Phase 1 of a four-year concrete rehabilitation project for 55 Avenue has been approved. Based on assessments, the pavement along 55 Avenue remains in good condition and doesn't require replacement at this time; however, the concrete is in need of replacement. The curb and gutters along 55 Avenue, between 41 Street and Mink Creek Road, will be fully removed and reconstructed over a four-year period. This will allow drainage and sidewalk condition to be improved and will rectify any deterioration of the sidewalk joints.



The Town of Whitecourt

has approved the Joint Use Planning Agreement with Living Waters Catholic Separate School Division, Northern Gateway Public Schools, the Francophone Regional Authority of Greater North Central Francophone Education Region, and Woodlands County. The Government of

Alberta requires all municipalities to enter into Joint Use Planning Agreements with all school boards that operate within their municipal boundaries, and the agreement enables the integrated and long-term planning and use of school sites.

CENTRAL ALBERTA DISTRICT CRIME REDUCTION UNIT (CAD CRU) MAKE SIGNIFICANT SEIZURE AND LAY CHARGES

Submitted by Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit

On April 11, 2024, CAD CRU were asked to assist Thorsby/ Breton RCMP with a break and enter investigation. RCMP received information that a civilian was following a suspect vehicle believed to be involved in a break and enter when it slowed and then shot at the civilian.

As a result of the investigation, CAD CRU identified a suspect and requested assistance from Edmonton Police Service in conducting surveillance. As a result of their assistance, RCMP were able to obtain two search warrants, one for a property in Breton Detachment area and one for a residence in Parkland Detachment area.

On the morning of April 12, 2024, a break and enter was reported in Rimbey Detachment area, where numerous items including a truck and trailer were reported stolen. This truck and trailer, along with another truck, were observed returning to the Breton residence, at which time RCMP Emergency Response Team executed the search warrant. During this, one of the suspects used the vehicle he was driving and rammed police vehicles in an attempt to escape.

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Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit (CAD CRU) Make Significant Seizure And Lay Charges

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This vehicle was later was determined to be a stolen vehicle which had been revinned. Both drivers were arrested, which a search incidental to arrest resulted in the seizure of the following:

•a loaded 9mm Beretta

•682 grams of suspected methamphetamine

•70 grams of suspected cocaine.

Also inside the vehicle were numerous items that had been stolen from the Rimbey break and enter. It is believed that all items taken from this break and enter were recovered, including a truck and trailer, a gun safe containing 8 hunting rifles/shotguns, jewellery, passports, and food.

The search of the Breton property identified numerous stolen items, including the following:

- VehiclesSide by sides
- •Snowmobiles
- •Tools
- •Flat deck trailers
- •A hot tub
- The approximate value of the recovered items at this

scene is \$120, 000. The Parkland residence search warrant was also executed on the same day. As a result of this search warrant, the following was seized:

- •Vehicles
- •Holiday trailers
- •A side by side
- •Enclosed trailers
- •Flat deck trailers
- •A boat
- •2 firearms

The approximate value of the recovered items at this scene is \$320,000.

As a result of this investigation, Justin Handbury (38), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with 64 offences, some of which include:

•Break and Enter (x2) •Possession of stolen prop-

erty over \$5000 (x15) •Possession of stolen prop-

erty under \$5000 (x7)

•Possession of a restricted / prohibited firearm

•Possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking (x2)

•Possess/Transfer/Sell and Identity Document (x5)

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Handbury was remanded into custody and will be appearing in Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on April 16.

Marlace Monds (37), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with multiple offences including:

•Possession of stolen property over \$5000 (x14)

•Possession of stolen property under \$5000 (x7) Monds was released for court in Alberta Court of Justice on April 24 in Breton.

Jesse Jeffcott (41), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with the following:

•Break and enter and theft of firearm

Theft of motor vehicle

•Theft of property over \$5000 (x2)

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Jeffcott was remanded into custody and will be appearing in Alberta Court of Justice on April 19, 2024, in Ponoka.

The investigation continues. RCMP would like to recognize the support units who assisted in this successful investigation, including CAD CRU, Breton/Thorsby RCMP, Parkland RCMP, Drayton Valley RCMP, Critical Incident Program, Police Dog Services, Auto Theft Unit and RPAS.

Alberta's government wants to hear from Albertans on how to make auto insurance more affordable and stable for the long term.

Auto insurance rates have been increasing across Canada, with repair costs, parts shortages, vehicle theft, and higher personal injury and legal costs all contributing.

Albertans need a simpler, more affordable and stable insurance system that protects them and their families on the road. The government is launching an online public engagement survey to collect feedback from Albertans on what they value and need from their auto insurance.

"We have been working hard to come up with a long-term solution to the complex issue of rising costs of auto insurance. As we weigh our options to improve the system, we need to hear from Albertans with their thoughts and experiences. Their feedback will help us choose the right path to keep auto insurance affordable and sustainable."

Alberta's government asked independent experts to look at systems that could reduce the costs of auto insurance and improve the sustainability and stability of the insurance industry.

Oliver Wyman focused its work on comparing average premiums under different existing auto insurance systems, largely across Canada. The Nous Group examined the broader costs and benefits of these different auto insurance models. No decisions have been made on the changes that will be made to Alberta's auto insurance system. These reports will be used to inform future engagements and policies.

"We know without reforms to address the rising cost of accident claims, auto insurance premiums will continue to increase. We encourage all Alberta drivers to participate in the online public engagement survey to share their views on what they value and expect from their auto insurance."

FEDERAL CAPITAL GAINS TAX: MINISTER HORNER

President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance Nate Horner sent the following letter to Canada's Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance on the changes to the federal capital gains tax:

"I am writing to convey Alberta's strong objections to your budget proposal to raise the capital gains inclusion rate. It adds a further layer to the expanding array of federal policies harmful to savings and investment and, by extension, Canadian productivity and our future standard of living.

"Your proposed tax increase is also damaging and unfair to the many small business owners who planned for retirement and are relying on the assets they built up and held in their small businesses. I urge you to reconsider the fairness of a retroactive tax increase on their savings and investments. These individuals and families do not have the luxury of a taxpayer-supported defined benefit pension plan that you and your cabinet colleagues have.

"Like other provinces, we are also frustrated that the federal government proposed such a major change to the shared federal-provincial tax base without consultation or engagement. Measures like these are forced upon provinces and undermine our pro-growth economic policies that seek to propel our whole country forward.

"Canada's lacklustre productivity is among the biggest challenges facing Canadians, and a serious threat to our continued prosperity and high standards of living. While you argue that Canada continues to attract significant investment and that our Marginal Effective Tax Rate is still the best in the G7, you cannot deny that this tax increase will further chip away at our tax advantage. And, more significantly, it builds on the piling of federal policies harmful to investment. These policies are weakening our standing in the world, and the standard of living of our




"As has been noted by the Canadian, Ontario and Alberta Medical Associations, your tax increase also comes at a time when the Canadian healthcare system is under extreme pressure and our ability to attract and retain physicians is a serious challenge. Raising taxes on these professionals will only exacerbate the crisis and put more financial strain on provincial governments.








Proposed legislation would support the refocusing of Alberta's health care system to ensure Albertans get the care they need when and where they need it.

On Nov. 8, 2023, Alberta's government announced plans for a refocused health care system to ensure patients are receiving the care they need, when and where they need it. To achieve this, Alberta's government will be creating four new organizations, one for each priority health services sector: acute care, primary care, continuing care and mental health and addiction.

If passed, the Health Statutes Amendment Act would enable the government to take the necessary next steps to refocus the province's health care system. The legislation would ensure Albertans have a system that works for them by prioritizing their need to find a primary care provider, receive urgent care without long waits, have access to the best continuing care options and obtain excellent mental health and addiction treatment.

"We are taking another step toward improving health care by updating legislation and enabling the governance and oversight required to refocus the health system. The critical improvements to transparency and accountability will help support the successful refocusing of the health care system to one that is responsive, effective and reflects the needs and priorities of Albertans today and for future generations."

The Health Statutes Amendment Act will enable the transition from one regional health authority, Alberta Health Services, to an integrated system of four sector-based provincial health agencies including primary care, acute care, continuing care and mental health and addiction. The agencies will be responsible for delivering integrated health services, ensuring Albertans receive timely access to care, regardless of where they live.

The Health Statutes Amendment Act establishes roles for an oversight minister and sector minister. The Minister of Health will take on the role of oversight minister, responsible for setting the strategic direction of the overall health system. A sector minister will be responsible for a specific health services sector. For example, the sector minister for Recovery Alberta is the Minister of Mental Health and Addiction. On the recommendation of the oversight minister, additional health service sectors may be established and designate a minister responsible for that newly created sector.

Enhanced government oversight will help Alberta's government to better direct resources to the front lines where they are needed the most, improve patient care overall and support health care professionals.

"Mental health and addiction have been growing issues within our society and need to be prioritized within our health care system. Amid an addiction crisis, a refocused health system will allow for mental health and addiction services to get the attention, oversight and focus they need. Recovery Alberta would allow for improved mental health and addiction care across the province as an important part of an integrated health system."

"Refocusing Alberta's healthcare system is a crucial step towards ensuring that we can deliver a framework that prioritizes accessibility, accountability, and patient-centered care. By streamlining operations, improving oversight and fostering collaboration, we are setting a strong foundation for a healthcare system that is better equipped to address the diverse needs of each of our communities."

The legislation will enable the minister of health to transfer employees or classes of employees from AHS to the new sector-based organizations, once established. During the transition period, AHS will be enabled to continue operating as a regional health authority. Employee transfers will be seamless, maintaining existing bargaining relationships and collective agreements. This will ensure stability for the workforce, unions and government as the health system refocus is implemented. There will be no job losses for staff who transition into the new organizations.

Amendments to be made to existing legislation

The Health Statutes Amendment Act includes amendments to the Regional Health Authorities Act and the Health Information Act, which have not been updated since the 1990s.


As part of these amendments, the name of the Regional Health Authorities Act will change to the Provincial Health Agencies Act. The amended Provincial Health Agencies Act will remove outdated references to allow the transition from a single regional health authority to a unified, sector-specific provincial health system. This will clarify the scope and accountabilities of provincial health agencies and health service providers going forward.

The amendments will also place responsibility on the provincial health agencies for operational planning and oversight of clinical service delivery across the province. This will enable provincial health agencies to set priorities in the provision of health service delivery. The agencies will also be tasked with sharing information and collaborating closely to support seamless patient care as the transition to the refocused health care system takes place.

Alberta's government is committed to ensuring that patient information continues to remain safe and secure through this transition. Amendments to the Health Information Act will be introduced to support the new health system refocus and to support the establishment of the Canadian Centre of Recovery Excellence. These amendments will allow the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Mental Health and Addiction, the four new provincial health agencies, the Health Quality Council of Alberta and Canadian Centre of Recovery Excellence to have the authority to use health information for health system purposes.

If passed, the Health Statutes Amendment Act will enable Recovery Alberta, the mental health and addiction provincial health agency, to begin operating in the summer of 2024. The primary care, acute care and continuing care provincial health agencies are expected to be established in the fall.




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

NURSE PRACTITIONERS TO HELP STRENGTHEN PRIMARY CARE

A new program will support nurse practitioners to work independently and provide Albertans with more access to primary care clinics.

Alberta's government is committed to stabilizing, strengthening and improving Alberta's primary health care system. Every Albertan should be able to access primary care when and where they need it. To help achieve this goal, the government is expanding opportunities for nurse practitioners.

Through the Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Program, nurse practitioners will receive approximately 80 per cent of the compensation provided to family physicians who provide comprehensive primary care. Compensation will be determined based on panel size (the number of patients a nurse practitioner sees) and the number of patient care hours provided. The program will enable nurse practitioners to practise comprehensive patient care autonomously and operate their own practices, or to practise autonomously in existing primary care clinics.

To be eligible for compensation through the \$15-million program, nurse practitioners must meet a number

of requirements, including committing to provide medically necessary primary care services, having a panel size of at least 900 patients, providing after-hours access on weekends, evenings or holidays, and accepting walk-in appointments as they build a panel size of 900 patients. The minimum panel size of 900 is consistent with the British Columbia model.

The nurse practitioner program is structured to incentivize higher patient attachment as compensation for nurse practitioners increases as their panel size grows. This, in combination with the other incentives including the Panel Management Support Program, will help to support the more than 700,000 Albertans who are currently not attached to a primary health care provider.

Clinics, communities and Primary Care Networks can partner with nurse practitioners who are just entering practice by applying for onetime mentorship funding. Each mentor is eligible for \$10,000 during a nurse practitioner's first 18 months to ensure a successful transition to independent practice.

Practitioner Association of Alberta

Nurse practitioners interested in practising through this program can now submit an expression of interest to Alberta Health. Each expression of interest will be evaluated, and nurse practitioners who meet the requirements will be sent an application form. Through a \$2-million grant over the next three years, the Nurse Practitioner Association of Alberta will help nurse practitioners throughout the application process, recruit nurse practitioners to participate in the program and support them as they plan to work independently in an existing practice or set up their own clinics.



CAPITAL GAINS TAX

For nine years, Justin Trudeau has continually made life tougher for hard working Canadians.

Starting June 25:

• Capital gains inclusion rate increases from 50% to 66.67% for individuals earning more than \$250,000 in capital gains in a year; • All capital gains generated through a corporation will be subject to the 66.67% inclusion rate, and

• Lifetime capital gains exemption for eligible property will increase from \$1,016,836 to \$1,250,000.

This is simply a job-killing tax on health care, homebuilding, small businesses, and farmers in order to pay for their uncontrolled inflationary spending.

Conservatives were the only party that voted against this Liberal capital gains tax hike. Why? Because the hike would only make our productivity, home building and doctor shortages worse. I ask, what other last-minute surprise tax hikes will this Liberal government bring forward? Who will pay for this tax?



Firstly, people who have one-time sales or disposal of long-term assets, like a grandmother trying to give some of her farmland to her children for homes. Secondly, 300,000 businesses, and indirectly, their workers will pay this tax hike.

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
