HINTON RCMP **INVESTIGATE FATAL ALL-TERRAIN-**VEHICLE ROLLOVER

Hinton, Alta. - On May 21, 2021, at 5 p.m., Hinton RCMP received a call of a serious all-terrain-vehicle (ATV) rollover in the Brule sand dune area near the Town of Hinton.

Hinton RCMP attended, along with emergency medical services, and a 21-yearold female from Devon.

This Victoria Day long weekend, from May 21 - 24, Alberta RCMP removed 121 impaired drivers from our provincial roadways. In participation of National Impaired Driving Enforcement Day on Saturday, RCMP were out patrolling the highways and apprehending motorists under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Sixty-one motorists received Immediate Roadside Sanction (IRS) FAILs for

driving with blood alcohol concentrations of .08 or greater. It was the second or even third FAIL occurrence for six of these individuals. Twenty-five drivers received IRS WARNs with blood alcohol concentrations of 0.05 to 0.079. As well, 23 motorists holding GDL licences were issued suspensions and vehicle seizures due to having blood alcohol concentrations greater than zero.

Albertans made several 911 calls to the RCMP to report possible impaired driving. Nine of these calls resulted in the drivers being processed for impaired driving. One call resulted in officers calling for an ambulance, as the motorist was not impaired but rather having a medical episode.

GYPSD Transportation Services FAQ and Information Guide

What Transportation Services are Offered through GYPSD?

GYPSD strives to offer a range of services that are fair and equitable. Board Policy 17 is aligned with the province's Education Act and the Student Transportation Regulation. Services are available for:

- Eligible: Students who live more than 2.4 km away from their designated school
- Ineligible: Students who live less than 2.4 km away from their designated school
- School of Choice: Students who chose to attend a school other than their designated school
- Transportation Out of District: Students who chose to attend a different school jurisdiction
- Alternate Second Seat: Students who require a reserved second seat on a different bus to an alternate address

What Transportation Services are School Jurisdictions Funded to Provide?

Alberta Education Transportation Funding is for:

- Students residing more than 2.4 km away from their designated school
- Students with special needs who require specialized transportation

Under the School Transportation Regulation, school divisions are not required to transport students beyond their designated school.

How Do I Determine my Child's Designated School?

Please visit the Division's website at www.gypsd.ca under For Parents/Student Transportation and enter your home address on the link What is My Designated School?

Why does Transportation Services Charge Fees for Some Services?

Fees are established to support transportation services for the jurisdiction's families who request them and to ensure classroom dollars are not being used to address transportation service funding gaps.

User fees are charged to parents of students who access transportation services as a way to recover the unfunded costs. GYPSD service fees are amongst the lowest in the province.

How is Eligibility for Transportation Determined?

- Alberta Education provides funding to eligible riders only.
- The distance of 2.4 kms for busing to the student's designated school is set by Alberta Education.
- The government sets eligibility based on the student's primary residence address and distance from home to designated school.

Do I Need to Register for the Bus?

NEW for the 2021/2022 School Year: All new and returning students requiring transportation services must register. Registration is now open.

How Do I Register for the Bus?

Registration for transportation services is at www.gypsd.ca under For Parents/Student Transportation. Only eligible riders are guaranteed a seat each year. All other riders are subject to seat availability.

GOVERNMENT OF CANADA TO REIMBURSE SELF-EMPLOYED WORKERS WHO REPAID THE CERB

Over the course of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Government of Canada has introduced historic measures to support Canadians, including the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB). The CERB helped more than 8 million Canadians pay for things like food and rent when we first asked people to stay home and flatten the curve.

The CERB's eligibility criteria were made as broad and inclusive as possible so that workers who needed support could get it; especially for the self-employed whose income takes different forms.

As announced in February,

self-employed workers who applied for the CERB and would have qualified based on their gross income are not required to repay the benefit, provided they also met all other eligibility criteria. Today, the Government of Canada announced further details on how this approach will be applied.

Self-employed workers whose net self-employment income was less than \$5,000 and who applied for the CERB will not be required to repay the CERB, as long as:

• They have filed their 2019 and 2020 income tax returns by December 31, 2022;

• Their gross self-employment income was \$5,000 or more in 2019 or in the 12 months prior to their initial application; and

• They met all other CERB eligibility criteria.

The ČRA will review the 2019 and 2020 income tax returns of workers in this situation to verify that these conditions are met.

Starting on May 27, 2021, self-employed workers who meet the remission order criteria and who had voluntarily repaid all or part of the CERB to the CRA or Service Canada can request a reimbursement of their payments only from the CRA. These workers can do so by completing the CRA's CERB Reimbursement Application for Self-Employed Individuals form and submitting it to the CRA electronically or by mail.

The ČRA will begin processing applications after June 15, 2021. Eligible Canadians who repaid the CERB can expect reimbursements within approximately 90 days of submitting their applications to the CRA.

Quick Facts

• The Canada Emergency Response Benefit and Employment Insurance Emergency Response Benefit Remission Order grants relief of the col-lection of certain overpayments and certain payments of the CERB for self-employed individuals who applied for the CERB and would have qualified based on their gross income. The remission order was approved by the Administrator in Council on the recommendation of the Minister of Employment and Social Development Canada and Treasury Board on April 30, 2021.

• The remission order for self-employed individuals is published in the Canada Gazette.

• Individuals who have not made a repayment to the CRA or Service Canada and meet the eligibility criteria for the remission order do not need to contact the CRA or Service Canada to confirm that they will not have to repay the CERB.

• The CRA may reassess 2020 income tax returns for individuals who are reimbursed CERB repayments, to reflect the CERB as appropriate. If necessary, the T4A slip or RL-1 slip will be amended to include the full CERB amount received in 2020 and the income tax return adjusted accordingly. Workers who received the CERB from Service Canada will receive an amended T4E slip, if necessary.

• The application period for the CERB closed on December 2, 2020. Individuals can only be reimbursed for periods that they repaid. Individuals cannot apply for the CERB retroactively.

TIPS FOR NEWCOMERS TO THE GAME OF GOLF

Many golfers don't have time to hit the links during the week, but they do have time to watch some DVDs when they get home from work. Such instructional DVDs can help you master your grip and stance, which you can then take with you to the course over the weekend.

* Have fun. Golf is a fun game; it just takes time to hone your skills. But even if you aren't ready for the professional tour after your first few rounds, you can still have fun. Don't let some beginner's frustration, which every golfer experiences, ruin the fun of the game. Take note of your surroundings when you hit the links, and appreciate the time you're spending with your group. If the game becomes more a source of frustration than fun, then take a break and put in some more work away from the course, be it at the driving range or studying at home.







THE MAVERICK PARTY: HOW THE WEST CAN BE ONE!

The Maverick Party will be running a candidate in the Sturgeon River-Parkland riding in the next federal election. Just as the West was won by adventurers, the party is looking for innovative risk-takers who are willing to stand up for Western Canadians in Ottawa. Former MP Jay Hill is leading the charge, running candidates only in the four Western provinces (Alberta, Saskatchewan, British Columbia and Manitoba). The party is taking a hard stance: Western Canada will no longer appease the wants and needs of Ontario and Quebec. The system is broken and the Maverick Party is determined to get Western Canada a fair deal.

When asked about why we need a "Maverick" in

Sturgeon River-Parkland, Ed Toupin, President of the Maverick Party's Electoral District Association. doesn't hold back: "Our constituency has been hit hard by job losses in the energy sector, caused by Justin Trudeau and his anti-Alberta policies, and area families are suffering. Through equalization payments and other forms of taxation, there is a significant wealth transfer from West to East. And unfortunately, the deck is stacked against us with unequal representation in the House of Commons, the Senate and the Canadian Supreme Court."

Toupin also indicates Trudeau is killing the economic advantage of the West: "Capital investment in Western Canada has dried up and there is a significant "brain drain" leaving the West. We've had enough!"

The Maverick Party's twintrack approach includes gunning for constitutional amendments to level the playing field for Western Canada within confederation. The "Save Canada" approach includes seeking constitutional amendments to market access, provincial rights, property rights, provincial self-governance, and fair representation. In the absence of securing these amendments, the Maverick Party will work to lay the foundation for an independent Western Nation.

Due to Ottawa's draconian policies targeting the West, the Maverick Party advocates scrapping the existing Equalization Formula and repealing Bill C-48 (North Pacific tanker ban), Bill C-69 (No-new pipelines), and the carbon tax. The Maverick Party also supports cancelling the Liberal gun grab and defunding the CBC. For more information on the Maverick Party's platform please visit maverickparty.ca/policy-platform.

When asked why Sturgeon River-Parkland constituents should vote for the Maverick Party, and not the Conservative Party of Canada (CPC), Toupin has this to say: "Even with (Erin) O'Toole's carbon tax flip flop and now his support for Quebec unilaterally changing the constitution, the Western Canadian CPC MPs are unwilling or unable to go against party lines. The Maverick Party is the answer for fair and accountable representation for the West in Ottawa and - if staying is unattainable - we will walk away from confederation and build a better future for our children and grandchildren.'

Toupin optimistically notes that the West already has what it takes to get 'er done: "I have great faith in the work ethic and can-do attitude of Western Canadians. Their unwavering determination will always drive the Maverick spirit here in the West."
