ALBERTA RCMP URGES CITIZENS TO SAFE'GOURD' THEIR CABINS

October is a popular time for people to close-up their cabins for the season and Alberta RCMP is urging citizens to consider crime prevention while doing this.

In 2019 there were over 650 reported break and enters to seasonal properties in Alberta RCMP jurisdiction. The highest months for reported break and enters were November, October, and December. Break and enters can also occur during the off-season but end up being reported in the spring. In an effort to curb break-ins during the winter months, Alberta RCMP is providing these tips:

• It's not just pumpkins that should be hollow this time of year, remember to take home all valuables. • Don't 'fall' into old habits. If you can't take all valuables home, be sure to lock them in a shed or garage.

• Help 'squash' crime by locking all doors and windows.

Safe'gourd' your cabin by periodically checking on your property.
'Leaf' robbers 'stumped'

• Keep autumn-mobiles and toys safe by locking them in a secure building or take them home.

RCMP INVESTIGATE FATAL PEDESTRIAN COLLISION ON HIGHWAY 16A

On Oct. 7, 2020, at 4 a.m., Parkland RCMP responded to a call of a vehicle versus pedestrian collision on Highway 16A located 1 km east of Boundary Road between Stony Plain and Spruce Grove, Alta. Parkland RCMP and emergency medical services attended the scene of the collision.

A pick-up truck heading eastbound on Highway 16A collided with a male who crossed the path of the pick-up truck in the far right lane. Emergency medical services attended and confirmed the 35-year-old male of no fixed address, was deceased on scene.

The 29-year-old male driver of the pick-up truck and 47-year-old passenger, both of Spruce Grove, AB, were not injured as a result of this collision. Traffic in the area was affected for multiple hours as the RCMP Collision Analyst attended and examined the collision scene. Parkland RCMP continue to investigate. The name of the deceased will not be released and no further updates are anticipated.

These violations are scheduled for Provincial Court in Whitecourt.

This investigation involved the passenger allegedly providing the investigating officer with multiple false names. A search of the vehicle was completed that resulted in the seizure of a quantity of suspected methamphetamine. Further investigation determined the identity of the passenger of the vehicle to be Matthew Phillip Levesque (35) of Whitecourt who was

wanted on outstanding warrants related to 44 various charges including breach of multiple release orders including 24-hr house arrest.

SEPTEMBER 29, 2020

West Yellowhead MLA Martin Long attended the September 28 Regular Meeting of Council to provide information on recent grant allocations to the community. Whitecourt will receive over \$1 million from the Municipal Operating Support Transfer which was created by the Government of Alberta to support municipalities with operating impacts due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Whitecourt has also been awarded \$4,235,549 for improvements to the Wastewater Treatment Plant under the Strategic Transportation Infrastructure Program. Thank you to the Government of Alberta for its support of our community.

Whitecourt Town Council thanks all of those that provided input on the 2021 Budget at last night's Budget Public Input Session and through written submissions. Your feedback will be reviewed by Town Council during budget deliberations which begin next week. Early in 2021, Council will be hosting its annual Budget Open House which will provide ratepayers further opportunity to share comments and learn about the budget. Watch for further details on the open house in the new year.

The 2020 20-Year Capital and Major Maintenance Plan has been adopted. The Plan, which includes 135 projects, provides a vision for the long term development of Whitecourt's infrastructure; land development; parks and trails; and, building and recreational/cultural facilities to meet the needs of our growing community. The Plan incorporates projects and timelines identified through engineering studies, planning sessions, workshops, budget deliberations, and public engagement activities. The Plan is available to view at www.whitecourt.ca.

Whitecourt will be applying for funding through the COVID-19 Resilience Stream grant program to fund the Scott Safety Centre Ice Plant Upgrade. If approved, the project would receive up to 80% funding from the federal government.

The Whitecourt Chamber of Commerce submitted a letter requesting Council review parking levies applied to the current Downtown Parking Overlay District. Parking levies are collected to fund future public parking in the downtown area; however, the Chamber feels the practice is detrimental to downtown development. Council has directed Administration to prepare options for how to address this concern, and will be reviewing the item during 2021 budget deliberations.

Council is recruiting for public appointments to Council Committees. Share your voice and help shape our community by applying to serve on a Council Committee. Information on public appointment vacancies can be found on www.whitecourt.ca.

Council has approved a street closure request made by the Chamber of Commerce for the Trunk or Treat event scheduled for October 31. The event involves local businesses purchasing a spot on the street to bring a decorated vehicle to serve treats to children as they come up to "trunk or treat". 50 Street from 50 Avenue and 53 Avenue will be closed between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. to accommodate the event.

The name "Scott" has been added to Whitecourt's Available Street Name List. The name honours local residents Brian, Val and Kyle Scott who have all contributed countless hours to a number of organizations and initiatives throughout our community.

Council scheduled its annual Planning Session for January 21 through 23, 2021.

Please include all relevant paperwork with the tails (affidavit for beaver tails, and permission forms when trapping on others' land).

• When passing, make sure you can see the mowing vehicle in your rear-view mirror
