These policies, disguised as environmental safeguards, effectively serve to destroy agricultural productivity in the name of combating climate change.

New funding for student spaces in two post-secondary education programs will help recruit and train rural, remote and Indigenous teachers across Alberta.

Rural, remote and Indigenous communities sometimes experience difficulties recruiting and retaining teachers for their classrooms. However, those who can study closer to home are more likely to remain in their home community after

they finish their education. By enabling education students to complete most of their studies while living and working in rural, remote and Indigenous communities, Alberta's government is helping address the challenges of recruitment and retention.

The University of Calgary's Bachelor of Education Community-Based After-Degree Program within the Werklund School of Education provides opportunities for students

to be a part of their rural and northern community school system for most of their degree.

"The expansion of Werklund's community-based program is responsive to the needs in rural school districts. We know the diversity of expertise in these communities is phenomenal. This funding will provide committed individuals living in rural areas of Alberta with the access they require to become excellent teachers."

The University of Alberta's Aboriginal Teacher Education Program (ATEP) provides opportunities for Indigenous adult learners to become certificated teachers, with a focus on Indigenous cultures and perspectives on teaching and learning. The program will allow working individuals to complete their certification online, part-time, and outside their working hours.

"ATEP has played a significant role in increasing the number of Indigenous certificated teachers in Alberta classrooms, while enabling them to maintain connections to their communities. Delivered through Indigenous worldviews and pedagogies, the program is transforming education in our province. This investment will expand and advance ATEP's mission of improving the educational experiences of Indigenous students, families, and their communities."

SIMPLE QUESTIONS, HOW DO YOU KNOW, AND THEN WHAT?

I'm in a time crunch today, I missed my deadline last week to get an article in, and its going to be by the skin of my teeth if you I can make it in this week. The best made plans of Mice and Men apparently is alive and well. This week's topic literally has been something in the back of my mind for a long time, and it's something I'd like to share that not only gets the conversation headed a good direction but can help to come up with some great ideas or plans.

I had a person sit across the table from me one time telling me that we needed to diversify the economy (I agree) and the only way to do that was to build out solar farms and windmills everywhere. We needed to stop our conventional energy, oh yeah and while we were at it, limit the amount of beef production we have. Usually when I hear this type of lead in, I tend to nod, and say something like..." you don't say", or "is that right? With this person in particular I decided to push back, give the full

attention, because of the persons "Holier than Thou" body posture and said "Ok, I'll bite".

I just asked those two little questions, interchanged, like that old trench coat wearing detective Columbo back in the 80's. They didn't have the technical background, they didn't think about the ramifications, and they sure as heck didn't think about what would come next. They were all set to have some theoretical argument on the environment, the energy sector, heck even the colour of the sky, but never saw someone asking them to layout the plan, or to ask more questions on something as simple as next steps.

In this field I did have some experience, I did understand how the model worked, how if there was a simple silver bullet solution that it already would have been done. The person who was all ready for a fight, has the wind taken out of their sails, and to their credit, listened to what I had to say. They tried to use my questions back on me, and I had the answers to most, but not to all, because I know

enough to know I don't know it all.

I've been fortunate enough to have some great mentors over the years that have taught me these lessons. When I was pitching something to them, or when they were checking up on me for a deliverable, or when I came up with a solution to a problem. How do you know, and then what. If a person takes the time to lay out the next steps, or sometimes, reverse plans from the desired outcome, normally they will be able to trouble shoot the plan themselves. They then will have a few options in case of the "What If's" that pop up along the way as well, so invariably, one plan becomes three, and the chance of meeting the desired outcome becomes vastly improved.

So, when we are looking at legislation, and the ministers or my fellow members are pitching the bill, or law, or regulation that they believe will solve a problem, often the simplest questions can reveal an amendment or change that potentially was not contemplated. By the time it makes it through the policy committee, cab-

inet, caucus, and then into the house for debate, there literally have been thousands of people that have had their chance to offer input and ask the questions.

We have several pieces of legislation on the floor of the house right now that are being scrutinized, and there will be amendments in all likely hood to address the concerns raised, or suggestions to make it better. It can be very frustrating at times to go through the process, and it is lengthy, but it is with the intent to make sure what we do is the right thing for the majority of Albertans.

Take the time to listen to others, take the time yourself before shooting out an idea to think about the what if, be prepared to receive comment, and critical input, be humble enough to take it, even from a detractor, because if you can prove your idea in a hostile environment, it is probably a great idea, and will survive on its own when you aren't there to defend it. So keep asking me, How do you know? and I'll keep asking "what matters to you".

Campers can make reservations online up to 90 days ahead of their trip for individual and backcountry campsites, or 180 days ahead for group and comfort camping. Spur-of-the-moment adventure seekers can also use the 'Camping this Weekend' feature to easily find a reservable site.

Wildfire awareness and prevention

Alberta's wildland firefighters continue working tirelessly to respond to and extinguish wildfires across northern parts of the province, but these brave men and women need the public's help to prevent wildfires in the days and weeks ahead. One key part of wildfire prevention during the camping season is to

observe fire bans. Multiple regions in the province are currently under full or partial fire bans and all campers and day-use site users should check on the fire ban status of their chosen recreation area.

When enjoying the outdoors this long weekend, please help prevent wildfires. Campfires account for the highest percentage of human-caused wildfires. Human-caused wildfires are completely preventable. All campers - and day-use site users - are reminded that when you are done with your campfire, soak it, stir it, and soak it again until ashes are cool to the touch.

'Wilderness Camping' on public land

For those seeking a unique and secluded camping ex-

perience, Alberta's public land offers a range of options. From established campgrounds with amenities to remote random camping spots in the wilderness, there's something for every kind of camper.

For a more rustic adventure, campers can explore camping areas located in remote parts of the province. These spots are often nestled along gravel roads or recreational trails and offer a true backcountry experience for outdoor enthusiasts.

A Public Lands Camping Pass is required for campers, backpackers, horse packers and other users 18 years and older who are planning to spend the night on public land along the Eastern Slopes of the

Rocky Mountains from Grande Prairie to Waterton Lakes National Park within the pass area. Children and youth under the age of 18 do not require a pass.

As more visitors explore Alberta's campgrounds, provincial parks and public land this summer, we wish you happy camping.
