collision scene. The occupants of the second vehicle fled the area.

Following a lengthy investigation by Parkland General Investigation Section and Parkland Crime Reduction Unit, Rudy Bird of Paul Band First Nation was arrested and charged with the following offences:

- Criminal negligence causing death
- Fail to remain at the scene of a collision causing death
- Operation of a motor vehicle while prohibited;
- Possession of property obtained by crime over five thousand dollars.

A judicial interim release hearing was held and Bird was remanded into custody. Bird is scheduled to appear on Oct. 11, 2023, in Stony Plain, Alberta Court of Justice.



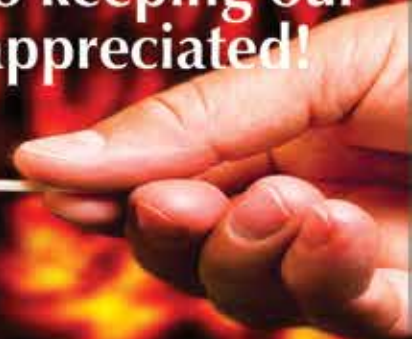

LEDUC CRIME REDUCTION UNIT RECOVER STOLEN VEHICLE AND LAY CHARGES

On Sept. 5, 2023 a member of the Leduc RCMP Crime Reduction Unit (LCRU) was on patrol when they observed a stolen truck in Leduc. A traffic stop was initiated with the assistance of a member of the Alberta RCMP Traffic - Leduc. The vehicle fled from police at a high rate of speed. Due to public safety concerns, police did not pursue.

On Sept. 6, 2023, a member of the LCRU

located the same stolen truck in Leduc and followed the vehicle to a residence in Devon, Alta., where the two vehicle occupants exited the vehicle and entered into an apartment building.

As a result, members of Leduc RCMP, LCRU, Alberta RCMP Traffic - Leduc and Devon RCMP, executed a warrant to enter a premise and arrested the two vehicle occupants.

Anthony Whitford (31), a resident of Edmonton, was arrested on a Canada wide warrant for violating conditions of his

MÉTIS CITIZENS ELECT NEW PRESIDENT IN FIRST ELECTION FOR NEW OTIPEMISIWAK MÉTIS GOVERNMENT

Submitted by Métis Nation of Alberta (MNA)

Citizens of the Métis Nation of Alberta (MNA) have concluded voting in their first election for the Otipemisiwak Métis Government. This election marks the formal transition of MNA to the Otipemisiwak Métis Government.

In a province-wide election held from September 13-19, 2023, which included mail-in, online, and in-person voting, a total of 8,167 ballots were cast and accepted. This figure does not include ballots that were spoiled or rejected. These results are preliminary, with official results awaiting a single district recount.

The Otipemisiwak Métis Government Constitution establishes a Citizens Council consisting of a President, Women's Representative, and Youth Representative (each elected province wide) and 22 District Representatives (each elected by the MNA Citizens in their respective districts). The province-wide vote saw all of these positions filled.
