



in his plan to quadruple the carbon tax over the next six years, making everything more expensive at the worst possible time. In fact, since Trudeau became Prime Minister, gas prices have surged by more than 50%.

Justin Trudeau may be able to jet set off on a \$230,000 taxpayer, luxury vacation, but most Canadians are having to scale back or cancel their summer plans after Trudeau's carbon tax made gas and groceries unaffordable. Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Due to elevated levels of fecal bacteria currently present in the water at Trestle Creek Beach, located within the Edmonton Zone of Alberta Health Services (AHS), AHS is advising the public not to swim or wade at this beach area, effective immediately.

Elevated levels of fecal bacteria were detected via

testing of the lake water at this beach location. At current levels, gastrointestinal illness may result from ingestion of the water at

Trestle Creek Beach. As well, there is the possibility of skin, ear and eye infections with water contact.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake or reservoir, at any time. Water-borne organisms, including fecal bacteria, can cause vomiting and diarrhea.

AHS Environmental Public Health officers will continue to monitor the water at Trestle Creek Beach.

This advisory will remain in effect until further notice.





Alberta's government is investing more into Alberta's Lodge Assistance Program which will benefit seniors across the province.



EASING FINANCIAL STRAIN FOR FOSTER FAMILIES

Alberta's government is investing \$22 million over three years to help foster, kinship and other caregivers look after young people in government care.

Foster and kinship parents are vital in helping young people in government care stay connected to their siblings, culture and community, but the rising cost of living means they face increased financial pressure in covering day-to-day necessities like food and clothing.

To make life more affordable for foster and kinship caregivers, and respond to their strong advocacy, Alberta is adjusting various caregiver rates, effective June 1. This will benefit almost 7,000 caregivers across the province and the 10,000 children, youth and young adults they care for and ensure they can continue to provide stable and loving homes for vulnerable children and youth who need a safe place to stay. Families who adopt or become private guardians of children in government care will also be positively impacted by these changes.

"Foster and kinship caregivers open their hearts and homes to give young people the connection and support they need to grow and find success. This investment means caregiver families can worry less about their finances and focus on what they do best: providing children and youth a strong foundation for the future."

Temporary and permanent caregivers have received increases of 4.2 per cent in June to basic maintenance rates, skill fees, as well as babysitting and relief per diems.

This increase aligns with increases to other government programs, including the Alberta Child and Family Benefit, Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH), Income Support, and the Alberta Seniors Benefit.

"Alberta's foster and kinship caregivers reshape the futures of so many children and youth. We are pleased Alberta's government is taking action to make sure they are fairly compensated and get the steadfast support they deserve."

This new investment builds on the more than \$23.6 million in new supports and stability measures for foster caregivers and young people in care announced in Fall 2023, including coverage of counselling sessions, implementing the Refer-a-Foster Caregiver program, and extending daily skill fee and special rates to caregivers caring for Transition to Adulthood Program participants (until age 22).

The investment also builds on new adoption supports announced in spring 2023 to make adoption more affordable for Alberta families. These supports include investing \$4 million a year over three years on increased tax breaks, subsidies to help cover the costs of licensed agency adoptions, and increased health coverage for children adopted in Alberta.



Rather, purchase some instructional DVDs to learn the game during your down time throughout the week. Many golfers don't have time to hit the links during the week, but they do have time to watch some DVDs when they get home from work. Such instructional DVDs can help you master your grip and stance, which you can then take with you to the course over the weekend.

* Have fun. Golf is a fun game; it just takes time to hone your skills. But even if you aren't ready for the professional tour after your first few rounds, you can still have fun. Don't let some beginner's frustration, which every golfer experiences, ruin the fun of the game. Take note of your surroundings when you hit the links. and appreciate the time you're spending with your group. If the game becomes more a source of frustration than fun, then take a break and put in some more work away from the course, be it at the driving range or studying at home.




