



## FUNDING TO SUPPORT ALBERTANS AS THEY AGE

A new Aging with Dignity funding agreement with the federal government will enhance Alberta's continuing care transformation efforts to support Albertans as they age.



first-place winners, each school also received a trophy to display at the respective schools.


This year marked the first time in recent history that three students from the same Branch took top prize at the national level. This historical win highlights the exceptional talent, dedication and creativity of our local youth.


years, making everything more expensive at the worst possible time. In fact, since Trudeau became Prime Minister, gas prices have surged by more than 50%.


