With highway visibility, new highway access, and future highway signage, the Town anticipates this national brand will bring additional new investment and employment opportunities to the community. This Canadian staple will entice new visitors to the Town, create tourism opportunities and increase demand for exist-

ing services.

Along with the 2,500 square foot Tim Hortons restaurant, there will be an adjacent 2,000 square feet of commercial retail space for a new or growing business. Working with Avison Young, the Town seeks to attract one or two businesses for the additional retail space. Inquiries about the opportunity have already been received by the Town.

"I'm thrilled to see this exciting new investment in our Town! It's been a while since we've had a new commercial build. Along with the employment opportunities, the brand recognition that comes with Tim Hortons should be a catalyst for growth. And, the boost to the local economy from highway traffic and tourism is most welcome. Between the traffic lights and Tim Horton's, people won't just drive on by anymore!" - Mayor Janet Jabush

The total number of new full- and part-time jobs is unknown, but the Tim Hortons is anticipated to be a busy, 7-day a week operation with extended hours.

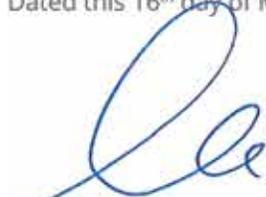
This Road Ban will remain in place until June 1st or as determined by the County.

Managing and Mitigating Infrastructure Strain

Lac Ste. Anne County is responsible for the preservation and maintenance of all municipal roads, highways and bridges within Lac Ste. Anne County which are under the direction, control and management of the County. A very important part of this responsibility is the protection of roadways during the spring thaw. This time of year can create serious structural damage to roads and bridges if appropriate measures are not taken.

When a road ban occurs, signs indicating the allowed axle percentages are posted on some oiled surfaces and subdivisions. Road ban signage is not posted on gravel roads; however, all roads will be monitored and road bans enforced by Lac Ste. Anne County Enforcement Services to ensure compliance.

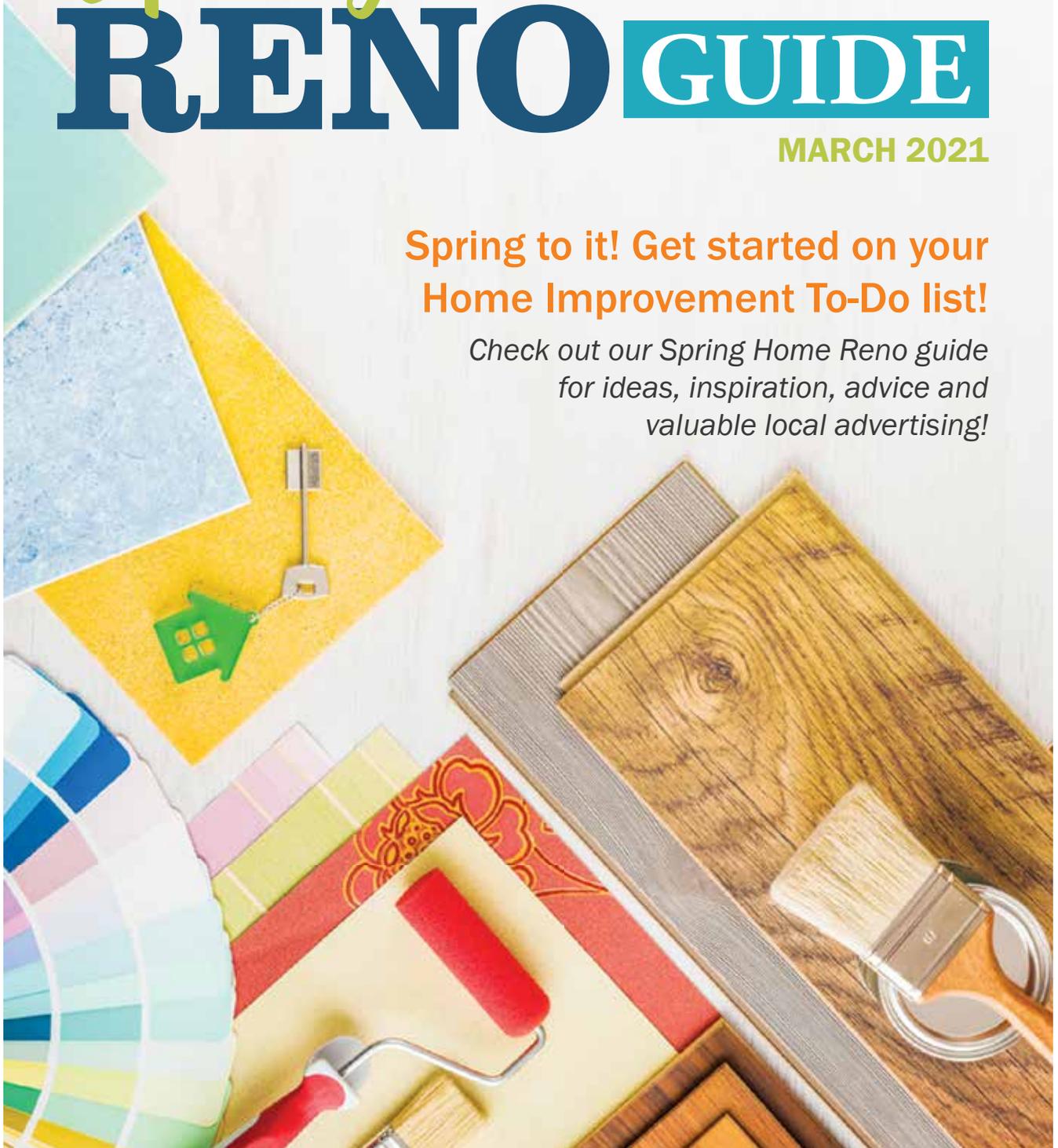

WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE INSTALLING BUILT-INS

After purchasing a new home, buyers often want to put their own fingerprint on the property. Homeowners anticipate the day when their homes are transformed into spaces that reflect their style and not the preferences of previous owners.

When deciding how to renovate interior spaces, homeowners will make some relatively temporary changes, but they also may consider some permanent adjustments. Built-ins fall into the category of permanent adjustments, and while realty professionals note that built-ins tend to provide a good return on investment, homeowners can learn more about built-ins before deciding if they want to install them in their homes.

What are built-ins?

Realtor.com defines built-

ins as any feature that is built into the interior of a home. The term "built-ins" may immediately conjure up images of bookshelves, but built-ins also include benches and entertainment centers.

Why install built-ins?

Built-ins can be both utilitarian and aesthetically appealing. Built-ins are functional because they provide storage space that homeowners may otherwise find hard to create. Built-ins are embedded in walls that may otherwise be useful only to hang artwork. This can provide much-needed storage space in homes with limited square footage. Professionally installed built-ins also can transform rooms, making them appear more organized. Customized built-ins also can give

homes their own unique character, though it's important to note that prospective buyers may or may not appreciate that uniqueness.

Are there disadvantages to built-ins?

The permanence of built-ins may not appeal to some buyers. If buyers don't like built-ins at all or are not fond of the look of customized built-ins, that may be enough to convince them to walk away from a property. However, Realtor.com notes that functional built-ins, like built-in bench seats with storage capacity, appeal to modern buyers and their preference for as much storage space as possible.

Permanent built-ins also can be costly. The home remodeling resource Fixr.com notes

that built-in entertainment center installations can cost between \$8,000 and \$9,500. Built-in seating and bookshelves are not as costly, but such projects still cost more than simply buying premade furniture.

Some buyers also may see built-ins as limiting what they can do with a space. That can be a major disadvantage as more professionals work from home and seek multi-functional spaces in their homes.

Built-ins can dramatically change the look of a room and provide some much-needed storage space. But it's imperative that homeowners give ample thought to built-ins before deciding to install them in their homes.

TIPS TO KEEP PESTS OUT OF CRAWL SPACES

According to the pest control experts at Terminix®, pests can destroy insulation, gnaw through wiring and air ducts and damage the wooden sub-structures of a home. Though many homeowners may go months if not years between trips to their crawl spaces, periodic visits to inspect for the presence of pests can help uncover any issues before they escalate into significant problems.

The discovery of pest problems in a crawl space can be

unsettling. Some homeowners may wonder how long they've been hosting these uninvited guests, while others may wonder what they can do to evict them once and for all. Fortunately, homeowners can employ various strategies to keep pests from taking over their crawl spaces.

- Seal cracks and openings. Pests may enter a crawl space through small cracks or openings, much like cold or warm air can enter through similar cracks around windows and doors. Terminix® notes that homeowners can apply caulk or foam insulation around cracks or openings in their crawl spaces. No crack is too small to seal, as small insects like termites and ants don't need much room to maneuver their way into a home.
- Encapsulate the crawl space. Crawl spaces are dark

and damp. Wet, humid conditions attract rodents and insects, increasing the risk of infestation. Encapsulation closes and secures a crawl space with a thick vapor barrier that lines the floor and walls of the crawl space. Vapor barriers can keep moisture from condensing on wood, making the area less likely to attract pests.

- Run a dehumidifier in the crawl space. Dehumidifiers can help homeowners control moisture in a crawl space. In fact, many companies that install vapor barriers recommend running dehumidifiers after a barrier has been installed.
- Examine the perimeter of your home, particularly the exterior walls. Periodic examinations of a home's exterior may reveal brush that can make for ideal shelters for

pests. Pests sheltering along the exterior walls of a home will eventually try to enter the home, likely through the crawl space. Remove piles of brush during routine walk-arounds of the home and trim any bushes or shrubs that also may be providing shelter to pests.

- Keep an eye on the crawl space. Though crawl spaces can be difficult to access, homeowners should visit these spaces periodically. Inspections can help homeowners determine if dehumidifiers are still running and allow them to check for pests or other issues, such as cracks, that may be inviting unwanted guests into their homes.

Crawl spaces can become homes and breeding grounds for pests if homeowners don't take measures to prevent such issues.

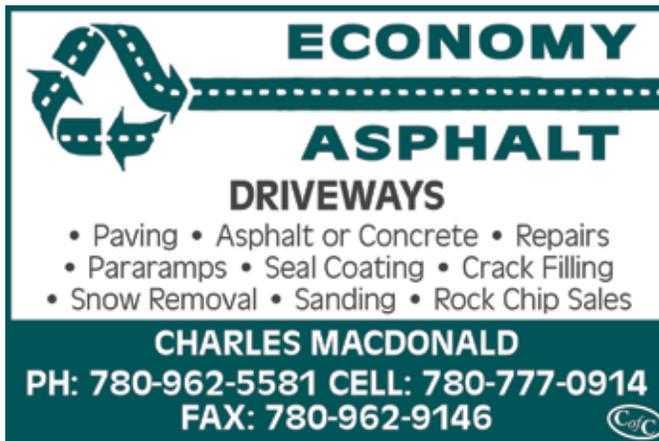

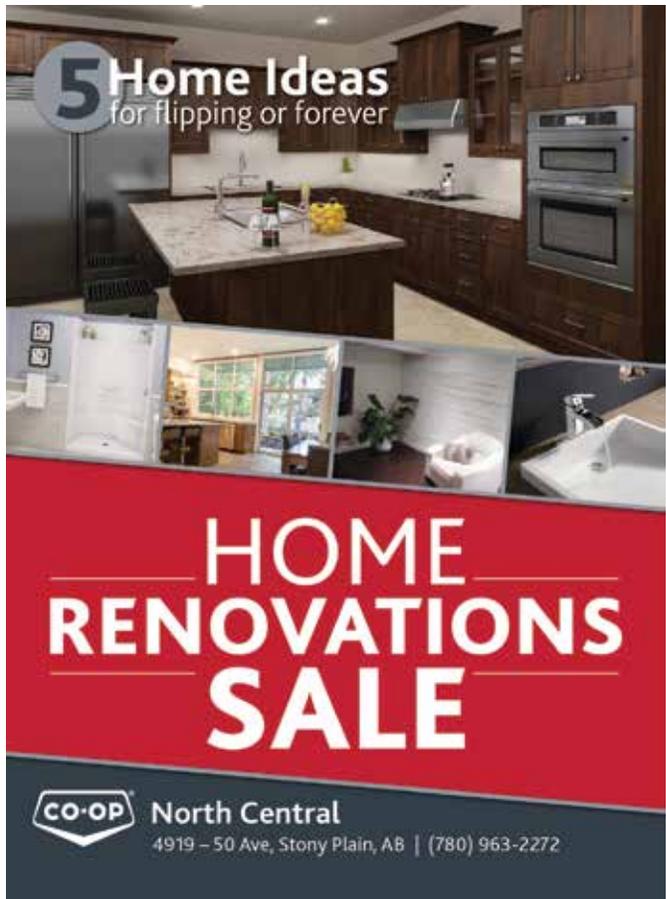

NATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE ASSESSMENT ENGAGEMENT PAPER

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise that the Department of Infrastructure and Communities has launched an Engagement Paper on Canada's first National Infrastructure As-

essment. This will set out the purpose and benefits of undertaking a National Infrastructure Assessment and seeks input from the public, Indigenous Peoples, provinces, territories, municipalities, and stakeholders on three main priorities of the assessment:

- Assessing Canada's infra-

structure needs and establishing a long-term vision;

- Improving coordination among infrastructure owners and funders; and
- Determining the best ways to fund and finance infrastructure.

The National Infrastructure Assessment, once in place, will help identify

Canada's evolving needs and priorities in the built environment and undertake evidence-based long-term planning toward a net-zero emissions future.

Deadline for receiving feedback is June 30, 2021.

WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

MARCH 24, 2021

The Government of Alberta recently announced changes to the Alberta Disaster Recovery Program which provides financial assistance to help restore uninsurable property lost or damaged by a disaster. The Province has implemented a 90:10 cost-sharing arrangement with local governments and private-sector applicants, with the Province assisting for up to 90% of eligible disaster costs. In addition, a \$500,000 funding cap per homeowner application, and a one-time limit on disaster financial assistance per property has also been added to the program guidelines. The Town of Whitecourt, as a community susceptible to natural disasters due to its location and topography, is concerned about the impact these program changes will have not only on the municipality, but also local property owners. The Alberta Urban Municipalities Association (AUMA), which advocates on behalf of communities across Alberta, is reviewing the potential impact this will have and the information published by AUMA will be presented to Council at a future meeting for further discussion. For information

Whitecourt recently received notice from the Alberta Justice and Solicitor General that it has implemented a chargeback model for the provincial portion of its Biology Casework Analysis Agreement (BCAA) expenses. As a result of this new model, Whitecourt received an invoice in the amount of \$22,691.66 representing the Whitecourt RCMP Detachment's portion of the BCAA expenses for the year ending March 31, 2021. Municipalities across Alberta were unaware of the Province's intention to implement this chargeback model, and had no provisions in place to pay this expenditure. Whitecourt will be working with AUMA to determine the long term impacts of this change, and has deferred further discussion on the item to 2021 final budget deliberations.

The newly established Whitecourt Tourism Committee will be administering the 2021 Tourism Enhancement Grant Program, and applications for funding will be accepted until April 22, 2021. The program provides financial assistance to enhance tourism related events and/or products.

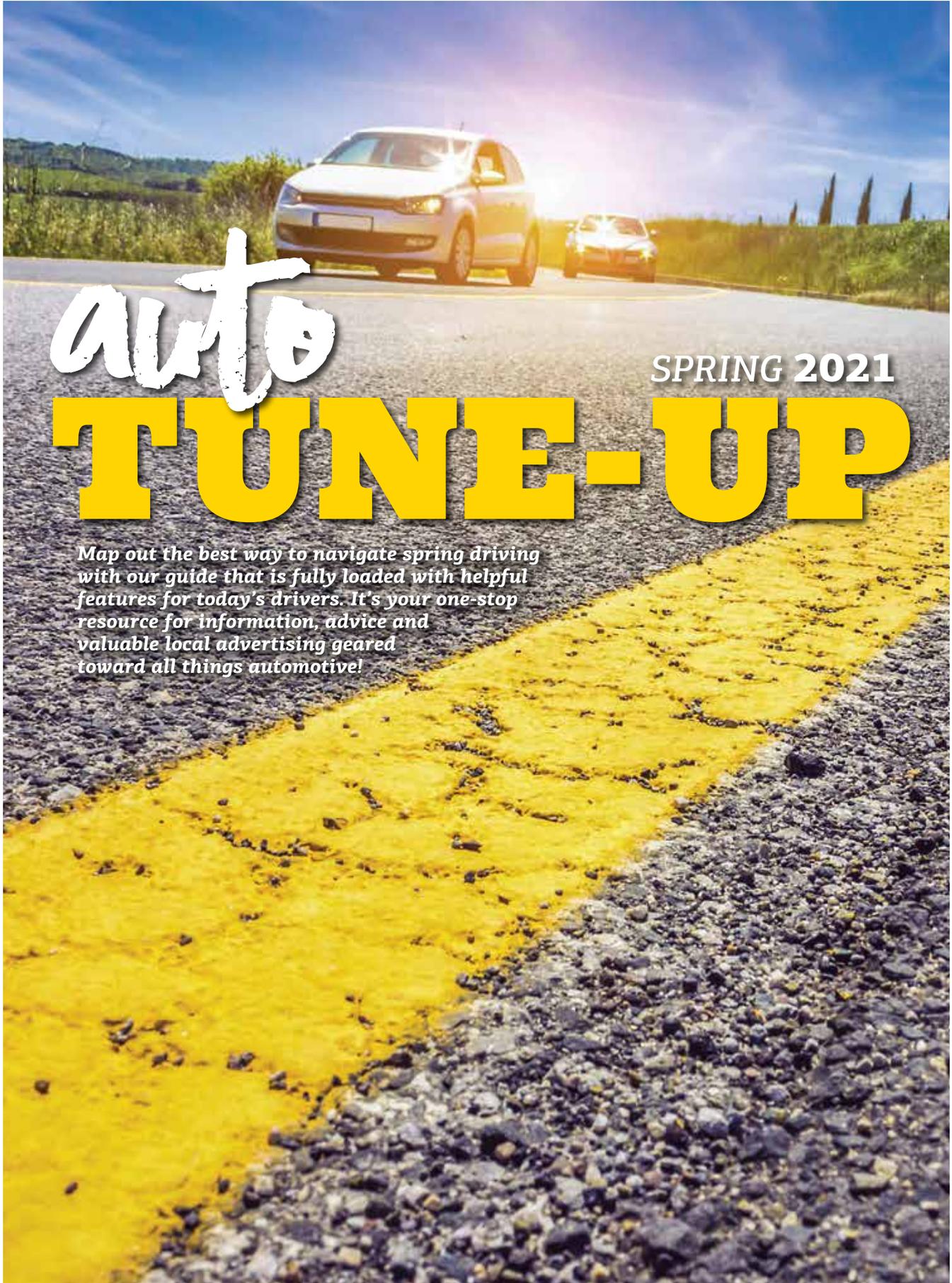
Whitecourt has adopted a 2021 Tourism Strategic Plan. The Plan identifies goals and initiatives for the marketing and promotion of Whitecourt as a year-round tourism destination.

Whitecourt has adopted Road Bans Bylaw 1564 which will aid in protecting local roads during the spring thaw and unseasonable weather conditions. When bans are in place, the posted axle weight on the majority of weight restricted roads will be lowered to 75%. For overweight vehicles that are travelling along area highways as well as local roads, the issuance of permits under this Bylaw will be completed by the Transportation Routing and Vehicle Information System-Multi Jurisdiction (TRAVIS-MJ). For overweight vehicles travelling within the community, permits will be issued by the Town of Whitecourt. Information on the bylaw, and details on how notices of the ban will be communicated to the public as well as permit application forms, will be posted on Whitecourt's website in the coming weeks.

Whitecourt is preparing a

request for proposals for a long-term growth plan. The study, which was identified in the 2020 Strategic Plan, will help guide future infrastructure, servicing and other long-term plans for the community for the next 50 years.

Whitecourt and Woodlands County are proceeding with voluntary arbitration to finalize an Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF) and new cost sharing agreements. Both municipalities have agreed that the decisions made through the arbitration process will be retro-active to January 1, 2020, and it is anticipated that new agreements will be finalized at the end of 2021. As Whitecourt is the main service provider, and continues to provide services to Woodlands County ratepayers, Whitecourt requested minimum partial payments totaling \$2.25 million to assist with related carrying costs for joint services. Woodlands County has paid \$500,000 towards 2020 services, and recently confirmed its intention to pay \$500,000 for 2021 services in June 2021. Due to this funding shortfall, Whitecourt will be reviewing cash flow projections and the financial impact on the 2021 final budget.

When Should You Replace Rotors and Brake Pads?

or feel for vibrations when deploying the brakes. Each of those signs may indicate brakes need to be replaced.

Replacing rotors

Like brake pads, rotors also will wear out over time. Brake rotors must meet a certain thickness to be considered safe. If they are below that thickness, then they must be fully replaced. Some drivers opt to have their rotors resurfaced. This means removing any grooves, hotspots or anomalies on the rotors that can cause uneven wear of the brake pads. However, if the rotors are too thin, they can-

not be resurfaced, as this removes some additional rotor material. Rotors can only be resurfaced once before replacement. Some vehicles have rotors that cannot be resurfaced at all.

Rotors can go thousands of miles before they need to be replaced, but vibrations while braking and squeaking noises are usually indicative that rotors need to be checked and/or replaced. Even though brake pads and rotors may wear out at different intervals, many automotive professionals advise replacing rotors when brake pads

are changed for optimal performance and safety.

Brakes are an essential safety component. Work with a qualified mechanic to have brake pads and

rotors serviced before wear and tear adversely affects driver safety and vehicle performance.

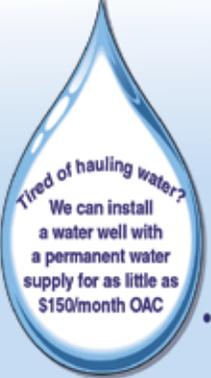
