EVANSBURG RCMP CHARGES MULTIPLE PROLIFIC OFFENDERS AFTER FLIGHT FROM POLICE

On May 10, 2024, just after midnight, Evansburg RCMP received a complaint of suspicious vehicles out in Parkland County, Alta., along Highway 627. Police attended the area, located two suspicious trucks and attempted to complete a traffic stop. The trucks ig-

nored the police, attempted to flee the area and, in doing so, rammed one of the RCMP vehicles.

With the assistance of Edmonton Air Services, Mayerthorpe RCMP, Parkland RCMP, and Drayton Valley RCMP, the members proceeded to pursue both vehicles, resulting in the arrest of 3 males and 1 female. It was confirmed that both

trucks had been recently stolen from Vermilion, Alta., and Red Deer, Alta. All suspects are well known prolific offenders who were all out on release orders for varying offences, with one male wanted on a Canada-wide warrant for parole violations.

As a result of the investigation, the following

On March 11, 2024 at approximately 3:30 pm a traffic stop was initiated by the Alberta Sheriffs for a traffic violation on Highway 16 near Highway 60. During

the traffic stop the Sheriff observed a several weapons, including a firearm, and drug paraphernalia. The suspect was arrested and the Parkland RCMP was contacted to assist with the investigation. Lisa Beriault (35), a resident of Edmonton, was charged with Break and enter to rural property and Obstruct police officer.


Lloyd Handbury (40), a resident of Winfield, Alta., was charged with Break and enter to rural property, Obstruct police officer and two counts of Failure to comply.

The accused were brought before a justice of the peace. Rumsey, Watson and Handbury were remanded into custody while Beriault was released on conditions. They are to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Evansburg on May 13, 2024.

in cash. The suspect was currently on a 10-year firearms/ammunition prohibition

Edmonton resident, Markus Busch (45) has been charged with:

HELPING COMMUNITIES SAVE MONEY, LOWER ENERGY COSTS

Alberta's new \$6-million program will help municipalities make energy-saving upgrades, reducing costs and emissions.

Arenas, community centres and other facilities consume large amounts of energy. These facilities can be costly to operate and upgrades are often expensive to implement. With inflation and energy costs on the rise, many municipalities want to improve energy efficiency and save money.

Thanks to funding from the Alberta government, municipalities can now apply to the Community Energy Conservation Program to make energy-efficient upgrades to municipally owned buildings. This will help communities of all sizes save energy, lower energy costs and reduce emissions.





SUPPORTING WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING HEROES

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Families of wildland firefighters are now eligible for Alberta's Heroes' Fund.

Alberta's first responders put their lives on the line each day to protect their communities. The Alberta Heroes' Fund for First Responders (Heroes' Fund) was established in 2020 to recognize those risks and sacrifices. Alberta is the only province with a fund of this kind. It provides a one-time, tax-free payment of \$100,000 to eligible families of first responders who have lost their lives performing their duties, such as police officers, paramedics and firefighters.

Alberta's government is now expanding the fund's

eligibility, through an order-in-council, to include the families of fallen wildland firefighters.

"There is no higher form of public service than to risk one's life to maintain public safety, and Alberta's government is honouring that. Being eligible for the Heroes' Fund recognizes the great risks our wildland firefighters take to protect our lives and communities. While I know the payment cannot bring back their loved ones, it will help ease the burdens for families of fallen wildland firefighters."

Eligibility for Heroes' Fund payments now extend to workers who fight, suppress or extinguish a wildfire, such as firefighters on the ground and helicopter and water bomber crews. The Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) is responsible for determining eligibility on a case-by-case basis.

"These fallen wildland firefighters and their families have made the ultimate sacrifice while protecting the people and communities of Alberta and their sacrifice will not be forgotten. This monetary support will never be enough, but it is hoped that it will ease some of the financial burden facing families who must deal with the loss of a loved one."

In addition to wildland firefighters, those eligible for Heroes' Fund payments

include the families of structural firefighters employed by a municipality or Metis Settlement, police officers, sheriffs, provincial correctional officers and paramedics.

"I'm proud that we're expanding the province's Heroes' Fund to include our wildland firefighters. They go to work every day, knowing the sacrifice they and their families may be faced with. Albertans owe a debt of gratitude to the brave men and women who work tirelessly throughout the wildfire season to protect our communities and forests."

NURSE PRACTITIONERS TO HELP STRENGTHEN PRIMARY CARE

Submitted by Government of Alberta

A new program will support nurse practitioners to work independently and provide Albertans with more access to primary care clinics.

Alberta's government is committed to stabilizing, strengthening and improving Alberta's primary health care system. Every Albertan should be able to access primary care when and where they need it. To help achieve this goal, the government is expanding opportunities for nurse practitioners.

Through the Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Program, nurse practitioners will receive approximately 80 per cent of the compensation provided to family

physicians who provide comprehensive primary care. Compensation will be determined based on panel size (the number of patients a nurse practitioner sees) and the number of patient care hours provided. The program will enable nurse practitioners to practise comprehensive patient care autonomously and operate their own practices, or to practise autonomously in existing primary care clin-

"Nurse practitioners are a welcome and integral part of the solution to improving access to primary health care services. Finalizing this funding model is an exciting step forward in our journey to refocus health care in Alberta, and I'm looking forward to this expansion of

health care services."

To be eligible for compensation through \$15-million program, nurse practitioners must meet a number of requirements, including committing to provide medically necessary primary care services, having a panel size of at least 900 patients, providing after-hours access on weekends, evenings or holidays, and accepting walk-in appointments as they build a panel size of 900 patients. The minimum panel size of 900 is consistent with the British Columbia model.

The nurse practitioner program is structured to incentivize higher patient attachment as compensation for nurse practitioners increases as their panel size

grows. This, in combination with the other incentives including the Panel Management Support Program, will help to support the more than 700,000 Albertans who are currently not attached to a primary health care provider.

"This program is exciting news for Albertans. It not only increases health care capacity in communities across the province but also provides more Albertans with access to a regular primary care provider and will help take pressure off the rest of the health system. Supporting nurse practitioners to do more of the work they are trained to do is another tool we're using to stabilize and strengthen primary health

care throughout Alberta." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Health

Clinics, communities and Primary Care Networks can partner with nurse practitioners who are just entering practice by applying for one-time mentorship funding. Each mentor is eligible for \$10,000 during a nurse practitioner's first 18 months to ensure a successful transition to independent practice.

"Many Albertans are still without access to a primary care provider. With 900 nurse practitioners in Alberta, there is an opportunity to significantly improve access to primary care services. This is the right next step in a marathon of change that is necessary for

our primary care system. I look forward to continuing this work to ensure the success and viability of these practices and improving access to primary care services for Albertans."

Nurse practitioners interested in practising through this program can now submit an expression of interest to Alberta Health. Each expression of interest will be evaluated, and nurse practitioners who meet the requirements will be sent an application form. Through a \$2-million grant over the next three years, the Nurse Practitioner Association of Alberta will help nurse practitioners throughout the application process, recruit nurse practitioners to participate in the program and support them as they plan to work independently in an existing practice or set up their own clinics.

"By providing more options for rural and remote communities to access primary care by way of nurse practitioners, we will ensure all Albertans have the ability to get the care they need when and where they need it, ultimately providing better health outcomes."
