure that safe and sufficient childcare is available to support parents' gradual return to work.

This funding is in addition to the \$45 million Alberta is receiving through the 2020-21 Canada-Alberta Early Learning and Child Care Bilateral Agreement to support childcare programs and services for Alberta families.

RCMP REMIND ALBERTANS TO PRACTICE RAIL SAFETY

Edmonton - In support of Rail Safety Week, the RCMP reminds Albertans to exercise caution near rail crossings and dissuades individuals from trespassing onto tracks. In 2019, Alberta had the second highest number of total railway crossing incidents, accounting for 20% of all incidents across the country.

Alberta RCMP 2019 jurisdiction statistics:

- In 2019, there were 35 crossing incidents across Alberta. Of these incidents,

11 resulted in serious injury or death.

- In 2019, Alberta reported the second highest number of trespassing incidents per province across the country.

- There were 14 trespassing incidents on Alberta rail lines in 2019. 13 of these incidents resulted in serious injury or death.

These incidents are both tragic and avoidable. In collaboration with Canadian Pacific Police Service (CPPS) and Operation Lifesaver, we encourage individuals to practice the following safety when near

railway tracks:

- Stop behind marked lines when red crossing lights are flashing or arms are down. Wait until the flashing lights have stopped or the arms have raised fully before crossing the intersection.

- Look in both directions for an oncoming train at uncontrolled railway crossings.

- If you see a train coming, do not cross the tracks. Trains may appear farther away and slower, but this is due to their large size and are likely closer than they appear.

- Avoid trespassing across tracks on railway property, this can lead to serious injury or death.

- Trains carry loads that may be wider than the freight cars themselves, or may have loose chains and straps to secure the load. Stand or park in designated safe areas to avoid incident or injury.

Together we can ensure rail safety occurs across Alberta. If you see suspicious or unsafe activity on or around rail lines, please contact your local police of jurisdiction, or CPPS at 1-800-716-9132.
