### MAYERTHORPE RCMP RESPONDS TO FATAL MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

On Sept. 10, shortly after 1 a.m., Mayerthorpe RCMP responded to a report of a fatal pedestrian motor vehicle collision along the West Road, on Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation. Mayerthorpe

RCMP, Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation Emergency Fire Service, Emergency Medical Services ground ambulance and STARS attended. Preliminary investigation reveals a vehicle was heading westbound when it appears to have collided with a female pedestrian.

The vehicle then lost control, went off the roadway, entered the ditch and rolled. The 27-year-old female pedestrian of Glenevis, Alta., was declared deceased on scene.

### PARKLAND RCMP RESPOND TO INJURY COLLISION INVOLVING SEMI-TRACTOR TANKER TRUCK

Parkland RCMP, Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services, and Alberta Health Services attended the area of Hwy 43 and Hwy 33, Lac Ste. Anne County in response to a report of a two vehicle motor

vehicle collision involving a panel van and a fuel tanker.

As a result of the collision the fuel was ignited causing a large fire that blocked traffic in all directions.

The fire crews were unable to extinguish the blaze due to the nature of the fuel. Traffic in the area was

closed in all directions due to the size of the blaze.

Both drivers were treated on scene by Emergency Medical Services and transported to hospitals in Edmonton via ground ambulance.

The 44-year-old lone male driver, of Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation, Alta., sustained serious injuries and was airlifted by STARS, to an Edmonton area hospital. The driver sustained serious injuries and remains in

hospital, currently in stable condition. Weather and road conditions do not appear to have been a factor in this collision.

Mayerthorpe RCMP investigation is on-going. Police have been in contact with next of kin. RCMP will continue to liaise with the

family and the community. Alberta RCMP Collision Analyst and a Criminal Collision Investigation Team was engaged and attended the scene and are assisting in this investigation. An update will be provided when available.

Chief Medical Examiner are investigating this discovery of human remains.

# COVID-19 UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

Alberta has declared a state of public health emergency and has implemented new health measures to expand capacity, increase vaccination rates and reduce transmission of COVID-19. Measures in workplaces, indoor private gatherings, places of worship, schools and children's activities, as well as mandatory masking and physical distancing in all indoor public spaces are in effect. The Province has also introduced a Restrictions Exemption Program that will begin Monday, September 20. Discretionary events and businesses (restaurants, recreation facilities, retail businesses, etc.) must either adopt the Program, or follow capacity and operation restrictions that will come into effect September 20. Businesses that implement the Restrictions Exemption Program would operate as usual, provided they are serv-

ing only people who have proof of immunization or who have a recent privately paid negative test, as per the requirements in place. For more information on the program visit [www.alberta.ca/covid-19-public-health-actions.aspx](http://www.alberta.ca/covid-19-public-health-actions.aspx).

Impact to Town Operations  
Allan & Jean Millar Centre

The Town of Whitecourt will be implementing the Restrictions Exemption Program at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre.

Starting September 20, users and spectators at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre will be re-

quired to show proof of vaccination or a recent privately paid negative COVID-19 test. Users and sport spectators will be required to provide:

- Proof of double vaccination (note that for a transitional period between September 20 and October 25, proof of a single dose would be considered acceptable as long as the dose was given two weeks or more before the time of service).

- Documentation of medical exemption for those with a vaccine exemption.

- Proof of a recent (within the previous 72 hours) negative COVID-19 test (either PCR or Rapid Test). Per provincial guidelines, the test may not be from Alberta Health Services or Alberta Precision Laboratories.

Please note:

- Those under age 12 will not need to provide proof of immunization or a negative test to enter the facility.

- For those 18 and under, proof of vaccination is not required when participating in recreational organized sport or school activities (i.e. minor soccer).

The Allan & Jean Millar Centre is being used as a voting station for the 2021 Federal Election on September 20. Those attending the facility to vote will not be required to meet the requirements of the Restrictions Exemption Program.

The Aquatic Centre at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre will reopen to the public on September 20. Please visit the Allan & Jean Millar Facebook page for a current schedule.

As all areas of the facility will be open for use starting next week, Allan & Jean Millar Centre memberships will be re-instated.

Members that will be unable to attend the facility due to the Restrictions Exemption Program should contact the facility at 780-778-3637 to discuss options.

Forest Interpretive Centre

- The Forest Interpretive Centre will operate at 1/3 fire code capacity. The facility will remain available for business and approved support group rentals.

- Masks and 2 metres physical distancing are required.

# WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

In light of the current COVID-19 situation, all Council and Council Committee meetings will be held via electronic format until further notice. Meetings will be livestreamed using Zoom via the Whitecourt YouTube channel.

- Council and Policies and Priorities Committee meetings have been temporarily rescheduled to 4:00 p.m.

- Public Input Sessions held at the beginning of Council and Policies and Priorities Committee meetings will be conducted by written correspondence only. Residents are asked to submit comments to Council by email at [administration@whitecourt.ca](mailto:administration@whitecourt.ca) or by regular mail at Box 509, Whitecourt, T7S 1N6. This format will also be used for the 2022 Budget Public Input Session; submissions can be made via the above noted means by 12 noon on September 22. The Ad Hoc Building Steering Committee for the proposed Municipal Centre project presented information to Council on progress the Committee has made in planning the facility. It is proposed that the facility be located in the downtown area, backing onto Rotary Park, to tie into the downtown business corridor and complement components of the Sportfield Master Plan.

- Detailed designs are being completed which will provide cost estimates for the project broken down by component (arts & culture centre, library and Town administration office).

- Once costing is received, the Committee is proposing to roll out a public education campaign to inform the public of the proposed facility and provide a means for community members' questions to be answered. The public education campaign is expected to roll-out in the winter of 2021/2022.

The Oaths of Office Ceremony for the new Whitecourt Town Council is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, Oc-

tober 23. Council Orientation dates have also been scheduled to provide a comprehensive briefing for all new elected officials on municipal operations, policies and procedures.

Whitecourt Town Council has awarded approximately \$18,000 in funding to community organizations via the Vitalization Grant Program. The program assists property owners in the Downtown Core or along the Highway 43 Corridor to upgrade the façade of their building to meet Whitecourt's

stone and wood architectural theme.

Whitecourt Town Council has proclaimed September 18-26, 2021 as National Coaches Week. Community members are encouraged to submit nominations for local coaches as part of the recognition event.

Whitecourt Town Council has proclaimed September 20-26, 2021 as Rail Safety Week. All residents are encouraged to practice safe behaviour around tracks and trains to eliminate

injuries and fatalities.

In partnership with a number of community organizations and agencies, Whitecourt will be sponsoring the 2021 Career and Education Expo on October 21, 2021. # VACCINATION INCENTIVE LAUNCHES

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Eligible Albertans can now register to get a \$100 debit card for receiving a first or second dose of COVID-19 vaccine.

This one-time incentive is for all Albertans age 18 or older who receive either a first or second dose of vaccine between Sept. 3 and Oct. 14.

“Vaccines offer the best protection from COVID-19

– we’ve seen the results of vaccination, right here in Alberta. The more Albertans we can encourage to get vaccinated, the safer all of us will be. This incentive is just the latest in a number of approaches we’ve used to make the vaccines accessible and available to all eligible Albertans. Now is the time to get your shot.”

After vaccination, individuals can go to [alberta.ca/VaccineDebitCard](http://alberta.ca/VaccineDebitCard) and register online to receive a prefilled debit card. Alberta Health will validate all registrations against provincial immunization data. CIBC will distribute the debit cards on behalf of the Government of Alberta.

The first 15,000 Albertans will receive their debit cards in October. Debit cards for additional eligible registrants will be delivered in November and December.

Albertans who do not have access to a computer or a mobile device can phone 310-0000 for assistance.

Vaccine lottery

All Albertans who have received two doses of vaccine and are aged 18 and over are eligible for the remaining \$1-million draw for Alberta’s vaccine lottery. To register and for complete details, visit [alberta.ca/lottery](http://alberta.ca/lottery). The final draw closes Sept. 23.

# BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR NAKAMUN LAKE

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Nakamun Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

- Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.
- Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.
- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.
- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Nakamun Lake at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experi-

ence skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect

for Nakamun Lake, until further notice.

Please note that areas of Nakamun Lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this blue-green algae Health Advisory is in place.

## PREPARING YOUR FIREPLACE OR STOVE FOR THE SEASON

Fireplaces and wood-burning stoves not only can be beautiful focal points within a home, but they also provide an additional source of heat and can be used to keep rooms or entire homes comfortable without the need for additional and potentially costly heating sources.

Just like more modern home heating systems, stoves and fireplaces need to be maintained, and that maintenance includes readying them before winter when they

are used more heavily. Ensuring a fireplace or stove is in good working order helps to guarantee efficiency of use and safety during the winter months.

Open-flame heating sources carry with them certain risks. The National Fire Protection Association states that, between 2009-2013, American fire departments responded to 56,000 home structure fires that involved heating equipment. The NFPA notes that the

leading factor contributing to home-heating fires is a failure to keep things clean, principally from solid-fueled heating equipment. The following are a handful of ways to stay safe as you get ready for another cozy season around the fire.

Start with the chimney. Begin by having your chimney thoroughly cleaned and inspected. Creosote can build up inside of the chimney. Creosote is highly flammable and

becomes more difficult and expensive to clean the longer it builds up inside your flue lining. In addition, animals may have created nest inside of the chimney since the last time the fireplace was used. A professional chimney sweep should be hired in this situation. He or she will be able to effectively clean the chimney in a manner that is the least messy and disruptive to residents.

•Install or check smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Operational alarms are essential to preventing injury or death resulting from smoke or carbon monoxide inhalation. Such detectors are inexpensive safeguards that should be installed on every floor of the house. Batteries should be replaced every six months, and the alarms themselves should be changed every five to 10

years.  
 •Inspect the chimney from outdoors as well. Inspect the mortar around any bricks in the chimney and surrounding areas for cracks. If left unaddressed, these can cause dangerous fires. If there are serious cracks, a professional may need to make repairs or the chimney may need to be replaced. You also can have the chimney capped with a screen to keep animals and debris from entering.  
 •Inspect the damper.

A damper is a valve or plate that stops or regulates the flow of air inside a chimney. It should be checked prior to the first use of a stove or fireplace so homeowners can be certain it opens and closes smoothly.

•Clear out flammable items. Move flammable items away from the front of a fireplace or stove. Be sure curtains or other home furnishings are far enough away that they will not catch fire from any errant sparks or flames.

•Order wood now. Be sure there is plenty of wood for the season. Ask a wood supplier to estimate just how much will be needed, and double-check that the wood will arrive in time for the start of the season.

By preparing for fireplace and wood stove use now, homeowners can ensure their winters are comfortable and safe.

**5 WAYS TO MAKE HOMES SAFER**

Injuries that occur around the home contribute to millions of medical visits and tens of thousands of fatalities each year. Falls account for the largest percentage of home accidents, with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reporting that around 30,000 fall-related fatalities occur each year in the United States. Many home accidents are entirely preventable when proper caution is exercised.

As homeowners pre-

pare for home-improvement projects, improving safety inside and outside the home should be a priority.

**1. Improve lighting**

One of the easiest ways to reduce the risk of falls is to improve lighting around the home. The National Institutes of Health state that adequate lighting is important at entrances to the home, stairways, hallways, and other frequently traversed areas. Make sure lighting fixtures are using the high-

est wattage light bulb allowed. Artificial lighting sources become even more vital in fall and autumn, when natural light is less abundant in a home. In addition, install lighting outdoors by the front door, over the garage and where garbage pails are stored to facilitate safe passage.

**2. Eliminate slick surfaces**

Improving traction around the house also can minimize falls.

Throw rugs and runners can be made more secure with nonslip rubber backings. Bath rugs can reduce slipping on wet surfaces in the bathroom. Also, nonslip mats can be used inside of showers and bathtubs.

Use shoe trays to reduce puddling from melting snow or rain runoff in entryways. Mop up spills quickly, and consider the use of matte- or textured-finished flooring to improve stability underfoot.

Promptly remove snow and ice from driveways and walkways. For those who live in cold climates, heated concrete can help melt precipitation before it accumulates.

3. Make needed repairs  
Repair loose floorboards and pull carpet taut if it has started to stretch out. Address cracks outdoors and ensure that patio stones, bricks and pavers are secure and level to reduce tripping hazards. Fix areas of the landscape where water may pool

and freeze, creating potential hazards.

4. Declutter all spaces  
Remove unnecessary items and furniture from rooms to free up more space to get around. Be sure there are no obstructions in walkways, entryways and near doors. Keep staircases clear at all times.

5. Invest in assistive devices

Handrails, grab bars, nonslip stair treads, and many other devices can make homes safer for people of all ages and

abilities. Outfit cabinets and closets with organizers that put frequently used items within easy reach. A sturdy step stool can reduce the risk of injury while reaching for items stored on high shelves.

# ST. ALBERT RCMP WARN CITIZENS ABOUT FACEBOOK FRAUD SCAM

St. Albert RCMP received a complaint about a citizen who fell prey to a relationship/dating scam. The individual met the scammer on the Facebook Dating App, and began a friendship for approximately 6 months. They communicated on Facebook and on a App called "Telegram." The male stated he was a doctor in the military on a mission overseas.

After several months of communicating online their friendship moved into a ro-

mantic online relationship. In early June the fraudster indicated he needed money for his son's birthday present (a piano), who resided in the United States while he was overseas. The St. Albert resident wire transferred \$7500 USD, to a bank account in the United States, thinking it was for the birthday present. The citizen realized, after-the-fact, that it was a scam and the money was lost.

This is just one of many relationship scams circulating in Canada. St. Albert RCMP want to warn citizens about such scams and how

to protect yourself from being victimized. Here are a few ways on "How to Spot a Scam:"

- Calls from unfamiliar area codes or numbers.
- Emails from unknown senders or addresses.
- Online or over the phone requests for immediate payments, money transfers, e-transfers, or gifts cards, (this includes individuals one meets through dating apps)
- When personal or financial information is requested via text, or email.

• Pre-recorded phone messages or voice-mails from banks or government agencies.

• Be extra cautious when dealing with cheques from unknown parties.

• If you're unfamiliar with how cryptocurrencies work, you should avoid dealing in them.

# FIRST NEW TREATMENT FOR ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE APPROVED IN NEARLY TWO DECADES OFFERS HOPE FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH DEMENTIA

The Alzheimer Society of Canada is hopeful about the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) approval of aducanumab, a new treatment for Alzheimer's disease. This news represents an important step forward for people living with Alzheimer's disease. The FDA requires that Biogen complete an additional clinical trial to verify the drug's

benefit. If the trial fails to verify the clinical benefit, the FDA may initiate proceedings to withdraw approval. For aducanumab to be available in Canada, the drug will require regulatory approval by Health Canada to ensure its safety and efficacy. The Alzheimer Society of Canada is urging Health Canada to complete its required reviews swiftly, while maintaining the highest safety standards, so that aducanumab can be made

available as quickly as possible to people living with dementia in Canada.

While this approval is encouraging, aducanumab is not suitable for all people at all stages of dementia. The drug may slow the decline in cognitive skills and functional ability in people living with Mild Cognitive Impairment (MCI) or in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease. Aducanumab is reported to work by clearing harmful amyloid beta

that builds up in the brain, which is thought to result in Alzheimer's disease.




