### Statement On The Petition E-4460 And Bill C-336, Noah's Law

#### Continued from Page 1

the Sex Offender Registry Act.

"In response to MP Gerald Soroka's introduction of Bill C-336, MP Blaine Calkins has presented Petition e-4460 in the House of Commons. This petition has garnered substantial support, with nearly 22,000 Canadians fervently urging the Government of Canada to promptly address the deficiencies in the justice system.

"Petition e-4460 specifically calls for the implementation of the following

provisions outlined in Bill C-336:

"Mandatory Reporting Requirements: Establish mandatory reporting requirements for convicted sexual offenders whenever they change their place of residence.

"Failure to Comply as an Offense: Specify that the failure to comply with these reporting obligations constitutes an offense, resulting in the issuance of an arrest warrant.

"Dedicated Classification for Offenders: Create a dedicated classification for offenders who have been convicted of sexual assault offenses against children and received sentences exceeding two years or those convicted of two or more violent sexual offenses or offenses involving the abduction of women and/or children.

"The urgency of this proposed legislation cannot be overstated. Canada's justice system necessitates immediate action to address its shortcomings and safeguard the most vulnerable members of our society."

This week, I want to tell you specifically what the Onoway Legion's Poppy Fund has done over the last year:


•We paid cash prizes



November 11 at the Onoway Heritage Centre (the museum). Everyone welcome, but please be in your seats by 10:30 am. The service will begin about 10:45 am.



### IS IT TIME FOR YOUR MAMMOGRAM?

Screen Test is coming to Mayerthorpe November 16 to 20, 2023 and Onoway November 21 & 22, 2023

Screen Test is a free service provided by Alberta Health Services that offers screening mammograms. Our mobile screening units travel to 121 communities throughout Alberta to provide convenient access to breast cancer screening.

Having regular screening mammograms is the best way to find breast cancer early, before symptoms appear and

when treatment may work better.

Who should have a screening mammogram?

If you're 45 to 74, you don't need a referral to have a mammogram. Make screening part of your regular health routine. Plan to have a mammogram every 2 years or as decided by you and your healthcare provider.

If you're 40 to 44 or over 75, discuss the risks and benefits of screening with your healthcare provider. You will need a referral if you're 40 to 44 and it's your first mammogram, or if you're over 75.



Breast density is the amount of dense tissue compared to the amount of fat in a person's breasts. It can be harder to find cancer in dense breasts because this tissue appears white on a mammogram, the same colour as many kinds of breast cancer. It's common to have dense breast tissue.

Dense breasts are only one of many risk factors for breast cancer. Other factors, such as age and genetics, have a bigger impact on your overall risk. You can't tell how dense your breasts are by size, look or feel. The only way to find out is by having a mammogram.



### "IF IT AIN'T BROKE, DON'T FIX IT!"

This old saying has been passed down for generations with hopes of imparting some commonsense wisdom. It was true in the day of my Grandparents and will hold true in the days of my Great Grandkids. The nuance however is when to apply it, and when to realize that the state of "Conventional Wisdom" may not always be wise. If you don't explore options and ask yourself and others, "why", and "how do you know", you may be in for a world of hurt, or run the risk of being irrelevant. Doing it the same way out of convention may not be the best course of action when the mother of all invention requires a change. Necessity, for resilience, and the need to adapt for survival.

We can all be sure there is an energy transition on the horizon. I'm not convinced that those that are crowing from the top of the proverbial barn yard pile and that know the cause of the forgone solution in their minds are any wiser than a barn yard rooster we had when I was a kid. That old rooster was very sure of himself, toughest one around, and took a run at my mother and I on several occasions when we went to collect eggs. When that rooster tried, all tough and sure of his supremacy in the barn yard, the reality set in a hurry when the rooster was missing his head. We were having chicken for supper, and my father had a wing for cleaning off the chaff that collected on the radiator of the old combine. That tough as nails, crowing from the barnvard pile, full of himself rooster was dead wrong in his assumptions and assertions.

I've heard my share of roosters lately saying that we need to "Dismantle" the energy sectors here in Alberta, because hydrocarbons are the cause of "The Climate Crisis". They are so certain that regardless of carbon capture or utilization, that shutting it down is "The" only solution, and don't even both-

er asking if Carbon is the issue, and if you eliminate the carbon then how is there still a problem? How dare you question their "known solution".

I have also heard from similar roosters crowing away that the agriculture sector, anything that produces meat from the land rather than a laboratory environment is a major contributor to "The Climate Crisis". I've had a chance to get to know our new team since the election, and we have had a few good training sessions with the new MLAs as they are getting acclimated to their new roles. As the Chief Government Whip, I'm liking what I've seen as the entire UCP team is coming together. We may have a smaller team by numbers that we had last time, but honestly, for the folks in our area and the province as a whole, I think we are in good shape. We have a clear mandate after the election, and a clear message to ensure we stay engaged on what matters the most to folks. We won't get distracted by all the roosters, we will remember who we represent, and that we always look to the future, while keeping grounded in reality. We will offer options to folks, we will keep the communication lines open, and in person as much as possible. Often the low tech solution is the best, like this little paper that you are reading, tried and true. Afterall, if it Ain't Broke....




