## WATER QUALITY ADVISORY LIFTED FOR TRESTLE CREEK BEACH

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Effective immediately, Alberta Health Services (AHS) has lifted the water quality advisory that was issued June 5, 2024 for the water of Trestle Creek Beach (located within the Edmonton Zone of AHS). Water quality, including fecal bacteria levels, has returned to an acceptable level and the health risk is low for usage of the lake for recreational purposes.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake or reservoir, at any time.

Alberta Health Services is the provincial health authority responsible for planning and delivering health supports and services for more than four million adults and children living in Alberta.






Curling clubs are always about more than just the facility, they are about the hopes and dreams and real-life moments of every member inside.



We hope you have had a first hand look and use of the new cover over the bleachers when you attended the Wildwood Bronc Bustin'it is a beauty.



On June 12, 2024, at approximately 12:20 a.m., Parkland RCMP received a report of a suspicious white GMC Sierra truck with an attached flat deck trailer parked on a dead-end road in the residential area near Duffield, Alta.. Police located the suspicious vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. The lone male driver was a suspended driver and he was wanted on outstanding warrants. When the driver opened the driver's door of the GMC truck, police observed a fake Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) attached to the door. The initial police investigation determined that the GMC truck and trailer were stolen, and a further search uncovered suspected Methamphetamine, one prohibited firearm, seven other firearms and two prohibited devices (over capacity magazines), also believed to be stolen. The suspect is known to police and he was arrested without incident.

Kalen Mailhot, 41-yearold resident of Parkland County was charged with:

• Possession of a firearm

• Possession of a prohibited weapon

• Possession of a weapon

Fraud

• Altering or removing a VIN (x2)

• Possession of methamphetamine

Mailhot was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody and his next appearance is June 19, 2024, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Stony Plain, Alta..

The Parkland RCMP are trying to reunite the recovered stolen firearms with the rightful owners, therefore, if you had a firearm stolen and have not reported the police, please contact the Parkland RCMP at 825-220-7267 to file a report. Anyone trying to claim the firearms will be required to provide the make, model and serial number.

The Parkland RCMP would also like to thank the public for being vigilant and reporting this suspicious vehicle to the police, which had a successful outcome in recovering stolen property and removing unlawful firearms from the street.







On June 21, 2024, at approximately 1:10 a.m., a Drayton Valley RCMP officer noted someone laying on the side of the road just south of the city dump. The officer spoke with the male, who stated he had been hit by a car while cycling and the car never stopped. The cyclist stated he believed he had a broken leg. 
