CAPITAL GAINS TAX

For nine years, Justin Trudeau has continually made life tougher for hard working Canadians.

Starting June 25:

• Capital gains inclusion rate increases from 50% to 66.67% for individuals earning more than \$250,000 in capital gains in a year;

• All capital gains generated through a corporation will be subject to the 66.67% inclusion rate, and • Lifetime capital gains exemption for eligible property will increase from \$1,016,836 to \$1,250,000.

This is simply a job-killing tax on health care, homebuilding, small businesses, and farmers in order to pay for their uncontrolled inflationary spending.

Conservatives were the only party that voted against this Liberal capital gains tax hike. Why? Because the hike would only make our productivity, home building and doctor shortages worse. I ask, what other last-minute surprise tax hikes will this Liberal government bring forward? Who will pay for this tax? Firstly, people who have one-time sales or disposal of long-term assets, like a grandmother trying to give some of her farmland to her children for homes. Secondly, 300,000 businesses, and indirectly, their workers will pay this tax hike.



BOARD MEETING BRIEF

The Board enjoyed performances from Niton Central School students and Ms. Kelly's Grade 3 students from Sheldon Coates; Grand Trunk student, Jazlynn Mochniuk, shared her experience serving on the Minister's Student Advisory Council this past year.

The musical performances and Jazlynn's report can be viewed on the Board's live stream channel!

The Board approved the 2024/25 Budget and the 2024-2027 Education Plan submissions to Alberta Education.

Once submitted to the Education Ministry, the documents will be posted to the Division's website.

Chair Karpluk recognized the important deadlines that occur in May - including the Division's Education Plan. The Education Plan identified student success goals based on the aggregated data collected from all schools in GYPSD. Provincial Achievement Tests, Diploma Exams, Assurance Measure Survey Results, Early Years Assessments applied in the primary grades, and other local assessment data are collected throughout May and June; the data provides feedback on the effectiveness of the strategies identified in the plan.

Inclusive Learning Consultant Amy Corser shared the school events promoting health and wellness for GYPSD students - all part of May's focus on mental health. Assistant Superintendent Carra Aschenmeier shared her recent attendance at CASS's Trades and Technologies Summit, exploring pathways for students into these important careers, and her work to bring a new math assessment/screening tool for GYPSD's students.

Chair Karpluk shared the Board's pride for the 22 GYPSD students nominated for ASBA's Honouring Spirit: Indigenous Student Award. All 22 nominees received an Honourable Mention Certificate for their commitment to education. The nominating schools - Crescent Valley, Mary Bergeron, and Ecole Pine Grove, will be acknowledging the students locally.

In the Land Acknowledgment, Board Chair Karpluk shared the Board's commitment to reconciliation, highlighting Trustee attendance and participation at CASS's First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Education Gathering.

Board Chair Karpluk reported on the Trustees' attendance at a ASBA Zone 2/3 Engagement Event for elected officials to connect with school board trustees. The event, attended by Premier Smith, Education Minister Nicolaides, and local MLAs provided an important opportunity for trustees to advocate for key issues in public education.

In her Superintendent's Report, Dr. Lewis shared highlights of her work, including the extensive leadership professional development that occurred in May. Additionally, Dr. Lewis shared her appreciation to the Finance and HR teams led by Secretary-Treasurer Jun Lin and HR Director Meghan Auriat

for their work and collaboration to prepare the 2024/25 budget. The budget reflects the Board's first priority - student learning - which begins with an allocation to provide full-day (and wherever possible) full-week kindergarten programming.

Dr. Lewis, Principal Reynolds, and members of the Board will be attending AS- BA's Zone 2/3 Award Ceremony to support GYPSD's Edwin Parr Award nominee, Grade 3 teacher Paige Ekdahl.

In their ongoing attendance area reviews, the Board engaged the Lobstick stakeholders to consider various options for school attendance areas following the completion of the K-12 Grand Trunk School. Once completed, the Lobstick Ward will have a K-12 school in the Hamlet of Evansburg and a K-9 school in the Hamlet of Niton Junction. Concerns about shrinking enrolments raised at a January event at Niton Central were also raised by Fulham School stakeholders. This prompted the Board to include options for Fulham in an attendance area review event, held May 14th, in Wildwood. An online survey was also provided to Fulham and Lobstick con-



stituents to consider ideas to address the small school issues at GYPSD's two small schools: Niton Central and Fulham.

The majority of stakeholder feedback from both Lobstick and the Fulham area respondents revealed a preference for the current attendance areas, and that the Board continue to provide a nonattendance area bus service option. In response to majority stakeholder feedback, the Board amended Policy 17 to maintain the option for parents to apply for out-of-area bus service. The Board also approved the purchase of eight new school buses.

In its ongoing advocacy work, the Board shared its awareness of mental health, classroom complexity, and the necessity for educational assistants with the skills needed to support more complex special needs students. Along with the awareness, they will be advocating for an increase for funding for Special Needs Students.

BEST coaches and the Wellness Navigators are preparing a range of summer programming options opportunities will be shared out through schools.

A partnership between the Hinton and Edson Friendship Centre Elders has led to the creation of an Indigenous sacred site on the McLeod River, accessed through the Medicine Lodge Rodeo Grounds. Indigenous Pathways Lead Jennifer Albrecht and approximately 15 IPL teachers will be visiting the site to learn from Elders David Cree, Joe Cardinal, and Dorothy Courtereille on May 31.

Alberta's government is supporting a new research initiative to gather fire services data that will help municipalities strengthen public safety in Alberta.

Firefighters across Alberta play a critical role in the public safety of communities. Besides fighting fires, municipal firefighters provide first response to medical emergencies and other disasters, conduct search and rescue operations, and educate the public about fire safety and prevention.

Investing in services that support municipalities in strengthening public safety is a top priority for the government. Strong partnerships are key to keeping Albertans safe, which includes keeping firefighters safe. To help with that ongoing work, Alberta's government is providing grants totalling \$700,000 to municipalities and the Alberta Fire Chiefs Association (AFCA) for research and training.

"Public safety is always a priority, and our government recognizes that strong partnerships are key to keeping Albertans safe. We are pleased to work together with the Alberta Fire Chiefs Association to improve firefighting services for all Albertans. We remain committed to ensuring Alberta municipalities have access to excellent firefighting resources and information."

It is vital that local fire services are equipped to respond safely and effectively to all emergencies, and firefighters are able to receive training in alignment with industry best practices. To ensure this, Alberta's government provides ongoing support to municipal fire services through annual grants for fire services training. A total of \$500,000 in grants through the Fire Services Training Program is provided each year to help fire departments cover costs such as fire services course fees and training materials. All municipalities, Metis Settlements,

and First Nations communities in Alberta are eligible for these grants, which help prepare firefighters with the knowledge and skills they need to protect their communities.

Fire hazards, risks and responses change regularly and it is absolutely critical that local firefighters have all the information they need to be able to respond quickly, safely and efficiently. Research is needed to help local firefighting experts identify the specific data they need, the best ways to collect it, and how municipalities can use it to mitigate risks.

To accomplish this work, a one-time \$200,000 grant will help the Alberta Fire Chiefs Association to research and develop recommendations for how to strengthen provincial fire data reporting. Improving the quality of fire data reporting will put municipal leaders in a better position to make well-informed decisions about local fire services and protection strategies for their communities.

The \$200,000 grant to enhance fire data reporting is a testament to the power of collaboration between the government and fire services."

ALBERTA RCMP PROVIDES SAFETY REMINDERS FOR SHARING THE ROAD WITH COMMERCIAL DRIVERS

Motorists should take extra caution when sharing the road with, or operating, semi-trucks, tractor-trailers, and other commercial vehicles. With summer approaching, roadways will become increasingly busy and the Alberta RCMP wants to remind commercial and passenger-vehicle motorists how to operate on our provincial roads responsibly.

Commercial vehicle drivers:

• Remember to complete trip inspections to ensure your vehicle is in proper operating condition.

• Always carry the

required inspection certificates.

• Stay alert while driving and pull over when you're feeling tired.

• Enhance your safety by pre-planning your trip. Stay updated on roads, traffic, construction, and weather conditions.

• Maintain a safe following distance with other vehicles.

• Be aware of your blind spots and make wide turns safely.

• If you are hauling or transporting cargo, ensure that it is properly secure.

Passenger vehicle drivers: • Stay far enough behind big trucks so that you can see both of its side mirrors. If you can't see the truck driver, they can't see you.

• Increase your following distance behind larger vehicles so you can better see oncoming traffic.

• Oncoming commercial vehicles can create strong wind gusts, large splashes in wet conditions, or sprays of debris. Practice defensive driving and brace when they are passing.

• Leave extra space when passing or changing lanes in front of commercial vehicles as they require more time to slow down or come to a stop.


