



Conservatives will make hard work pay again and incentivize production in Canada with a 'Bring it Home' tax cut that will:


o Bring home production and paycheques, by making Canada the best place to invest, hire and make things.

LEDUC RCMP ON SCENE AT FATAL MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION UPDATED

On June 12, 2024, Leduc RCMP, with the assistance of Strathcona County RCMP, Edmonton International Airport RCMP and Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit, responded to a motor vehicle collision involving three vehicles, at the intersection of Highway 625 and Range Road 232. A west bound car was stopped at the intersection waiting to turn southbound on Range Road 232 when the car was rear-ended by another west bound truck causing the car to enter the east bound lane where the car was struck by an east bound cube van.

The driver of the car, a

43-year-old male from Leduc County, died as a result of the collision.

The driver of the truck, an 18-year-old male from Lethbridge, Alta. was transported to a local area hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The driver of the cube van, a 66-yearold male from Edmonton was transported to a local area hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

Leduc RCMP continue to investigate the cause of the collision with the assistance of the RCMP reconstructionist.

MASKWACIS RCMP STEPPING UP PATROLS AFTER FIREARM RELATED CALLS

RCMP are providing more information into the June 10, 2024, incident in which the Maskwacis RCMP responded to a report of a shooting in Samson Cree Nation. An investigation into the incident revealed that multiple bullets were fired into a residence occupied by several children and adults. The investigation by police led to the arrest of two individuals and the execution of a Search Warrant at a residence in Wetaskiwin. During that Search

Warrant execution, police recovered prohibited firearms and magazines.

At this time, police are searching for Dorian O'Shea Hunter (23) a resident Maskwacis in relation to this incident, as he's wanted for:

 Possession of a weapon obtained by crime;
Possession of a prohibited weapon with ammunition;

• Possession of a prohibited weapon knowing its possession is unauthorized (X2);

• Unsafe storage of a firearm; and

• Failing to comply with a release order.

Trey Littlechild (24) a resident of Samson Cree Nation was charged with:

• Possession of a prohibited device contrary to an Order (X2);

• Possession of a prohibited device knowing its possession is unauthorized;

• Failing to comply with a release order; and

• Failing to comply with a probation order.

Alyssa Soosay (29) a resident of Samson Cree Nation was charged with:

Discharging a fire-

arm with intent; and

• Unauthorized possession of a prohibited device.

Both Littlechild and Soosay were taking before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody following a bail hearing and are scheduled to appear in court on June 18, 2024 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin.

On June 14, 2024 at approximately 7:40 p.m., Leduc RCMP received a report of a two-vehicle collision involving a Toyota Corolla and a Nissan Rogue on Township Road 494 (Highway 623), near Range Road 232 in Leduc County. Upon arrival at the scene, police learned the male driver of the Nissan Rogue fled the area on foot. A white crew cab pickup truck was observed in the area following the collision and Leduc RCMP would like to speak with the driver of the truck about the incident.

Leduc RCMP continue to

investigate with the assistance of the RCMP Forensic Identification Section and the RCMP Reconstructionist.

Motorists who were in the area are between 7:30 p.m. and 7:50 p.m. on June 14, 2024, are being asked to check their dash cam footage. ALBERTA RCMP OFFICER INVOLVED

SHOOTING IN LEDUC

On June 19, 2024, at 11:23 p.m., RCMP received a report of a suicidal individual with a firearm outside of the Leduc Detachment. To locate the suspect, additional resources were deployed including the Alberta RCMP Emergency Response Team, nearby detachments, Edmonton Police Service (EPS) Air 1 Helicopter and EPS Tactical Team and EPS Police Dog Service. EPS Air 1 located the suspect vehicle in Leduc and containment was established. RCMP were able to make contact with the suspect and attempts were made to deescalate the situation. A confrontation occurred between the suspect and EPS officers resulting in at least one EPS officer discharging a firearm. As a result, the suspect was injured. Unfortunately, the suspect, a 63-year-old Leduc County resident, died as a result of his injuries. A firearm was located with the suspect.

No officers or members of the public were injured during this incident.



In compliance with legislative requirements, the Director of Law Enforcement was immediately notified causing the deployment of ASIRT to conduct an independent investigation. The RCMP believes in accountability and transparency and in so doing will provide full support to the ASIRT investigators and also conduct its own internal review. Events like this are diffi-

cult for the communities in which they occur, as well as the general public and officers involved. Police recognize the trust placed in them to use force that is necessary, proportional and reasonable and in so doing remain fully accountable. While this is not the outcome that we hope for, it is a situation for which officers are highly trained.

Independent of ASIRT's investigation, the RCMP's internal review process has been implemented to gather a full account of what took place during this incident. RCMP training, policy, and police response. The RCMP is fully cooperating with ASIRT. All media inquiries about this incident should now be directed to ASIRT at 780-641-9099.


