

Whitecourt Town Council has awarded \$30,000 in funding under the 2024 Enhancement Grant Program. Recipients include:

Council has adopted/amended the following policies related to the Community Safety Department:

Council has awarded \$5,200 to the Whitecourt Isga Tourism Association to support the development of the Tee-Pee Village project. The Association has con-

SHERIFFS SHUT DOWN ALLEGED DRUG HOUSE IN SPRUCE GROVE

The Alberta Sheriffs have shut down a property in

Spruce Grove where complaints of drug activity prompted frequent visits from police.

The Safer Communi-

ties and Neighbourhoods (SCAN) unit of the Alberta Sheriffs obtained a court order against the owner of 31 Heatherlands Way that gives

investigators the authority to close the property for 90 days, starting at noon on May 29. Any tenancy

agreement or lease of any tenant of the property is terminated effective that date.

The community safety order, obtained in Court of King's Bench, bars people from the property until the closure period ends on Aug. 27. The property will be boarded up, fenced and all the locks will be changed. SCAN unit members will continue to monitor the property for any activity while their investigation remains ongoing.

"All Albertans deserve to feel safe at home and in their communities, and the closure of yet another problem property by Alberta's SCAN team will help ensure that remains the case. I commend all involved in shutting down this known

hotspot of illegal activity so Albertans can feel safe in their communities."

"Since 2020, RCMP have responded to more than 100 calls for service involving this residence with occurrences ranging from drugs, disturbances, assaults and a non-suspicious death. Late last year, RCMP executed a search warrant on the property, finding fentanyl and charging one occupant with trafficking in a controlled substance. We are thankful for the opportunity to work collaboratively with SCAN in employing alternative tactics in combating a troublesome residence in the community."

The Alberta Sheriffs work with other law enforcement agencies to shut down properties being used for illegal activities. The SCAN unit operates under the Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act, which uses legal sanctions and court orders to hold owners accountable for illegal activity happening on their property.

Since its inception in 2008, Alberta's SCAN unit has investigated more than 9,000 properties and issued 120 community safety orders. Most complaints are resolved by working with owners to stop the illegal activity on their property.

ENHANCING PUBLIC SAFETY WITH FIRE SERVICE GRANTS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government is supporting a new research initiative to gather fire services data that will help municipalities strengthen public safety in Alberta.

Firefighters across Alberta play a critical role in the public safety of communities. Besides fighting fires, municipal firefighters provide first response to medical emergencies and other disasters, conduct search and rescue operations, and educate the public about fire safety and prevention.

Investing in services that support municipalities in strengthening public safety is a top priority for the government. Strong partnerships are key to keeping Albertans safe, which includes keeping firefighters safe. To help with that ongoing work, Alberta's government is providing grants totalling \$700,000 to municipalities and the Alberta Fire Chiefs Association (AFCA) for research and training.

"Public safety is always a priority, and our government recognizes that strong partnerships are key to keeping Albertans safe. We are pleased to work together with the Alberta Fire Chiefs Association to improve firefighting services for all Albertans. We remain committed to ensuring Alberta municipalities have access to excellent firefighting resources and information."

It is vital that local fire services are equipped to respond safely and effectively to all emergencies, and firefighters are able to receive training in alignment with industry best practices. To ensure this, Alberta's government provides ongoing support to municipal fire services through annual grants for fire services training. A total of \$500,000 in grants through the Fire Services Training Program is provided each year to help fire departments cover costs such as fire services course fees and training materials. All municipalities, Metis Settlements,

and First Nations communities in Alberta are eligible for these grants, which help prepare firefighters with the knowledge and skills they need to protect their communities.

Fire hazards, risks and responses change regularly and it is absolutely critical that local firefighters have all the information they need to be able to respond quickly, safely and efficiently. Research is needed to help local firefighting experts identify the specific data they



need, the best ways to collect it, and how municipalities can use it to mitigate risks.

To accomplish this work, a one-time \$200,000 grant will help the Alberta Fire Chiefs Association to research and develop recommendations for how to strengthen provincial fire data reporting. Improving the quality of fire data reporting will put municipal leaders in a better position to make well-informed decisions about local fire services and protection strategies

for their communities.

- The proposed amended to Land Use Bylaw regulations defining development that does not require development permits include: 3.2.1(a)(d)(e)(k)(l) and (q) are all proposed to be amended.
- New addition includes: 3.2.1(w) which would not require development permit approval for solar energy installations on structures. The size of solar energy installation would not exceed size of roof it is placed upon, and the structure must have all necessary development and building permits. This point will highlight that the development authority does not waive building or electrical permit requirements, only development permit requirements subject to the above requirements.
- 15.1.175 "Solar Energy Installation" means the development of a renewable or alternative energy generating unit that collects sunlight to convert into thermal or electrical energy.

This correspondence is in response to your letter dated May 14, 2024, regarding a “cease and desist” demand to myself and the other members of Fire Rescue International (“FRI”).

I would first like to provide some clarification on the statements made in your May 14, 2024, letter. The attendance of FRI employees at residences around town was part of a previously scheduled door-to-door fire safety program which occurs every 2-3 years. Our employees were instructed to only talk with members of the community about fire safety matters during these attendances. I am not aware of specific instance where an FRI employee made disparaging remarks about the Town of Onoway during these visits. The reality is that the members of the community have legitimate concerns about the uncertainty of the Town’s future fire services and FRI has an obligation as the Town’s current fire service provider to address these concerns.

The Pamphlet that was distributed by FRI during these door-to-door attendances does not contain any inaccurate or inflammatory information, but rather simply states that:

The Town Fire Department will cease operations on March 7, 2025; and

As a result of the changes in the Town’s fire service provider, residents could be faced with increased fire response times.

The statement regarding the Town Fire Department ceasing operations on March 7, 2025, is accurate and is a decision that was made by the Town to terminate their agreement with FRI early and without cause. As far as we are aware, the Town has not yet found an alternative fire service provider to take over after March 7, 2025. The statement regarding the potential for increased fire response times is based on 2023 callout statistics and is factually accurate. These are not “disparaging remarks” as you alleged in your letter but are rather facts and information that we are obligated to provide to the members of the community as part of our role as their fire service provider.

Regarding the third alleged “disparaging remarks” that the change to fire services will “needlessly endanger lives”. I am not aware of any instance in which this was said by a member of FRI to any member of the community and this remark is not included anywhere in the pamphlet that was distributed. Notwithstanding that this statement was not being made by members of FRI, the statement is ultimately an opinion, not a “disparaging remark”. In fact, the Town’s decision to terminate their agreement with FRI early

and without cause is a decision which could potentially endanger lives given the current uncertainty of who the new fire service provider is and also based on the previously referenced callout statistics regarding fire response times.

The safety and peace of mind of the Town’s residents has been and will continue to be the paramount concern of FRI while we remain the Town’s fire service provider. You allege in your letter that the distribution of the information contained in the pamphlet “only serves to promote fear and anxiety”. With that I disagree. The distribution of this information is part of our ongoing obligation to the Town’s residents to be informed regarding their fire services. Any anxiety or fear caused by these statements is only the results of the uncertainty the residents have about their future fire services, brought on by the Town’s decision to terminate their agreement with FRI early, without cause, and without an alternative fire service provider lined up.

The door-to-door fire safety program has now concluded. As we have done throughout, FRI employees will continued not to make any comments to the Town’s residents solely for the purpose of disparaging the Town or creating fear. However, as I mentioned above, the reality is that until residents are provided with some certainty regarding the Town’s future fire ser-

VICES, they will continue to ask questions of and seek information from FRI employees. This is a daily occurrence that happens to me and other FRI employees, whether it be in line at the gas station or while responding to a call. The residents have questions that are not being answered by the Town and while FRI remains the Town’s fire service provider, we have an obligation to address these questions and provide this information to the residents that we protect.

Regarding the last sentence of your letter, I am unsure of what “legal remedies’ the Town might have arising from the above-noted statements given that these statements are factually accurate and being provided by FRI as part of our ongoing obligations to the residents of the Town. If the Town does decide to initiate legal action against FRI, we will be seeking to recover any legal expenses incurred in defending that claim directly from the Town as this would be a frivolous and meritless claim. I personally think that the Town’s time and resources could be spent on more useful endeavors, such as securing a replacement fire service provider and providing its residents with the information they are seeking regarding that change... or better yet: Entering mediation with its’ current fire department as FRI has previously offered.

WHAT ARE YOU WILLING TO GIVE UP TO MOVE FOREWORD?

This may seem like a strange title, but please consider for a moment. What would you be willing to Give up, to move forward? It is a tough lesson to learn, and at some point, a person may reach a level where they have all they want, they are comfortable in their skin, they know what matters most, and they have reached their destination. Then...someone comes in, or something, and upsets your world, your plans as good as they were are no longer relevant, you need to adapt. You may need to move on. So... what are you willing to give up to move forward?

We currently have a number of bills that are going to allow us to use the lessons learned over the last few years, to adapt, to be resilient, and to change what is necessary to move our province forward. We have a bill that will allow us to better respond in collaboration with our municipalities to emergencies, modernizing the prairie fires act. We will move an election period, out of flood and fire season, and into what could be late harvest season. We have another bill that will ensure that when federal dollars come shaking out west that we are at the table with those that may have strings attached. We want to ensure we get our share of our tax dollars, and Albertans should not be dealt a bad hand because we are not wired the same as the province west of us, or way down east. Our universities and municipalities are second to none, so why do we get less?

When I was on the campaign trail last year, I asked folks a real simple couple of questions, do you think our healthcare is broken. The second question was then if so, will you let us fix it? You see, its not a matter of being under funded, it's a matter

of needing a reformation of organization, and I would argue of culture. Too big isn't working too good, and having the patient play "ring around the Rosie" with the big cumbersome system does nothing for the best patient outcomes in regards to service levels. We are at present in the house trying to get a bill passed to allow us to fix what folks told us that needed to be corrected.

The cost of living just keeps getting higher and higher! If you don't think that the carbon levy isn't having an effect on everything just compare your grocery, heating, and fuel costs to anyone in the northern state in the USA. They don't have a personal carbon pricing scheme. Fuel is \$0.80 per liter cheaper, heating costs are a 1/3 less expensive, as is the power. We are the only ones that figure taking money out of your pocket to just live will change the weather, to add insult to injurie the feds don't even measure the results of their scheme. They should, but not in tons saved, but lives ruined. It breaks my heart and makes me mad as a hornet.

I know that our team cant boil the ocean, and we can only work on the things within our control, but collaboration to deal with the bigger problems is needed if we can keep the whole deck of cards from collapsing. We have friends at the provincial level and many are sharing their legislation with us on how they manage many of the same federal challenges, and using what we are doing as well. We are signing not only economic corridor Memorandums of Understanding (MOU), but MOU's for nuclear power development. We can deal with adaptability and resilience in our systems, and our infrastructure. We can change the electricity file policies to allow for a grid that not only is reliable but cost effective.

To reach our goals to manage the challenges and ensure our province and people have the best chance for success, we have to make changes, we have to leave some things behind. We have to all realize that due to the circumstances we find ourselves in, we need to adapt and overcome. The good news is, we are seeing our efforts bear fruit. Investments are up, people are moving in, and we are being heard at the federal table, but more importantly on the world stage. When Leaders of foreign countries seek us out specifically, we are doing the right things.

I will continue to work on the "Economic Corridor Development" file as it is gaining some huge traction not only within the provincial government (11 ministries have it written right into their mandate letters) but with our largest trading partner. I've been asked to present the model not only at one Canada USA organization but three this summer alone. I want to be able to have the concept of Fortress North America, by which we are self-sufficient. The Economic corridors are then the pathways to ensure we have responsible and sustainable growth for several generations to come. That translates into investment, jobs, and economic diversity in our own back yards.

Some folks recently have asked what I have been willing to give up to achieve this goal, well it has been a great deal of time and sacrifice of my personal life. The Trolls have been running rampant again, so seeing how this is a local paper, I thought I'd address a few thigs front and center. The love of my life, my best friend and wife along with two of my children have headed south. A professional and personal opportunity came up that was too good not to accept, so they are now in South Dakota for at least a couple of years. I, and my

two oldest children who are now university age, are still planted here in God's country. There was quite frankly a different option, that presented itself to keep our family together, but that would have ended in me having to give up the position as your MLA. I gave my oath, my word to serve, and I still have 3 years left in that commitment. I still have to ensure that the economic corridor model takes hold so it can benefit not only our region, our province, but western Canada for years to come.

I gave my word to help those that needed it, to be their advocate, to be that voice at the table, to represent our area withing the province. So, when folks are taking shots at others, when they are laying it all on the line, when they are willing sometimes to leave things that are so very dear to them to help make things better for not only their family, their community, their province, know full well it is never easy. So, I put to you, what are you willing to leave behind, to sacrifice, to do what you can to be part of a positive change, not for yourself, but for generations to come. I hope you have an amazing week, that you take the time to say please and thank you to a stranger, to show an act of kindness, and to take a pause before offering a criticism, and perhaps, offering a word of encouragement because you just never know that that other person had to leave behind that day.

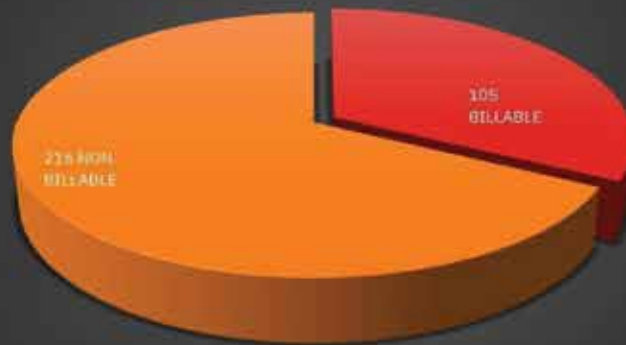

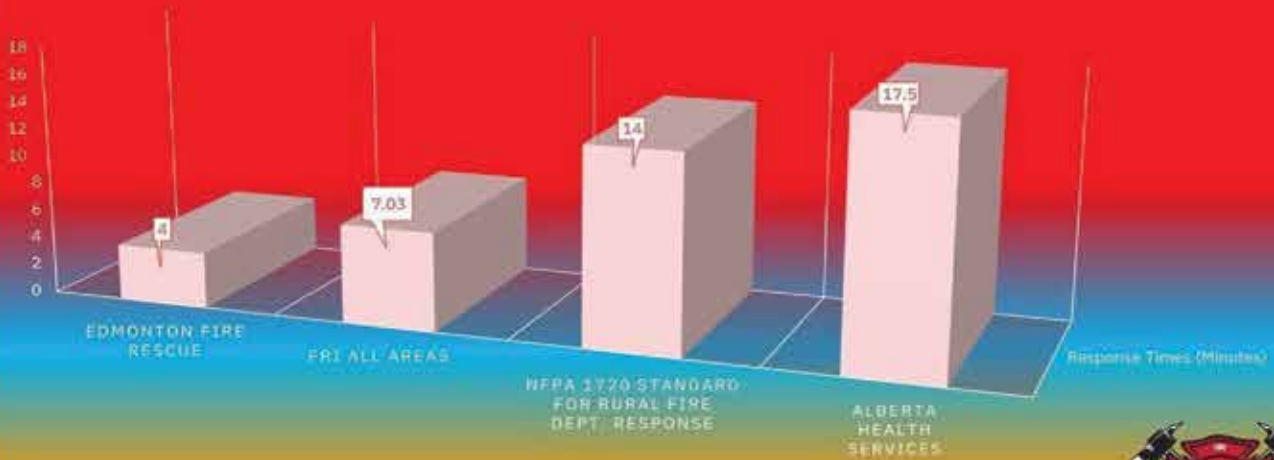

THE WAR AMPS COMMEMORATES THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY OF D-DAY AND THE BATTLE OF NORMANDY

The Lasting Legacy of War Amputees

On June 6, 1944, a pivotal moment unfolded as thousands of Canadian soldiers stormed Juno Beach in Normandy, in the heavily German-fortified coast of France. As the world prepares to commemorate the 80th anni-

versary of D-Day and the Battle of Normandy, The War Amps pays homage to the Canadians who made the ultimate sacrifice during the invasion, and the resilience of those who returned home severely wounded, many missing limbs.

These were young men from small towns and the inner cities embodying the true spirit of cit-

izen soldiers during the Second World War. Driven by patriotism, adventure, or simply a sense of duty, they enlisted with the Canadian Army, unaware that they would become the vanguard of the allied invasion of Europe.

Among them were individuals like Ron Reid, Gavin Hickey, Bob Ross, Jim Parsons, Bill Neil and Dave Ingram.

Ron Reid, of Torbay, Newfoundland, suffered severe injuries upon landing on Juno Beach. Amidst relentless enemy machine gun and mortar fire, he lost his left leg above the knee.

Gavin Hickey, hailing from Durham Centre, New Brunswick, was a mere 19 years old when his regiment stormed Juno Beach. Wounded during the battle for Carpiquet, he lost his left leg be-

low the knee and his left hand.

Bob Ross of Niagara Falls, Ontario, was injured during heavy enemy shelling at the Battle of Hill 195, resulting in the loss of his leg above the knee. Many years later, he reflected on his experience and shared, "It was an ordeal. I don't think I would do it again because maybe I couldn't come back the next time."

Jim Parsons, a local of Sherbrooke, Quebec, landed on Juno Beach on D-Day and fought his way inland. Later that year, he lost his left hand and forearm due to an injury. He received a Mention in Dispatches for his bravery in hauling his troop commander out of a burning tank despite having a badly shattered arm.

Bill Neil, from Winnipeg, and Dave Ingram, of Edmonton, Alberta, were also severely injured during the invasion. Neil, wounded in the Battle of Falaise when his armoured car was hit, lost his left arm above the elbow. Ingram lost his left leg above the knee and part of his right heel after stepping on a landmine during a sniper patrol.


When they returned to Canada, these brave soldiers became members of The War Amps, which was started by amputee veterans returning from the First World War to help each other adapt to their new reality as amputees.

Rob Larman, a Senior Advisor at The War Amps and a leg amputee himself, said, "In the Battle of Normandy, many Canadians died or suffered wounds they had to carry for the rest of their lives. As we mark the 80th anniversary of D-Day, it's important that we never forget."

THE HEROES OF NORMANDY

Submitted by Guy Black

Death struck deeply into those who waded ashore on June 6, 1944. Struggling to quickly move from their landing craft to the sand of Normandy beach. Burdened by the heavy weight of their equipment, and the sights and sounds around them. Before them lay a terrifying array of obstacles waiting to trap, maim, and destroy anyone who attempted to challenge the terrible might of the Nazi occupation of France.

Service men and women came from all across Canada. Local militia units like the South Alberta Regiment, South Alberta Light Horse and the Calgary Highlanders were mobilized for active war service. These part-time "Saturday Night" soldiers were busy in their armories and drill halls, recruiting and training its new members. Some would find themselves "storming Juno beach" on June 6th, while others arrived sometime later, joining the 3rd Canadian Division as they consolidated their foothold on the Normandy coast.

The liberation campaign slowly progressed mile by bloody mile across France until Paris was freed on August 25, 1944. In its wake were left countless dead and injured, destroyed towns and cities. Names of places became etched into the memories of the soldiers who fought

in battles like Bourguébus Ridge, Carpiquet Airport, Caen, the Falaise "Gap", Vaucelles, and Verrières Ridge. The campaign to liberate France from its occupiers would end up taking the lives of 5,021 Canadian soldiers.

The number of war veterans who fought in the liberation campaign have

steadily declined as the years have passed. Fortunately, some of these remarkable old soldiers are still living. They are resilient people who followed a path of duty, endured hardship, faced danger and experienced things we could never imagine. Through the National Order of the Legion of

Honour medal program, the Embassy of France in Canada continues to bestow their nation's highest medal to our veterans who are proudly known as the liberators of France.

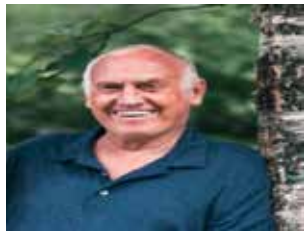
