

cluded from providing any details regarding the allegations as the matter is now before the courts, it is the Division's intention to assist in any way possible with the RCMP investigation to ensure that this matter is properly investigated and that the correct result is obtained

#### POLICE WARN PUBLIC OF 'EMERGENCY SCAM'

Alberta RCMP, along with partners from the Calgary Police Service (CPS) and the Edmonton Police Service (EPS), are warning the public of a fraudulent scam that is circulating throughout Alberta. These scams are referred to as Emergency Scams, or sometimes "Grandparent" or "Grand-

child" scams.

These scams often involve a phone call being placed to the victim claiming a loved one is in trouble with the courts or law enforcement and a payment is needed to help them. The suspects will often pretend to be a police officer, judge, or family member. Suspects will usually ask for cash; however, they may also

ask for payment in gift cards, bitcoin, or e-transfers. The scammers will then send an associate acting as a courier to pick up the money in person or ask the money be mailed.

The two common themes of these scams are a sense of urgency: the payment

must be made immediately or there will be worse consequences; and secrecy: no one can know because it is embarrassing or because the judge has placed a publication ban or "gag order" on the case.

In 2022 Alberta RCMP have received over 150 reports of this type of fraud with a total loss of around \$750,000. Not only is there a concern for the amount of money being lost, but a great concern for these couriers showing up in person to collect the cash.

Alberta RCMP, and their partners at CPS and EPS, want to remind Albertans:

- Bail is always paid in person at a courthouse or correctional center;
- Never send money to anyone you don't know;
- If a person claims to be a police officer or

judge, call that police service or court house directly to confirm the situation – police and courts will never demand cash be picked up in person or mailed; and

• Never give out personal information over the phone or online to someone you don't know—the police or courts will not ask for personal information over the phone.

"We encourage you to talk to family, friends, or loved ones who may be vulnerable to these types of crimes, making sure they know what to watch for," said Cpl. Sean Milne, Alberta RCMP Serious and Organized Crime Unit. "If they are contacted by a scammer, they shouldn't feel embarrassed, they shouldn't keep it secret, and they should reach out for help."

## ALBERTA RCMP SUPPORT NATIONAL IMPAIRED DRIVING ENFORCEMENT DAY

This past Saturday, Dec. 3, 2022, the Alberta RCMP participated in National Impaired Driving Enforcement Day by carrying out traffic safety enforcement initiatives and check stops across the province, removing 77 impaired drivers from the roadways.

Of the impaired motorists, 44 drivers were over the legal limit or refused to provide breath samples and received Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS) - FAIL. Fifteen drivers provided breath samples that were in range to receive IRS - WARN. Sixteen GDL drivers provided breath samples that had alcohol in their system, contrary to the zero tolerance law and were issued IRS - NOVICE. As well, two drivers received 24-hour suspensions due to drug impairment or fatigue.

The Alberta RCMP is dedicated to keeping our province's streets and highways safe not just on National Impaired Driving Enforcement Day, but everyday. To all those choosing to drive sober this #SeasonForCaring, thank you. With your help, Albertans are able to get home safely to their loved ones this holiday.

#### **ARTICLE BY MLA SMITH**

The new legislative session has begun, and the Government of Alberta is hard at work for you and your family in the Legislature.

The new session opened with a speech from the throne, where Lieutenant Governor Salma Lakhani highlighted our government's key priorities for the months ahead; namely, making life more affordable for families, attracting jobs and investment to our province, fixing the healthcare system, and standing up for our jurisdictional rights against Ottawa.

Premier Danielle Smith began the new session by tabling Bill 1, the Alberta Sovereignty within a United Canada Act, to empower our province to standup against and defend our jurisdictional rights from federal overreach and interference. This legislation, if passed, would help strengthen the bonds of Confederation by upholding our nation's most foundational documents – the Canadian Constitution and the Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

Peace River MLA Dan Williams then tabled private member's Bill 202 to make it easier and more affordable for Albertans to give to charity. Bill 202 proposes to increase the non-refundable tax credit for charitable donations of \$200 or less from 10 per cent to 60 per cent. If passed, this would bring the total tax credit for charitable donations in-line with political donations at 75 per cent, when combined with the federal rebate of

15 per cent. Bill 202 has already been welcomed by several charitable organizations like the Alberta Cancer Foundation who called it, "a huge leap forward in helping to create a strong, vibrant, and sustainable charitable sector."


Soon, we will learn more details about our government's legislation to address inflation, including expanding the electricity rebate to a total of up to \$500; reindexing benefits like AISH, PDD, and Income Support, as well as the Alberta Seniors Benefit and the Alberta Child and Family Benefit; and providing targeted payments for kids under 18, seniors 65 and over, and vulnerable Albertans with household incomes of \$180,000 or below. Minister Jones will table a bill to help these actions fall into place.

Economist Trevor Tombe has already called these measures the "ideal way" to help Albertans weather the inflation storm. In particular, he said the \$600 being provided over six months to kids under 18 will "fully offset costs for families with two to three kids and household incomes under \$120,000."

I look forward to providing you with more details on all the above legislation soon, as well other bills we will be putting forward this sitting.

Premier Smith and our United Conservative team have wasted no time getting to work for Albertans. Our economy has come back strong, but more work needs to be done, especially when it comes to

#### **BE A BUILDER**

The Honorable Mr. Peter Trynchy passed away recently at the age of 91, he had served 8 consecutive terms in the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, held several ministries, and was on numerous committees. He was on town council for 6 years, and many local not for profit organizations. Always busy, always helping.

It was said at his funeral by more than one speaker he was one heck of a ball player too, and he had inspired many to take part in the game, as well as to get involved in their community.

Above all he was a family man. His family had to share him, and their time with him with the rest of us for many years.

It was also said that Mr. Trynchy was never given the credit that he deserved for his part over the years, being part of the original Lougheed caucus who put so many things in place to allow for the wheels of progress to move forward for our province. The thing that I took away from all of the speeches, was the validation of what one of our local councilors said whom had known Mr. Trynchy over the years, "Peter was a builder".

The very first speech that you give as a newly elected MLA is called your "Maiden Speech", and typically it is in response to the Throne Speech right after the election. I was nervous about giving my speech in the house, there is something about that place that is special. There is that old saying if "Walls Could Talk", I know it wasn't inspired by the Legislature, but that place sure reaffirms the inspiration.

Although our province and country are young, what we have for history, has been spoken, and mostly recorded in that house. Since the early 1970's, Hansard, as it's called, has been recording every word spoken. In addition to that, it has been for some time now, all recorded on video, live broadcasts as well. I stalled off for a while before making my maiden speech, to give myself time to get a feel as it were of those who represented our area before me.

The constituents of our area have chosen some strong and passionate people to represent them over the years. Several made it to be Ministers, and even a long-standing Speaker of the house. It is always interesting to hear our current speaker reference Speaker Kowalski on a ruling from days gone by, to allow him to make a ruling of his own. What struck me from the reading of the speeches of past MLA's was that of a pervasive theme. Bringing attention to the house the need not for a handout, but simply to recognize that

given the tools for the job, not only would our corner of the province survive, it would thrive and be part of an economic engine for years to come!


Back in the day, rural electrification was a pressing issue, as was getting in the phone lines. We still see some of that today, but now the push is more to close the gap on the Digital Divide, and cell phone coverage. The same arguments for another much needed utility and the infrastructure that drives it. Widening and paving roads, twinning of highways, and allowing for the connection between regions to grow the economy in a safe and sustainable manner, the regulations required to allow for the natural gas distribution to heat many of our homes and businesses. Recognition of the valuable contribution of our agriculture sector, irrigation, rail service, terminals, and of course responsible resource development. The need to mine coal in a responsible manner, to provide the much-needed electricity for our province.

One of the constituents was giving me some light-hearted ribbing and asked me what in the heck I had been working on, and that Whitecourt needed a new hospital. I had asked him if he had heard about the Economic Corridors, I'd been working on for the last three years, and the reasons for it. I also had to gently let

him know that Whitecourt wasn't my area, but I did have a real eye and passion for making sure that the rural hospitals were here for years to stay, and that I'd proposed a while back we take the backlog from the big cities and move it out to the rural hospitals to clean it up. An entirely other article will need to be dedicated to that model. When the gent said he never heard of the corridors I had to digress a bit, and I will here as well to explain why I've been hitting this concept so hard.

We have a ton of backbone when it comes to infrastructure, but most of it was all designed to move trade and commerce from the north, down too the south, and for the most part, hug our southern border. We have experienced a major logistics impact on our supply chain because of this, initially it was forecasted for years, and now it's on top of us. I believe the mayor of Vancouver had stated it succinctly, they had paned for years for "Just in Time Service", and when the storms hit and cut off one of their main highways, the need has shifted to a "Just in Case" model. We have choke points, and overuse on old corridors, in some cases with limited growth potential. The second is, if you don't have the corridors to connect regions, and if you don't

#### PUBLIC NOTICE:

Changes to Yellowhead County's Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) Bylaw



#### What you should know:

- OHVs are no longer restricted on which routes are used within hamlets
- · In hamlets, OHVs may operate in the parking lane or far right-hand side of the roadway
- · Outside of a hamlet, OHVs may operate on the right-hand side of the roadway or in a municipal roadway ditch as long as:
  - · it is safe to do so and damage will not occur
  - · it is not prohibited by signage,
  - operators travel single file and in the proper direction required,
  - the OHV stops before crossing intersecting roads including driveways and approaches.

#### Rules that remain in place:

- · Compliance with Traffic Safety Act and regulations, as well as other applicable provincial legislation
- No OHV use in hamlets between 11 PM to 8 AM
- OHV speed limits are 30 km/hr in a hamlet and 50 km/hr outside of a hamlet
- · OHV use is not permitted in parks, playgrounds, and schoolyards
- · OHVs must travel single file in the proper direction required

grow your northern ports, we will miss out on the next biggest boom in history. Simply put, we are in the right place, and the right time, to be the solution to so many of the world's food, energy, security, supply challenges, and logistics challenges.

To do this, we need to relook at how we have done things within our province. We need to be more self-reliant, and be producers of refined, near finished, or market ready products again. We need to be able to feed ourselves, be self-reliant, be able to define what our kev infrastructure needs are, and make sure we don't loose what we already have. We need to connect regions in the north to one another, we need to create

a regulatory environment where the rules are known for development, and we need to have anchor tenants defined in the Economic Corridors. We need to collaborate with our own Albertans, but moreover, we must ensure that we collaborate and work together with our provincial and territorial neighbours, and we all flourish when our access to tide water is achieved.

It meant a lot to me at Mr. Trynchy's service to be able to speak not only at the front of the room, but to folks for a few hours afterwards like the gent who challenged me on what I had been up too. When I explained that our area was key not only on the Yellowhead Corridor that gets us into Prince Rupert, but an inland terminal for the many cars that will be heading North, or east

into Churchill I believe he had seen what I did. Several generations of sustainable growth. I was humbled to receive words of encouragement from Mr. Trynchy's family, and his former colleagues, that I was on the right track. As a Major Projects guy, I've been a builder my whole life.

I'm very happy to know that our new Premier is a builder too, and the new ministry created that I'm parliamentary secretary. I have been directed to collaborate with the new minister for Transportation and Economic Corridors. The Premier is forward looking, and bringing forward legislation that will give us the tools for the job to remove the blockages, or traps, or debris that could be thrown in our way. There are others out there that are not builders, that want us to fight one another, rather than work together. I'm all for speaking softly, and carrying a big stick, but we need to have that big stick! The days of appeasement are over, it's not working. 




