The increased use in online services is an important milestone as we continue to reduce red tape and make services more accessible." Nate Glubish, Minister of Service Alberta

Services can be completed anytime, anywhere, and Albertans are increasingly looking to complete these transactions online. For

example, new parents can register the birth of their child and order their child's first birth certificate before they leave the hospital, or when they return home. Since changes were made, more than 83 per cent of all birth registrations and about 75 per cent of first birth certificate orders have been completed online.



#### MP SOROKA QUESTIONS THE MINISTER ON FIREARMS

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead. asked the following during **Question Period:** 

"Mr. Speaker, John, a constituent in my riding, has been a firearm owner for over 50 years. He served in the military and never had an issue related to the firearms he has owned. Many criminals in Canada purchase illegal handguns and commit crimes anywhere from armed robbery to murder and the government does nothing to stop them.

When will the Liberal government start punishing criminals instead of law-abiding citizens and remove the order in council so that John can sell his firearms?" Reply:

#### MP SOROKA'S STATEMENT ON FREEDOM OF SPEECH

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, gave the following statement in the House.

"Mr. Speaker, prior to my time in Parliament, I served in municipal government. I was encouraged to speak up on behalf of the people who put their trust in me. I am concerned I do not have the same freedom to ask legitimate questions about the government or popular narratives of society. In the past two years, many of the people in my riding have expressed concerns about their rights and freedoms. We say every Canadian has individual rights and freedoms, but our right to free speech is under attack. I am not talking about hate speech, but about having one's own opinion or questioning the government or society's popular narrative. For me, it seems that if someone asks questions about or does not agree with this narrative, their voice is shut down by hateful rhetoric, labelling them racist, misogynistic or a conspiracy theorist.

What has happened to our freedom of speech? I hope we all can work to re-establishing this core principle in our domestic society."

# WHAT MATTER TO YOU -FREEDOM OF CHOICE & PRIVACY

PART I Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms Whereas Canada is founded upon principles that recognize the supremacy of God and the rule of law:

Rights and freedoms in Canada 1 The Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms guarantees the rights and freedoms set out in it subject only to such reasonable limits prescribed by law as can be demonstrably justified in a free and democratic society.

Fundamental freedoms 2 Everyone has the following fundamental freedoms: (a) freedom of conscience and religion; (b) freedom of thought, belief, opinion, and expression, including freedom of the press and other media of communication; (c) freedom of peaceful assembly; and (d) freedom of association.

We are fortunate to have a very fulsome, yet simple charter of rights in our country, and elegant document that all can read and understand. Our charter of rights, the constitution as it were is not very old, so it still should be fresh in everyone's mind. The same can be said about the Emergency Measures Act, which was amended in 1988 I believe, before that it was called the WAR

Measures act.

WAR / Emergency Measures: Like the constitution, which defines the principals and rights we have in Canada, the emergency measures act is only to be used under the direst circumstances...like well, a war or in the case of PM Elliot Trudeau when a domestic terrorist group, known as the FLQ kidnapped a foreign ambassador (James Cross), and murdered a Quebec cabinet minister (Pierre LaPorte). Some say that the circumstances there didn't even warrant the act being invoked, but it was limited in time, and location to end very quickly a violent sit-

The preamble of the act below, the Coles notes version as it were, something that the current PM should have read states the purpose, and how in general terms the act should be used. Here is the link so you can read for yourself. (Emergencies Act (justice.gc.ca)).

WHEREAS the safety and security of the individual, the protection of the values of the body politic and the preservation of the sovereignty, security and territorial integrity of the state are fundamental obligations of government.

AND WHEREAS the fulfilment of those obligations in Canada may be seriously threatened by a national emergency and, to ensure safety and security during such an emergency, the Governor in Council should be authorized, subject to the supervision of Parliament, to take special temporary measures that may not be appropriate in normal times.

AND WHEREAS the Governor in Council, in taking such special temporary measures, would be subject to the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms and the Canadian Bill of Rights ...
