WATER QUALITY ADVISORY ISSUED FOR ALBERTA BEACH ON LAC STE. ANNE

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Due to elevated levels of fecal bacteria currently present in the water of Alberta Beach on Lac Ste. Anne, located in Lac Ste. Anne County, within the North Zone of Alberta Health Services (AHS), AHS is advising the public not to swim or wade at this beach area, effective immediately.

Elevated levels of fecal bacteria were detected via

testing of the lake water at this beach location. At current levels, gastrointestinal illness may result from ingestion of the water at

Alberta Beach at Lac Ste. Anne.

CYANOBACTERIA (BLUE-GREEN ALGAE) ADVISORY ISSUED FOR ISLE LAKE

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) has been identified in the waters of Isle Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

·Avoid all contact with cyano-

bacterial blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

•Do not swim or wade or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacteria is visible

•Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your nets •Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water

As well, there is the possibility of skin, ear and eye infections with water contact.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake or reservoir, at any time. Water-borne organisms, including fecal bacteria, can cause vomit-

ing and diarrhea.

AHS Environmental Public Health officers will continue to monitor the water at Alberta Beach.

This advisory will remain in effect until further notice.

Allowed for use during the fire han:

- CSA approved or ULC certified gas or propane barbeques used for cooking,
- CSA approved or ULC certified Wood Pellet Smokers,
- Propane and natural gas fire pits,
- Catalytic or infrared-style heaters,

• Electric or propane meat smokers.

The fire ban will remain in effect until conditions improve.

The operation of Off Highway Vehicles (OHV) within the Town of Whitecourt is prohibited under the Traffic Bylaw 1573 which prohibits OHV use within Town boundaries between April 1 and November 30 annually. Penalties for contra-

vening Bylaw 1573 range from monetary fines to OHV seizure.

directly from any recreational body of water, including Isle Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by cyanobacteria. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Cyanobacteria is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz, or globs on the surface of water, cyanobacteria can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible cyanobacteria or who ingest water containing cyanobacteria may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms. Exposure to the bacteria may be fatal to pets.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Isle Lake, until further notice.

Please note that waters of Isle Lake in which the cyanobacterial bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Health Advisory is in place.





Alberta Health Services (AHS) has issued a BLUE-GREEN ALGAE ADVISORY for Isle Lake and has posted signage in the area.

This common algae naturally occurs during the summer months when the days are sunny and hot.

To protect yourself and your pets, AHS advises to avoid contact with blue-green algae blooms, don't swim in water where blue-green algae is visible, and do not drink or cook with water from this lake.

If you suspect a problem related to bluegreen algae or if you require further information on health concerns and blue-green algae, please call Health Link at 811. Additional information is also available online at ahs.ca/eph.

Please note that areas of the lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is not. For the full lineup of programs and visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Blue-Green Algae Health Advisory is in place.




