



drivers from Alberta's provincial roads and highways.


This year, the Alberta RCMP removed a total of 173 impaired drivers from the roads, 42 of which occurred during National Impaired Driving Enforcement Day across 36 organized check stops.

"While we promote safe driving behaviours all year round, we want to enhance this messaging and our enforcement efforts during holidays or long weekends when more people are out on our roadways," says Sgt. Vinnie Hetu, Alberta RCMP Traffic. "Impaired driving is a danger to yourself and others. Always plan a safe, sober ride accordingly."

The consequences for impaired driving include a 90-day suspension, one year of mandatory ignition interlock, a 30-day vehicle criminal record. seizure, a \$1,000 fine, and a



Submitted by Government 890,000 barrels per day of of Alberta

Premier Danielle Smith and Minister of Energy and Minerals Brian Jean issued the following statement on the start-up of the Trans Mountain Pipeline:

"Alberta is celebrating an important achievement for the energy industry the startup of the twinned Trans Mountain Pipeline expansion project (TMX). It's great news for Albertans and Canadians, as this will welcome a new era of prosperity and economic growth. The completion of TMX is monumental for Alberta, since this will significantly increase our province's output. It will triple the capacity of the original pipeline to now carry

crude oil from Alberta's oil sands to British Columbia's Pacific Coast.

"We are excited that Canada's biggest and newest oil pipeline in more than a decade can now bring oil from Edmonton to tidewater in B.C. This will allow us to get our energy resources to Pacific markets, including Washington State and California, and Asian markets like Japan, South Korea, China and India. Alberta now has new energy customers, and tankers with Alberta oil will be unloading in China and India in the next few months.

"For Alberta this is a game-changer. The world needs more reliably and sustainably sourced Alberta energy, not less. World demand for oil and gas resources will continue in the decades ahead, and the new pipeline expansion will give us the opportunity to meet global energy demands, increase North American and global energy security, and help remove the issues of energy poverty in other parts of the world.

"Analysts are predicting the price differential on Canadian crude oil will narrow, resulting in many millions of extra government revenues, which will help fund important programs like health, education and social services - the things Albertans rely on. TMX will also result in billions of dollars of economic prosperity for Albertans, Indigenous communities and Canadians, and create well-paying

jobs throughout Canada.

"Our province wants to congratulate the Trans Mountain Corporation for its tenacity to have completed this long awaited and much-needed energy infrastructure, and to thank the more than 30,000 dedicated, skilled workers whose efforts made this extraordinary project a reality. The province also wants to thank the federal government for seeing this project through. This is a great example of an area where the provincial and federal government can cooperate and work together for the benefit of Albertans and all Canadians "

The new Leading Edge Physiotherapy Pickleball Facility in Leduc is officially open for play after the community gathered to celebrate a grand opening ceremony earlier today.

The facility, which represents an investment of \$980,000 in new recreational amenity space in Leduc, features 12 courts, a spectator area, garbage receptacles and a portable washroom.

"We know local pickleball enthusiasts are eager to play and make the most of this first season outdoors," says City of Leduc Mayor Bob Young, adding it will contribute to a high quality of life for Leduc residents and help attract new people to the area. "I'm

pleased we have created a space that reinforces the importance of movement and social connections that make Leduc stand out."

Sports tourism is an important economic driver in the community, and the new pickleball facility is poised to attract new sporting opportunities that were previously inaccessible in Leduc. These opportunities include, for example,

the 2025 Alberta 55 plus Summer Games to be hosted in Leduc in July 2025, which required pickleball facilities as part of the bid.

The courts are in the northeast corner of William F. Lede Park and will be open daily from 5 a.m. to 11 p.m. until Sept. 30 on a first come first served basis.

DEER VALLEY TEMPORARY OFF-LEASH DOG PARK IS NOW OPEN

The Deer Valley temporary off-leash dog park is now open and will be until this fall, giving Leduc pet owners a new option on the west side of the city to let their pets off leash to exercise and interact with other dogs.

The off-leash dog park is located at the northend of Grant McEwan Blvd., next to the Deer Valley Community Gardens and will be open daily from 6 a.m. - 11 p.m.

The opening of the temporary off-leash dog park is the second phase of the pilot project, which began in fall 2023 when residents were encouraged to share their thoughts on three proposed locations in west Leduc.

Residents are encouraged to share their thoughts of the

Deer Valley off-leash dog park with the City through an online survey, using a QR code on one of the poster boards at the Deer Valley site. The feedback received will be presented to Leduc City Council later this fall to inform them of their decision of whether the park should be made permanent.

Pet owners are required to abide by the City's responsible pet ownerships rules while visiting off-leash parks and must clean up after their dogs.

Leduc also has three other dog parks that residents can use and take advantage of the nice weather during the summer months: The K-9 off-leash dog park, Barclay Park offleash dog park, and Outlook Park.


THE HEROES OF NORMANDY

Recipient of the Minister of Veterans Affairs Commendation

Death struck deeply into those who waded ashore on June 6, 1944. Struggling to quickly move from their landing craft to the sand of Normandy beach. Burdened by the heavy weight of their equipment, and the sights and sounds around them. Before them lay a terrifying array of obstacles waiting to trap, maim, and destroy anyone who attempted to challenge the terrible might of the nazi occupation of France. Service men and women came from all across Canada. Local militia units like the South Alberta Regiment, South Alberta Light Horse and the Calgary Highlanders were mobilized for active war service. These part-time "Saturday Night" soldiers were busy in their armouries and drill halls, recruiting and training its new members. Some would find themselves "storming Juno beach" on June 6th, while others arrived sometime later, joining the 3rd Canadian Division as they consolidated their foothold on the Normandy coast.

The liberation campaign slowly progressed mile by bloody mile across France until Paris was freed on August 25, 1944. In its wake were left countless dead and injured, destroyed towns and cities. Names of places became etched into the memories of the soldiers who fought in battles like Bourguébus Ridge, Carpiquet Airport, Caen, the Falaise "Gap", Vaucelles, and Verrières Ridge. The campaign to liberate France from its occupiers would end up taking the lives of 5,021 Canadian soldiers.

The number of war veter-

ans who fought in the liberation campaign have steadily declined as the years have passed. Fortunately, some of these remarkable old soldiers are still living. They are resilient people who followed a path of duty, endured hardship, faced danger and experienced things we could never imagine. Through the National Order of the Legion of Honour medal program, the Embassy of France in Canada continues to bestow their nation's highest medal to our veterans who are proudly known as the liberators of France.


