PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATE STRING OF BREAK AND ENTERS

At approximately 5 a.m. on Dec. 22, 2022, Parkland RCMP responded to two reports of break and enters to local businesses in Spruce Grove, only minutes apart.

Security footage from these incidents show the same suspect and vehicle involved in both incidents. Further investiga-

tion showed that the same suspect and vehicle is also associated to a break and enter in Edmonton an hour prior. Between the three stores, over \$13,000 worth of goods was stolen, including guitars, jewellery, and beauty products. Thousands of dollars in damage was also done.

The suspect is described as:

•Between 5'10" and 6'

•Between 225 and 250lbs
•Fair to medium complexion

•Wearing black shoes, pants, hoodie, mask, gloves, shirt, and a red plaid under-shirt

The vehicle is described as:

•A 2000's GMC Sierra 1500 Z71 Sierra extended cab
•Chrome mirrors and trim on the wheel wells

INFLATION RELIEF PORTAL AND PAYMENTS COMING SOON

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Monthly \$100 affordability payments for families, seniors, and vulnerable Albertans will be released soon, and Albertans can act now to get ready.

Alberta's economy has recovered strongly, but many people are struggling to heat their homes and feed

their families. Alberta's government has responded with the largest inflation relief package in Canada, with significant broad-based and targeted supports. Starting this month, six months of affordability payments will begin for Albertans through an application and distribution system that is fast, effective and safe.

Starting January 18, se-

niors 65 or older who are not receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit and eligible parents with children under 18 can apply online through the government portal or in person at locations across the province for \$600 in monthly affordability payments.

In order to use the portal, eligible parents and



Bylaw 2022-17 Proposed Amendments to the Parkland County Municipal Development Plan Bylaw 2017-14

Bylaw 2022-17 proposes amendments to Municipal Development Plan Section 1.0 – “Introduction”, Section 6.0 – “Hamlets”, Section 8.0 – “Recreation & Tourism”, and Section 13.0 – “Implementation” as well as updates to all existing maps. The purpose of the proposed amendments is to:

- guide development in the Hamlet of Wabamun following the dissolution;
- designate the Hamlet of Wabamun as a Priority Growth Hamlet;
- allow for the future adoption of a Hamlet Area Redevelopment Plan for the Hamlet of Wabamun; and
- update all existing MDP maps to reflect boundary changes due to the Wabamun dissolution and

the lands annexed by the City of Spruce Grove in 2021 along their southern boundary.

The proposed amendments in Bylaw 2022-17 are applicable to Priority Growth Hamlets and Prime Recreation and Tourism areas, are “County wide”, and are **not site specific**.

Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. Written submissions or presentations may either be submitted in advance to Planning & Development by 4:00 P.M. on January 12, 2023, or submitted at the commencement of the Public Hearing.

Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation to Council must notify Planning & Development Services in advance of the public hearing by 4:00 P.M., on January 12, 2023. Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of 10 minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaw as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.

ALBERTA'S CERTIFIED WEED FREE FORAGE PROGRAM

Are you a forage producer who is interested in helping to prevent the spread of invasive species? If so, read on to learn more about Alberta's Certified Weed Free Forage program, how you can participate, and how the Alberta Invasive Species Council (AISC) will help you sell your forage.

Yellowhead County, AB (January 3, 2023) - Invasive species, such as terrestrial invasive plants, are detrimental to Alberta's economy and environment. They degrade natural areas, decrease biodiversity, and reduce food and habitat for wildlife. Economically, they cost Alberta an estimated \$1 billion each year.

Contaminated hay is one means by which invasive plants are spread. To address this, the AISC is promoting the Alberta Certified Weed Free Forage program to potential buyers in an effort to help producers sell their Certified Weed Free Forage.

Yellowhead County has joined other Alberta Municipalities in participating in the Certified Weed Free Forage Program. Below is some general information for forage producers that are interested in having fields inspected to certify their forage as weed free:

- Inspections must be conducted by a Certified Weed Free Forage Inspector within 10 days of harvest. If the crop is not cut within 10 days, a new inspection must

be conducted.

- Inspectors may certify all or a portion of a field as 'weed free'.

- Invasive species may be present in a field certified as weed free if there are no propagative plant parts (e.g., flowers, seed heads, root fragments) present.

- The AISC intends to maintain a publicly available list of producer contact information for producers with inventory of Certified Weed Free Forage.

- Certified Weed Free Forage can be beneficial to purchase and/or produce as it can be a preferred product choice, bring a premium when sold, and prevent invasive species from spreading and becoming established in environmentally sensitive areas.

Weed Free Forage inspections can only be conducted by those with authority under the Weed Control Act (e.g., Weed Inspectors). As such, the actual inspections and certification issuance can only be conducted by weed inspectors who have taken recent Certified Weed Free Forage Inspector Training.

seniors will be required to have a Verified Account. To ensure that the application process is as smooth as possible, Albertans should sign-up for their Verified Account or confirm they have an existing Verified Account with accurate information as soon as possible.

Many Albertans receiving these targeted relief payments are automatically enrolled for the program and do not need to apply to receive the benefit.

Along with Foster and Kinship Caregivers, anyone currently receiving regular monthly benefits through Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH), Income Support or Alberta Seniors Benefit, or receiving services through the Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PDD) program will automatically receive their first payment starting January 31.

Affordability payments for AISH, Income Support and PDD clients

All clients accessing AISH, Income Support or PDD are automatically enrolled

in the program and do not need to sign up to receive their benefits. They will receive their first \$100 payments starting January 31.

- Payments will be delivered the same way as a client's regular monthly benefits, whether by automatic deposit or a physical cheque.

- Payments will be delivered by physical cheque for existing PDD clients who are not receiving AISH or Income Support benefits.

- Beneficiaries will also be notified directly about their enrollment in the payment program and related information.

- These payments will be treated as exempt income by the AISH and Income Support programs and will not impact eligibility or financial benefits.

- Parents in these programs with children under 18 can also receive \$600 in additional payments per child. They will need to apply online or in person for these payments starting January 18.

Affordability payments for seniors

All Albertans 65 or older

with household incomes below \$180,000 will soon be eligible for \$600 over six months in monthly affordability payments.

Albertans receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit are automatically enrolled in the program and do not need to sign up to receive their benefits. The distribution of additional monthly payments will begin January 31.

Eligible seniors who are not receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit will need to apply for affordability payments by creating or confirming their Verified Account and applying for benefits via the online portal or in person at a registry office or through Alberta Supports when the portal opens on January 18.

Affordability payments for parents or guardians caring for children under 18

Families with household incomes below \$180,000 per year will soon receive a total of \$600 for each dependent child under 18 over six months. Eligible parents can apply for affordability payments by creating or confirming their Verified

Account and applying for benefits via the online portal or in person at a registry office or through Alberta Supports when the portal opens on January 18.

Affordability payments for foster and kinship caregivers caring for children under 18

Eligible kinship or foster caregivers caring for a child under the age of 18 are automatically enrolled in the program and do not need to sign up to receive their affordability payments. They will receive their first payments at the end of January.

- Payments will be delivered the same way as regular monthly benefits, whether by automatic deposit or physical cheque.

- Monthly payments will be rolled out starting January 31.

Alberta's government is delivering immediate cost of living and inflation relief while also working to support long-term affordability. Albertans can learn more about all the broad-based and targeted affordability relief programs online.

EDSON RCMP ARREST AND CHARGE SAME MALE FOR POSSESSION OF STOLEN TRUCK

On Jan. 5, 2023, an Edson RCMP Officer on patrol observed a vehicle matching the description of a truck stolen from the Whitecourt area last month. The same truck was also believed to be involved in an attempted theft at a local business in Edson. The RCMP Officer circled around to confirm

the license plate but the truck fled the area. The officer was able to positively identify the driver before he made his escape. Police patrolled the area but were unable to locate the vehicle. Hours later, officers located the stolen vehicle at the last known address of the identified suspect and were able to make the arrest.

Matthew Harris (40), a

resident of Edson, was charged with:

- Possession of stolen property obtained by crime
- Flight from a Peace Officer
- Fail to comply with a Release Order

At the time of the arrest, Harris was wanted on a warrant for fail to attend court for a similar mat-

ter where on September 9, 2022, he was arrested and charged by the Edson RCMP for possession of a stolen truck, stolen camper and a stolen license plate.

Harris was brought before a Justice of the Peace where he was release with his next court appearance date set for Jan. 17, 2023, at Edson Provincial Court.

Happy New Year and I hope you had a wonderful Christmas. As we move in to the New Year it is often important to take stock of where we are as people and I believe as a province. If we just look at the past three months we will see that Alberta has welcomed 58,203 new people. This represents a population increase of around 1.3 per cent, the largest growth our province has ever seen.

There are a lot of reasons why people are flocking to Alberta right now: an abundance of good jobs, affordable homes, and a quality of life that is second to none. But our low-tax advantage remains a tremendous draw for families in search of hope, opportunity, and a

better life.

Alberta is the only province in Canada without a provincial sales tax. This means big savings for Albertans on vehicles, hockey equipment, clothes, furniture, tools, and so much more. Our lack of a sales tax isn't just good for families, it's good for businesses who can lower their overhead and attract customers from other provinces, in addition to Alberta.

According to a new report from the Canadian Taxpayers Federation, Alberta shoppers saved a whopping \$184 million over the Christmas shopping season, due to the fact we do not have a sales tax, while shoppers in other provinces paid hundreds of millions more.

"Sometimes I think it can be taken for granted, not

having a PST," said Kris Sims, the Alberta director for the Canadian Taxpayers Federation. "When we have that savings across Alberta for our shoppers, I think it's important to point it out because other folks don't have those savings. I think that's one of the reasons Alberta has an advantage."

According to Sims, Albertans' massive holiday savings broke down to about \$80 per person, while the average Ontario shopper paid about \$90 more, and the average Quebec shopper paid about \$112 more.

Albertans pay the lowest taxes in the country and protecting Alberta's low-tax advantage is one of our United Conservative government's top priorities. Premier Danielle Smith even signed a pledge not to implement a sales tax in our

province. This is great news for all Albertans, who benefit from our province's low taxes.

Despite the fact Albertans pay the lowest taxes in the country, all while our economy is booming and our budget is balanced – the NDP have a very different perspective on taxes. They want to raise them, and they're not shy about saying so.

When the NDP was last in government, one of their first actions was increasing businesses taxes. This turned out to be an ill-advised move, as the NDP took in less and less revenue as jobs, investment, and capital fled the province. Now they are promising to raise business taxes again.

YEAR END REMARKS

With the legislative session wrapping-up and 2023 fast-approaching, I wanted to take this opportunity to highlight some of Alberta's economic accomplishments over the past year.

Our province continues to create jobs at a rapid pace and across a variety of economic sectors. While we represent just 12 per cent

of Canada's population, we created nearly a quarter of all jobs in the nation in 2022. While other provinces struggled to get people back to work, we saw employment gains in ten of the past 12 months.

Alberta's entrepreneurial spirit is alive again. The number of new incorporations in Alberta increased by 5.5 per cent year-over-year, and 9.3 per cent to-date. Meanwhile, major com-

panies like Telus, Mphasis, Amazon, Walmart, Air Products, Dow Chemical, PIP International, de Havilland, Phyto Organix Foods, and more are putting down financial roots and investing in Alberta.

Alberta's economy is diversifying, but our traditional industries are strong as well. Drilling activity across the province remains robust, with our rig-count increasing by 26 per

cent compared to last year. And our agriculture industry saw high yields during the 2022 harvest – about 10 per cent higher than the five-year average.

For the third year in a row, we are on pace to shatter our venture capital investment record. Alberta has seen 75 deals and a total of \$509 million invested so far this year.


