is paid, and that the charges will be dropped at the next court date. The "lawyer" will make attempts to arrange for payment, and offer that a bondsman can pick up a cash payment. They will also typically advise them not to tell anyone about the situation.

Parkland RCMP have already received several reports of this scam. It is important for the public to recognize the red flags:

- Ensure that your "grandchild" is able to identify themselves by their full name and provide other personal details before agreeing to anything
- The RCMP will not deny anyone medical care while waiting for bail

• The RCMP will not offer to drop charges in exchange for bail being paid

• The RCMP will not tell you to keep information like this a secret



Black Knot Info & Pruning Guideline

Black Knot - What Is It?

Yellowhead County's Agricultural Services Department has received numerous calls regarding black growths on residents'

These tar-like black swellings are a sign of Black Knot and will distort and stunt any tree species within the *Prunus* genus.

Black Knot reduces the aesthetic value of affected trees and, if left long enough, may result in eventual death of the tree.

The disease spreads in the spring, attacking new growth on branches. The spores released by the fungi can be carried by wind and splashing rain.

The only reliable method of controlling Black Knot is pruning.

Black Knot - Pruning

Only prune between November and March.
Cleanly cut off at least 6 - 8 inches below the knot, better to prune back to a healthy collar, then leaving a stub.
For knots on branches or trunks that can't be removed, use a knife to cut away diseased tissue down to good wood and then ½ inch beyond the edge of the knot.
Cleaning your equipment properly is another good way to prevent the spread. Pruning shears should be dipped in a 1% bleach/water solution between cuts and once you are finished pruning ensure you run your tools under water for 10 minutes and dry thoroughly.
Treat pruned branches like hazardous waste, they can release spores for up to 4 months. Burn, bury, or wrap them in plastic and throw them in the trash. Do not compost.



HOW TO PROTECT YOUR CAR'S RESALE VALUE

Few drivers start thinking about resale value when driving a new car off of the dealership lot for the first time. Still enamored with that new car smell, drivers can be excused for not thinking of resale value as they put the pedal to the metal and speed off in their brand new ride.


appeal, a car that looks good gives buyers the impression that it was well taken care of. But a dirty car or one with lots of dings and dents is a red flag to preowned car buyers.

· Keep a clean interior. New car owners typically maintain some strict rules with regard to food and beverages in their vehicles. After all, no one wants their brand new car to succumb to stains or spills. But the longer drivers have a car the more lax they tend to become with regard

to allowing food and drinks into their cars, and that can ultimately hurt the resale value of the vehicle. Maintain a clean interior whether you just bought the car or have driven it for a few years. Much like an impressive exterior leaves a lasting impression, a clean interior that has not succumb to coffee stains or muddy boots is more likely to impress buyers than a car with an interior that has seen

· Drive defensively. It's not just what you do to a car but how you drive the car that can affect its resale value. Driving defensively reduces your risk of accident, and an accident-free preowned vehicle is a top priority for potential buyers. But driving defensively also reduces wear and tear on your vehicle, as over time constant stop-andgo, aggressive driving takes its toll on vehicle engines and other components.

the vehicle history report. Today's preowned car buyers know to ask for a vehicle history report before buying a car. If your vehicle history report contains any suspicious or inaccurate information, you may be forced to sell the car for less than it's worth or delay selling until you can have any issues corrected. That won't necessarily happen overnight, but you can avoid dealing with a host of issues all at once by periodically examining the vehicle

history report. Any discrepancies on the report can be brought to the attention of your insurance company, who can then work with you to correct the issues and restore your vehicle's reputation.

Resale value may not be foremost on the minds of new car owners, but the earlier buyers begin to factor resale value into their car-care routines, the more they will benefit down the road.

We Conservatives Will Cut Taxes On Groceries, Gas, And Heat

Our Conservative party has been asking the Trudeau Liberal government to halt planned tax hikes due to the rising costof -living. Let's look at what is happening to our seniors. The Liberals say they are helping seniors by increasing their OAS by 10% for those aged 75+. With inflation rising, what about seniors aged 65 to 74? How will they cope with the drastic costof-living increases especially when the Liberals are willing to TRIPLE the carbon tax, making it more expensive to refuel, feed and heat homes. Seniors look forward to their retirement and now they worry about making ends meet when their savings are quickly disappearing as they try to keep up with inflation.

I have received many emails and phone calls from those on a fixed income not able to keep up with expenses. In fact, inflation levels are the highest since January 1983.

I have risen in the House questioning and taking part in debates about the difficulties our seniors are having with the rising cost-of-living. And the addition of a carbon tax only makes things worse for everyone. The NDP-Liberal government is raising not one tax hike, not two tax hikes, but three tax hikes in the

next few months.

Our Conservative motion in the House of Commons was voted down. It read:

"That, in the opinion of the House, given that the government's tax increases on gas, home heating and, indirectly, groceries will fuel inflation, and that the Parliamentary Budget Officer reported the carbon tax costs 60% of households more than they get back, the government must eliminate its plan to triple the carbon tax."

What happened? The Liberals, NDP and Bloc all voted against our motion.

An Angus Reid Institute poll found that 88% of Canadians

now say they've had to cut back on spending in one form or another to deal with inflation. Nearly half of Canadians say they are worse off financially than they were a year ago.

Since the House returned in January of this year, I have put forward, along with my Conservative colleagues, our concerns about the difficulties our seniors are facing as they try to make ends meet.

We Conservatives will continue to press this Liberal government. Enough with the taxes. Don't they realize that everyone in Canada is suffering financially?

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Submitted by Yellowhead County

ASP Public Hearings – Public Hearings were held for several Hamlet Area Structure Plans (ASP) amendments and are needed to comply with Land Use Bylaw (LUB) 09.21. Changes included updating the references for the land use districts within the Area Structure Plans to match with the existing districts in the Land Use Bylaw updated in 2021.

Regional Waste Authority – Council voted to approve the MD of Greenview to join the West Yellowhead Regional Waste Management Authority as the organization's fifth member. This would allow for Grande Cache to access the regional landfill following a one-time payment of \$270,000 to contribute to the current infrastructure already in place, in addition to regular dumping fees.

Ag Society Funding – The Yellowhead Agricultural Society will receive \$100,000 from Yellowhead County towards loan repayment for repair and mold abatement work at the Ag-Society's facility. Council approved funds to be used explicitly for the repayment of the loan tied to the remediation of the ag facility and the County receiving bank documentation confirming the loan.

Pine Hall Funding – The Pine Grove Community Association will receive a \$5,000 operational grant advance to help maintain hall operations following a request from the association. The financial assistance is part of Yellowhead County's Community Recreation Grants program and will help cover annual operating costs and other upcoming expenses.

Zoning Bylaw – Bylaw 16.22 received first reading and would allow for a lot within SW 08-54-16-W5M to be rezoned from Rural District to Country Residential District allowing the property to be subdivided to accommodate a single lot sub-

division. A public hearing for the bylaw is scheduled for November 22, 2022.

Short and Long-Range Construction/Rehabilitation Bridge Plans – Council adopted the short-term and long-range bridge construction and rehabilitation plans. The short-term plan covers 2023 to 2027 and is estimated to cost approximately \$4 million. The long-range plan encompasses 2028 to 2058 and will be used as a conceptual planning and budgeting tool with an estimated cost of \$244 million over thirty years.
