"It was an honor and a privilege as the MLA to recognize the Platinum Jubilee Medal recipients as well as the runners-up," said MLA Shane Getson, "simply put, these are very humble, hard-working people who set a tremendous example for the rest of us to follow when it comes to being the heart of their communities."

Early in 2022, the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal was released in celebration of the Queen's 70 years of service; the momentous milestone that made her the longest reigning monarch in the history of the British Commonwealth. Each MLA was given the task of selecting just 20 constituents to receive



this prestigious honor. This was no easy feat, and serious consideration was given to every nomination that was submitted.

Twenty medal recipients were chosen, each receiving a framed certificate commemorating their achievement along with the Platinum Jubilee Medal. Tears flowed as these selfless community members were honored by their peers for their tireless work

in creating better communities around them and, by extension, improving the world that we all live in. Ten runners-up were also recognized for their contributions, as no act of service to your community is a small one.

Our United Conservative government won't back down when it comes to defending our province against anger and hostility from Ottawa. We proved that once again this week when we challenged the liberal government's "just transition" plan to shut down our energy industry – the economic engine of

Canada.

In case you missed it, the Liberal government has announced its intention to table legislation to facilitate a "just transition," and replace our energy industry and jobs with a new green economy.

The "just transition" thinking – which stems from the 2015 Paris Agreement on climate change, and which has been adopted by environmental activists across

the world – isn't just about phasing out fossil fuels and shutting down energy economies, however. It's also about radically restructuring societies and redistributing wealth.

It's disturbing that the liberal government is seeking to impose this on Canada at a time when there is a tremendous demand for Alberta energy – not only across our country, but across our world. It's even

more disturbing that the liberals are seeking to make an enemy out of Alberta to build support for his "just transition" plan. In a recent interview, their leader said, "one of the challenges is there is a political class in Alberta that has decided that anything to do with climate change is going to be bad." Nothing could be further from the truth.

Alberta is the most environmentally responsible and humane energy producer in the world. We are well known to be leaders in carbon capture usage and storage, and we are continually investing in technology to reduce emissions. As Calgary Herald columnist Don Braid put it, their leader "is either clueless about what's going in Alberta, or cares nothing for the truth."

Premier Danielle Smith has emerged as a national voice of reason against the liberal's divisive "just transition" plans and rhetoric. She's been crystal clear on this issue: Alberta's energy and technology will continue to power the world for generations, and Alberta will not shut down its industry. Premier Smith even reached out, in good faith, and asked the Alberta NDP to join her in opposing the liberal's reckless plan. They, unfortunately, refused, and have remained silent on the subject – once again choosing their friend and ally over everyday Albertans.

Alberta's resources are Alberta's jurisdiction, and we will not let the liberals meddle with our jobs or our industry. We all care about the environment and reducing emissions. That's why Alberta's government is continually investing in oil well remediation,

that even the “greenest” project wasn’t good enough, our economy was being eroded, people were losing their jobs, and we were all going to be punished at the cash register for our way of life. The effect of this on everyone that I talked to was universally negative. Time to step up; if I couldn’t fix it from the outside, I’d better figure out how to fix it from the inside. Next Project: Politics.

To my pleasant surprise, I met more “Proje-Holics” in politics. They were the community builders, the volunteers, the regular folks. They wanted to make sure we took our province back and corrected the direction it was heading down under that “new style” of management. It sure stirred the soul to meet new people, many of whom were strangers to each other, coming together for a project that was bigger than the individual to make our province a better place.

I believe that most folks are tired of politics right now; it has been a rough ride for everyone over the last few years. We are tired of the overreach, tired of half-hatched plans being launched on us by the big urban jungles and by folks on the other end of the country, tired of them changing our way of life without consultation. We have a provincial general election that will take place this spring, with one side fighting back against the federal government’s continued overreach, and the other side laying prostrate, propping up that same government that is trying to sink us.

I also believe that folks have more on tap...that when they realize what is at stake, we will indeed ral-

ly together to deal with the common challenges, park the 10 percent of issues we don’t agree on, and take care of the task at hand. We cannot afford to lose ground, fall backwards, and have our provincial leaders be back in bed with the Liberal Government. Right here, right now, Alberta and Saskatchewan are the provinces that are giving so many Canadians hope that we still have a country worth fighting for, and one that we can once more be proud to call home. I’ve been on several podcasts, have done interviews, and even received responses from the social media posts I’ve made that have people across the country looking to us to hold the line. The kicker is that many don’t know how to get involved, but they want to, and they realize that they must. Please find below some simple steps to help you do the same.

1. Buy a membership in the provincial party of your choice, one that is blue would be a good choice in my humble opinion.

- a. Note: You need to be a member to vote for your local nomination contestant. There will be a mini election only for party members to pick their candidate to run in the spring election

2. Become an active member of your local constituency association by engaging with and helping where you can. This is a volunteer board; they have directors and executive positions. There are sub committees that do a ton of things not only to help our community, but to make sure that the local candidate is good to go for the election.

3. Talk to people, find out what matters to them, get that information back to the board, your candidate and/or the MLA. It’s about making sure we genuinely get the best ideas, as well as to know the issues so we can come up with solutions together.

4. Help develop party policy. This “policy” becomes the platform that the party candidates will be running on. At this stage, about 90 % of the platform commitments made by the UCP in the 2019 election have been enacted. Those policies came from the membership.

It’s literally that simple, join the team and take on the project of growing Alberta for future generations, all while keeping it safe from harm by those that would see it weakened and diminished.

The projects that I’m involved with currently are larger than our own backyard, but we play an integral part in their overall success. Economic Corridors are going to strengthen our ties with our provincial and territorial partners in the Northwest and get our products out to the deep seaports. These projects will have an impact going forward for multiple generations.

As well, I’m going to be taking to the airwaves on my own podcast called “What Matters to You”.

The general themes and topics will involve freedom, business, politics, places to see/things to do locally, aviation, guns & gear. Our first guest is going to be Shaun Newman, of the Shaun Newman Podcast. I’ve been on his show a few times now, along with over 300 other guests. I was very happy to know that The

Blake Richards Band has allowed us to use their hit single “Rollin’ Coal” as the theme music for the show. Again, we have good folks coming together, to do what they can to help us “Hold the Line” and make sure we keep our province “Strong and Free”.

I’ll be out in the community as much as I can over the next month as we will not be sitting in session until the later part of February. I’ll be hitting as many community events, meetings, and cafés as I can along the way. In case I don’t see you, I’ll be leaving questionnaires behind with the business owners and managers that will permit me to; these are based on the key items that we will be addressing once we go back into session. I want to get your direct feedback about what matters to you, to find out if we are on track, if we have missed anything, and to make sure we get all the good ideas we can to make things right going forward. I hope to get your feedback, and I thank you in advance for your help.




Today, the Honourable Diane Lebovitch, Minister of National Revenue, and the Honourable Ahmed Hussen, Minister of Housing and Diversity and Inclusion, are taking action and announcing that applications for the new one-time top-up to the Canada Housing Benefit are now open. This benefit is a one-time payment of \$500 to eligible lower-income renters experiencing housing affordability challenges.

Canadians must meet all the following conditions to be eligible for the new benefit:

- have filed a 2021 tax return;
- be at least 15 years of age as of December 1, 2022;
- be a resident in Canada in 2022 for tax purposes;
- have an adjusted family net income of \$20,000 or less for individuals, or \$35,000 or less for families;
- have paid at least 30% of their 2021 adjusted family net income on rent for their principal residence in the 2022 calendar year; and
- be able to provide their 2022 address(es) and landlord's contact information.

Eligible applicants can quickly and easily apply for the one-time top-up to the Canada Housing Benefit through their Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) My Account. If applicants are registering for My Account for the first time, they will not need to wait for their security code in the mail; they can still access limited services in My Account and apply for this benefit immediately. Those who apply online and are signed up for direct deposit could

receive their one-time top-up within five business days.

Applicants who need to update their address, marital status or direct deposit information, are encouraged to apply through CRA My Account. Applicants who do not have My Account and do not need to update their personal or banking information, can also apply online using a web form. Those who are unable to apply online can call the CRA's new dedicated phone line at 1-800-282-8079 to complete their application with an agent.

Eligible Canadians will need to retain receipts or documentation for six years to support their application in case the CRA contacts them to validate eligibility. Applicants that are found to be ineligible for the benefit during the verification processes will be required to repay the benefit they received.

By delivering targeted financial support to those who need it most, the one-time top-up to the Canada Housing

Benefit represents just one of the many ways that the Government of Canada is working to make life more affordable for Canadians. Targeted measures, such as doubling the GST credit and creating the Canada Dental Benefit have also helped Canadian families with the cost-of-living this year.

Today also marks the opening of the application portal for the Projects Stream of the Rapid Housing Initiative. The portal is available on the website of Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation.

The application window will be open for approximately 90 days (December 12, 2022, to March 15, 2023). Eligible applicants for this stream include provinces, territories, municipalities, Indigenous governing bodies and organizations, and non-profit organizations.

The Rapid Housing Initiative has continually exceeded its targets to rapidly produce new, permanent affordable homes.


