COVID-19 UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

As we head into the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, we ask that community members be mindful of current provincial public health measures announced by the Government of Alberta on October 5.

Indoor Social Gatherings

- For those that are vaccinated – Indoor, private social gatherings are limited to two households up to a maximum of 10 vaccine-eligible, vaccinated people. (There are no restrictions on children under 12.)

- For those that are unvaccinated – Indoor social gatherings are not permitted for vaccine-eligible people who are unvaccinated.

Outdoor social gatherings

- Outdoor private social gatherings limited to a maximum of 20 people, with 2 metre physical distancing between households at all times.

- Events like outdoor funerals and weddings are not impacted by this change. These events are permitted up to 200 people and must follow liquor sales and consumption restrictions unless the hosting facility implements the Restrictions Exemption Program.

The Province also announced new public reporting and safety measures that will be implemented within schools across Alberta. For details, please visit www.alberta.ca/k-12-learning-during-covid-19.aspx.

Vaccine Program

More than 84% of eligible Albertans are now protected with at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine, and 75% are fully vaccinated. Vaccines dramatically reduce the risk of severe outcomes and the risk of infection.

Vaccines are the most powerful tool in the fight against COVID-19. Vaccine appointments are widely available through Alberta Health Services or participating pharmacies and physician clinics. Book yours at alberta.ca/

vaccine. First doses are also available at select walk-in clinic locations.

In addition to Albertans aged 75 and older, and First Nations, Métis and Inuit people aged 65 and older, third doses are available for seniors living in congregate care. These individuals are at the highest risk of severe outcomes and potential spread

within congregate living sites, and will receive their doses on-site. A number of immunocompromising conditions also qualify for an additional dose at least eight weeks after a second dose. For a full list, visit alberta.ca/vaccine. Additional mRNA doses are also available to Albertans who are travelling to a jurisdiction that does not accept visitors

who have been vaccinated with Covishield/AstraZeneca or mixed doses. Anyone in the general population who receives a complete twodose COVID-19 vaccine series can be confident that they have strong protection against severe illness and hospitalization due to COVID-19.

COVID-19 VACCINE AND PREGNANCY

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Is the COVID-19 vaccine safe during pregnancy?

- The COVID-19 vaccine is safe for pregnant individuals and their babies.
- It is much safer to get the vaccine than to get COVID-19 disease.
- You can get the vaccine at any time (any trimester) during pregnancy.
- The mRNA vaccines are the safest type of COVID-19

vaccine to get during your pregnancy.

- The COVID-19 vaccine is also safe, and recommended, for those who are trying to get pregnant.
 - The National Advisory Committee on Immunization and the Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Canada recommend that those who are pregnant get a complete series of vaccine.
- What are the benefits of getting the COVID-19 vac-

cine?

- The vaccine prevents illness and lowers your chance of becoming seriously ill from COVID-19.
 - Vaccines also lower your chance of you having complications of severe illness, which could result in delivering your baby prematurely if you become very sick.
 - Immunization can reduce the spread of the virus to others, including your baby.
- Does the vaccine protect my baby from COVID-19?

• Vaccines make your immune system stronger by building antibodies to help prevent disease.

- Vaccination allows immunity to be passed from mother to infant, helping to protect your baby for the first few months of life.

What are the risks of being infected with COVID-19 if I'm pregnant?

- If you're pregnant and have COVID-19: You're at higher risk of being admitted to hospital and developing complications that need intensive care. You're more likely to have a premature birth and this may put your baby's health at risk.

• Serious complications related to COVID-19 are more common if you're pregnant than if you're not pregnant (for individuals of child bearing age).

Does the vaccine cause fertility problems?

- There is no evidence that COVID-19 vaccines cause fertility problems.
- Studies evaluating male and female fertility metrics after COVID-19 vaccines have not identified any harms to reproductive health.

• COVID-19 vaccine is also a good proactive step to take even before pregnancy.

What's right for you?

- Different people have different feelings and concerns about COVID-19 immunization, and that's OK. But we should all have the same information and support each other to learn more.

• Review current evidence in order to make the best and most informed decision about your health and the health of your baby.

- Speak with your health-care provider if you have questions or concerns. In consultation with them, you can determine if the benefits of immunization outweigh potential risks based on your health and circumstances.



AHS CONTINUES TO SCHEDULE PRIORITIZED CANCER SURGERIES

There have been some social media posts suggesting that emergent or urgent cancer surgeries have been delayed as a result of COVID-19 - this is not the case.

Alberta Health Services (AHS) continues to perform all emergent or urgent cancer surgeries. As with all previous waves of the pandemic, AHS is having to postpone a small number of less-urgent cancer surgeries.

These may include low-risk diagnostic cancer surgeries where cancer is suspected not confirmed.

These decisions are clinically based, using a cancer

triaging document drafted and approved by physicians and clinical cancer leadership.

As is the case with all surgeries, clinicians triage cases based on priority. The most serious and urgent cases are performed first. This is standard in every healthcare system in the country.

We acknowledge that postponing any surgery is upsetting to impacted patients, their families, and their loved ones.

Surgical postponements are required to ensure we have the ICU capacity to care for those who need critical, intensive care.

Follow-up care on any suspected or confirmed cancer is taking place, as

are all urgent surgeries and treatments scheduled to treat cancer.

AHS is working very closely with oncologists and cancer teams to evaluate every patient's unique situation and treatment plan to make certain that all patients receive the care they need, when they need it.



Special Ballots (mail in voting)

\$2 MILLION WESTERN MAX WIN IN STURGEON COUNTY!

A regular Tuesday evening turned extraordinary when Aidan Boelsgaard checked his WESTERN MAX ticket and discovered he had won \$2 million on the September 7 draw!

"I was sitting outside on my deck and remembered I had a ticket to check," he said while claiming his prize. "I saw all of the zeroes and started jumping around."

"I was shocked," he continued. "Shocked and so happy!"

The Sturgeon County local said he has one plan for his windfall - investing.

"I'm going to invest in my future," he said. "It's a dream come true to know that I'm going to be set up forever."

Boelsgaard purchased his winning ticket on the day of the draw from the Circle K located at 16741 91 Street NW in Edmonton; he checked his ticket the next day. He won the game's top prize by matching all seven drawn numbers on the September 7 draw - 7, 12, 15, 16, 18, 45 and 46.

Boelsgaard's win is the seventh WESTERN MAX win of \$1 million (or more) since the start of 2021. He is also the 47th Albertan to take home a prize over one million dollars this year.

In rural areas police can be stretched across large distances, which can lead to longer response times. RAPID Response helps reduce response times by expanding the roles and authorities of 400 peace officers in Sheriff Highway Patrol and Fish and Wildlife Enforcement Services.

Earlier this year, fish and wildlife officers' roles were also expanded so they can respond to requests from the RCMP to be first at the scene of an emergency in cases where they are closer than police. Fish and wildlife officers will also respond to RCMP requests for backup, which could involve helping the police locate suspects or preserve a crime scene.

RAPID Response currently covers most areas of rural Alberta policed by the RCMP. The government is holding a series of meetings with First Nations and Métis leaders to determine their interest and earn their support before expanding RAPID Response to their communities.

ST. ALBERT RCMP CRIME PREVENTION THEME FOR OCTOBER IS BREAK AND ENTER TO SEASONAL PROPERTY

October is one of the highest months for Break and Enters to seasonal properties and St. Albert RCMP is encouraging property owners to consider Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) this season when closing up their properties for the winter.

ALBERTANS TO VOTE ON SENATORS, EQUALIZATION, DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Albertans will have an opportunity to have their say on equalization and daylight saving time and elect nominees to the Senate when they vote in the fall municipal elections.

In addition to voting for Senate nominees, Albertans will be asked to vote on

these two provincial topics on Oct. 18, in conjunction with the municipal elections:

- Equalization payments – Should the principle of making equalization payments be removed from the Constitution?
- Daylight saving time – Should Alberta end the practice of changing our clocks twice a year?

Equalization

Over the last 25 years, Albertans have contribut-

ed more than \$400 billion more to the nation in tax dollars than they have received in federal spending. Albertans make an immense contribution to equalization through federal tax contributions, which are transferred by the federal government to other provinces for programs and services. The current program has many issues, including a formula that requires it to grow automatically with Canada’s economy, even if contributing provinces like Alberta are experiencing immense economic challenges.

Daylight saving time
Across Canada and the United States, more governments are bringing forward legislation to move to permanent daylight saving time, also known as summer hours. In 2019, Service Alberta asked Albertans if they thought we should make a similar shift. More than 141,000 Albertans responded, of which 91 per cent were in favour of year-round summer hours.

“Changing our clocks twice a year is something that every Albertan has an opinion on. As Alberta first adopted daylight saving time following a referendum in 1971, we owe it to Albertans to give them the same opportunity to make their voices heard now that we are considering another change.” Nate Glubish, Minister of Service Alberta

Senate elections
Along with the municipal elections and the two referendum questions this fall, Albertans will elect three Senate nominees – one for each of the two current vacancies and one in case of early retirement.

The Senate nominee election enhances democracy in the province by allowing Albertans to choose the individuals who will best represent them in Parliament. Having representatives elected by Albertans would increase senators' accountability to Alberta voters to defend the province's interests.

Provincial police and pension

For the topics of creating an Alberta Police Service and Alberta Pension Plan, further analysis and work are underway before next steps are determined.

"The potential creation of an Alberta Pension Plan would be a significant decision for Albertans. As such, we are continuing the important work of completing an actuarial, economic and structural analysis so Albertans can make an educated and well-informed choice, and their questions and concerns can be adequately addressed. We look forward to putting this important decision on the table when the time is right." Travis Toews, President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance

Quick facts

- The equalization question will be: "Should Section 36(2) of the Constitution Act, 1982 –Parliament and the Government of Canada's commitment to the principle of making equalization payments – be removed from the Constitution?"

- Between 2014 and 2019 alone, Albertans made a net contribution of more than \$100 billion to the federal government through federal taxes that helped build critical infrastructure.

- Alberta has not received an equalization payment since the 1964-65 fiscal year.

- The question on daylight saving time will be finalized this summer.

- During 2019 and 2020, legislation was tabled in British Columbia and Ontario to move to summer hours all year. These changes have yet to be implemented.

- In March 2020, the Yukon stopped changing their clocks and adopted Pacific daylight time year-round.

- Since 2018, 17 American states have passed legislation to move to summer hours (daylight saving time) permanently and more states are debat-

ing the topic. However, in the United States, federal approval is required to enact the change.

- Saskatchewan, Arizona and Hawaii do not change their clocks twice a year.

- The Government of Alberta would provide names of elected Senate nominees to the prime minister for consideration when filling Senate vacancies.


