the North Saskatchewan River bridge.

Upon arrival, members first on scene located the suspect vehicle initially reported in Breton on fire, and a deceased individual who had been ejected from their vehicle. Preliminary investigation indicates that the vehicle ultimately collided

FIRE SAFETY REMINDERS FOR E-BIKE AND E-SCOOTER OWNERS

City of Leduc Fire Services share fire safety tips for people who own an electric bike and/or scooter:

• Always use the manufacturer's cord and power adapter as they are made specifically for the e-bike/e-scooter.

Refrain from using


extension cords and only plug the charging cord directly into a power outlet.


 Charge the battery outside, whenever possible.
Don't leave an e-bike/scoot unattended while charging – this includes charging overnight.
Keep the battery charged between 20 to 80 per cent and store it inside if not in use for more than a month.

• Please follow the manufacturer's instructions for charging and storage.

Leduc Fire also recommends owners to purchase replacement batteries and related equipment directly from the company where the unit was purchased. This ensures e-bike/scooter owners have a properly functioning battery.



HEALTH SERVICES RESUMING IN DRAYTON VALLEY FOLLOWING WILDFIRE EVACUATION

As residents return to Drayton Valley following evacuation due to wildfires, health services are resuming to serve the community.

As of 7:30 a.m. on May 17, the Drayton Valley Hospital and Care Centre Emergency Department (ED) has re-opened to provide emergency care for those who need it. Beginning May 19, five of the site's acute care beds will reopen for admissions, with other beds to reopen in stages starting next week to support the return of patients and residents were previously who evacuated from the site.

Appointments with laboratory, diagnostic imaging, mental health, dialysis and public health are also resuming over the coming days. This includes urgent CT and ultrasound appointments resuming today with patients being contacted directly to have appointments booked. Other services coming online include: May 18

o Home Care clients can contact the Home Care office at 780-621-4933 to have scheduled visits resume.

o Addiction and Mental Health crisis services resume. If you need urgent support, call the Mental Health Help Line at 1-877-303-2642.

May 19

o All routine, non-urgent CT and ultrasound appointments resume.

o Dialysis appointments resume. Patients are being contacted directly to transition their care back from other facilities.

• May 23

o Community lab collection appointments resume.

o All other Addiction and Mental Health services, including initial assessments and intakes, resume.

May 24

٠

o Public Health immunization services resume. Clients who had appointments impacted due to the evacuation can call the Community Health Centre at 780-542-4415 to rebook.

o The Community Cancer Centre will resume treatment services. The Cancer Centre Transition Team will work directly with patients to transition appointments back to the community.

Alberta Health Services (AHS) continues to work on the return of patients and continuing care residents who were evacuated from the Drayton Valley Hospital and Care Centre on May 4. These patients and residents remain safe alternative facilities in at this time. Their moves back to Drayton Valley will be carefully coordinated in the days ahead and their families will be notified when move dates are confirmed.

Residents of Serenity House will also be moved back to the community by AHS as part of the LTC resident moves.

AHS is extremely grateful for its frontline teams, staff and physicians who have come together to support the wildfire response across the province. We are also appreciative of our community partners and volunteers who continue to support our patients and residents while they are temporarily displaced.

AHS provides wildfire resources for Albertans at AHS.ca/wildfire, including mental health, air quality, and emergency planning links.

Alberta Health Services is the provincial health authority responsible for planning and delivering health supports and services for more than four million adults and children living in Alberta. Our mission is to provide a patient-focused, quality health system that is accessible and sustainable for all Albertans. Our current focus is on reducing emergency department wait-times, improving EMS response times, increasing access to surgeries, and improving patient flow.

This afternoon, Leduc County and Edmonton International Airport (YEG) celebrated the future of fire services at a groundbreaking ceremony for a new fire station that will support YEG, Queen Elizabeth II Highway and Nisku Business Park with a 24/7 fire crew.

"We have partnered with YEG to provide fire service to the region for almost 20 years. In the last 10 years, both the airport and Leduc County have experienced significant growth that required us to look at our existing infrastructure. Investing now in infrastructure like this fire station will provide much-needed space for firefighters who provide a vital service to residents and businesses in one of the fastest growing areas of the County." Leduc County Mayor Tanni Doblanko

"Edmonton International Airport (YEG) is proud to continue collaborating with Leduc County to find winwin-win opportunities for our region. This fire hall and expanded Leduc County services represents a modernization for how emergency services are delivered to YEG and within the region, and an investment attraction opportunity for Leduc County. These are the kinds of collaborative efforts that allow our airport to succeed - and when we succeed, so does the region." Myron Keehn, President & CEO - Edmonton International Airport (YEG)

The new \$5.3 million investment will replace the previous station to accommodate for future growth and will serve the community for the next 40 years.

Leduc County will assume operational control of groundside fire services in January 2024, which is when the new station will open. Fire crews will continue operating from the existing station until Dec. 31, 2023.

LEDUC RCMP CRIME REDUCTION UNIT PROACTIVE PATROLS LEADS TO CHARGES AND RECOVERY OF TWO VEHICLES

The Leduc RCMP's Crime Reduction Unit (LCRU)'s mandate includes proactive patrols to interrupt criminal activity and reduce crime.

On April 27, 2023, Leduc RCMP received a report of a stolen truck from a parking lot on Airport Road in Leduc County, Alta. Following further investigation, LCRU with the assistance of the Edmonton Airport Security Operations Control Centre, determined the truck was stolen on April 24, 2023. A suspect was identified and officers began making efforts to locate and arrest him.

On May 4, 2023, at approximately 8:30 p.m., members of LCRU were making proactive patrols when they observed a truck parked in a parking lot in Leduc Common with a male slouched over the steering wheel. A query of the truck vehicle identification number showed it to be the same truck reported stolen on April 27, 2023.

Members of Leduc RCMP and LCRU arrested Anthony Whitford (30), a resident of Edmonton, Alta. Whitford was charged with:

• Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000

Following a judicial hearing, Whitford was remanded in custody. He is scheduled to appear in Leduc provincial court on May 25, 2023.

On May 5, 2023 at approximately 1:00 a.m., members of LCRU, were making proactive patrols in Willow Park Estates when an officer observed a truck with a damaged drivers side door. A licence plate query of the truck showed the vehicle had been stolen in Leduc sometime between the evening of May 3 and the morning of May 4, 2023. The driver of the vehicle stopped abruptly in an alley and fled on foot.

LCRU and members of Leduc RCMP made foot patrols with the assistance of the RCMP Police Dog Services. The driver was located and arrested after he was found hiding in a holiday trailer nearby.

Riley Terry Garrett (27), a residence of Leduc, was arrested and charged with:

• Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000

• Fail to comply with release order

• Fail to comply with undertaking

Garrett was also charged in relation to the truck stolen report from April 27, 2023 with:

• Theft of a motor vehicle

• Fail to comply with release order

• Fail to comply with undertaking

Following a judicial hearing, Garrett was released from custody. He is scheduled to appear in Leduc provincial court on June 1, 2023.

"Our Crime Reduction Unit supports frontline police work by conducting targeted enforcement, or "hotspot" patrols, based on crime trend analysis, intelligence and consultation with community leaders," says Acting Sgt. Penny Penney, Leduc Crime Reduction Unit. "We will continue to target those individuals who create the greatest harm in our communities and hold them accountable for their actions."






