Alberta residents over the age of 18 who have received at least one dose of vaccine can register to be entered in

the draw for the \$1-million prize.

Details on how to register will be announced on June 14.

Registration will close one week after 70 per cent

of eligible Albertans have received a first dose. The winner will be drawn when Stage 3 of Alberta's Open for Summer Plan begins.

the huge wooden wall-hung model (as well as the switchboard used to put the call through) right to the early cell phones before they became an automatic part of a person's clothing.

The museum inherited many plaques listing the students who got honors in their grades. Come and look for your name or someone you know. There are plaques from 1979-80 to 2012-2013 (some years missing).

Exhibits of cameras, lamps and lanterns, radios – the list goes on. Look for the sewing machine used to cobble shoes.

The exhibit of Indigenous leatherwork is especially meaningful locally. Mary Gray was a local Métis lady who lived east of Onoway but eventually moved to Onoway to the property where the stone barn once stood. The museum also proudly displays a cupboard made by her husband Ambrose Gray circa 1930.

And watch for the dining room table that was brought to Onoway by the Beaupré family pre-1912 on a Red River cart. Can you imagine hauling this piece of furniture across the country on a horse-drawn cart?! How important it must have been!

Onoway Museum is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 to 3:00. Put a visit on your to-do list (and remember to wear a mask). A visit opens the doors to many memories and stories to share between generations.

# SUPPORTING THE TRANSITION OF CANADA'S ECONOMY TO A LOW-CARBON FUTURE

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise that on June 9th the Minister of Innovation, Science and Industry, the Premier of Alberta, and the Mayor of Edmonton, announced their governments are working closely with Air Products Canada Ltd. to advance clean energy in Canada and jointly pursue a transformative \$1.3 billion net-zero hydrogen production investment. The clean hydrogen facility would be operational by 2024, a first-mover anchor to secure Canada's early foothold in the global hydrogen market, pending further discussions and a final scope decision from the company.

The Government of Canada and Invest Alberta have each signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the company on potentially supporting the expansion of its hydrogen network and the transition to clean energy. This would involve the company building a new world-scale facility in the Edmonton region to produce clean hydrogen. This project would enable Air Products Canada Ltd. to produce hydrogen-fuelled electricity and provide liquid hydrogen for the growing transportation market, as well as other key industrial sectors.

# AIR CANADA EXTENDS DEADLINE OF ITS COVID-19 REFUND POLICY

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise that Air Canada has extended its deadline of its COVID-19 Refund Policy by 30 Days. Eligible customers have until July 12, 2021 to submit a refund request.

The policy allows eligible customers who purchased a non-refundable ticket before

April 13, 2021 for travel on or after February 1, 2020, but who did not fly for any reason, to submit their request for a refund online or with their travel agent.

The policy also applies to Air Canada Vacations packages. Customers who booked through a travel agency must contact their agent directly. In support of its travel agency partners, Air Canada is not recalling agency sales commissions on refunded tickets that they process.

## Open for Summer Lottery for First Doses

"This lottery will help us cross that 70 per cent threshold so we can reopen and stay open. Albertans have already responded in such a big way to our vaccine program and we've been able to lift many health restrictions because of their efforts. We just need one final push so we can lift them all and get back to normal. If you've been waiting to book or you've been looking for a reason to get the shot, here it is." - Jason Kenney, Premier

More than 68.5 per cent of eligible Albertans have received their first dose, including 19.2 per cent who are fully vaccinated with two doses.

As of June 12, there are

64,535 appointments booked over the next seven days for first doses. Currently, Alberta is projected to hit the 70 per cent milestone and start the twoweek countdown to Stage 3 of Alberta's Open for Summer Plan on June 18.

"The arrival and uptake of the COVID-19 vaccines in our province have accomplished extraordinary

things. It's only fitting that we respond in kind with a once-in-a-lifetime event in Alberta. This lottery is an investment in Albertans and our province's economic future. I am confident that we will see that final upswing in vaccinations to take us across that finish line to widespread immunity." - Tyler Shandro, Minister of Health

Alberta's government is responding to the COVID-19 pandemic by protecting lives and livelihoods with precise measures to bend the curve, sustain small businesses and protect Alberta's health-care system.

Quick facts

• Alberta's Open for Summer Plan safely eases restrictions in three stages as vaccination targets are reached and hospitalizations decline.

• Stage 3 will occur two weeks after 70 per cent of eligible Albertans have received at least one dose of vaccine.

• To be eligible for the lottery, you must:

- Reside in Alberta at the time of the draw.

- Be 18 years of age and older.

- Be able to provide proof of receiving your dose of an approved vaccine for the draw.

• Anyone who has already received one dose is eligible to enter the lottery.

• Any Albertan 18 or older who received vaccines out of province is also eligible, provided they have submitted proof of vaccination to AHS and meet all other eligibility criteria.

# **COVID-19 UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT**

#### JUNE 9, 2021

Stage 2 of the Government of Alberta's Open for Summer Plan starts on Thursday, June 10. Under Stage 2 the Province has eased some mandatory restrictions as vaccine targets have been reached and hospitalizations have declined across Alberta. Distancing and masking requirements remain in effect across the province.

Allan & Jean Millar Centre re-opens June 10

With the easing of restrictions, portions of the Allan & Jean Millar Centre will reopen to the public on Thursday, June 10; however, hours and capacity will be limited as provincial public health guidelines remain in place. Until further notice, hours of operations for the facility are:

Monday: 5:45am - 6:00pm

Tuesday: 8:30am – 8:00pm Wednesday: 5:45am – 6:00pm

Thursday: 8:30am – 8:00pm Friday: 5:45am – 6:00pm Saturday: 9:00am – 12:00pm Sunday: Closed

As access to the Allan & Jean Millar Centre remains limited, all memberships remain on hold at this time; however, current members will be provided the option to either pay the daily admission rate, or purchase a one-month membership with an additional 15% discount. For further information, please contact the Allan & Jean Millar Centre at 780-778-3637.

Distancing is required in all areas of the facility. Masks must be worn upon entering the facility until you reach the area you will be active in. Masks can then be removed while working out or playing a sport. Please put masks back on after you are done the activity and when leaving the facility.

• Drop-in is allowed (up to a capacity limit).

• 3-metres of distance must be maintained between all guests and staff in the Pembina Fitness Centre and Rotary Running Track at all times (unless from the same household).

Fitness Classes

• Outdoor fitness classes and member only virtual classes will continue.

• Indoor fitness classes will resume. Please visit rec.whitecourt.ca to register, 3-metres must be maintained between all participants and staff at all times.

Child Mind will be available Monday - Friday 9:00am -12:00pm, and Saturday from 10:00am-2:00pm.

The Whitecourt McDonalds Go Active Zone remains closed until further notice.

The Energy Transfer Canada Aquatic Centre remains closed until further notice as an emergency repair is being completed due to a pipe break. The Aquatic Centre is anticipated to open for the Heritage Day weekend.

Forest Interpretive Centre re-opens June 14

The Forest Interpretive Centre will be open for visitor information services, and available for public rentals (within the guidelines of current public health regulations) as of Monday, June 14. The facility will be open Monday to Friday 8:30am to 4:30pm (closed between 12:00 and 1:00pm).

Stage 2 of the Open for Summer Plan

As part of the Province's Open for Summer Plan, the following come into effective as of June 10:

• Outdoor social gatherings of up to 20 people is permitted with distancing (indoor social gatherings still not permitted);

• Indoor recreation, entertainment and other settings (recreation centres, arenas, casinos, cinemas, theatres, museums, galleries, libraries, etc.) can open at 1/3 of fire code occupancy;

• Gyms and fitness studios can open for solo and drop-in activities and indoor fitness classes with 3-metre distancing;

• Funeral services can be held with up to 20 people, indoors and outdoors (receptions permitted outdoors only);

• Wedding ceremonies can be held with up to 20 people, indoors and outdoors (receptions permitted outdoors only);

• Places of worship can hold in-person services for 1/3 of fire code occupancy;

· Personal and wellness ser-

vices can resume walk-in service;

• Post-secondary schools can resume in-person learn-ing;

• Restaurants can open both indoor and outdoor with 6 people per table maximum;

• Retail occupancy rates increase to 1/3 of fire code occupancy (must maintain ability to distance);

• Youth activities (day camps, overnight camps, play centres) can resume with restrictions;

• Youth and adult sports can resume with no restrictions, indoors and outdoors;

• Outdoor public gatherings (concerts/festivals) can be held with up to 150 people;

• Outdoor fixed seating facilities (grandstands) can operate at 1/3 seated capacity;

• The work from home order is lifted but still recommended;

# **ADJUSTING GOLF SWING GETS EASIER**

Golfers rejoice! Those dreaded slices or hooks could become a thing of the distant past thanks to adjustable clubs and drivers. In addition to helping improve accuracy, adjustable clubs also lighten the load in your golf bag.

With a few twists of a wrench or even turning the shaft of the driver itself, golfers can adjust the face angle, loft and lie angle of the driver to hit the ball farther and straighter. Golfers can make small adjustments to create the right loft and improve distance without having to purchase a new club or visit a club fitter.

Many club manufacturers now offer adjustable drivers and other clubs. According to an informal poll on Golf.com, 34 percent of the 2,337 respondents owned an adjustable driver by the end of 2011. The ability to upgrade shafts has also become popular as golfers respond to what the pros are doing.

Adjustable golf clubs enable golfers to walk out onto the course with one driver and a few different shafts. With a couple of clicks from a wrench, a person can have an en-

tirely new driver. That cuts down on the equipment that needs to be carried and can fine tune a golfer's accuracy. These high-tech clubs are corresponding to changes being made to golf balls. Engineers have reduced the spin on golf balls to help the balls travel farther. To do so, golf experts advise that the ball needs to be hit higher into the air. Adjustable drivers can give players the edge they need to produce the right height and trajectory. According to data from

golf club manufacturer TaylorMade, 70 percent of consumers who use the company's adjustable drivers adjust their club at least once to get the desired shot. Afterward, 10 to 15 percent of adjustable driver users report further adjustments as they become comfortable with the features.

Although golfers can now put adjustments into their own hands, it is still advisable to get a professional fitting regardless of which clubs are chosen. A certified club fitter can help a person sort through the myriad options available and make recommendations based on various factors, including the golf ball used.

Those who are not fans of adjustable drivers say that the adjustment mechanisms add weight to the drivers, which can compromise efficiency. However, that isn't stopping larger numbers of golf fans from taking adjustable drivers for a trial run in an effort to improve their game.
